Major Reforms in MA & UD in Telangana



- After Formation of Telangana, ULBs increased from 68 to 142
- **Enactment of unified Act – Telangana Municipalities Act, 2019 for both Municipalities and Municipal Corporations (except GHMC)**
- Institutionalized approach for key sectors – SRDP, HRDCL, CRMP, HMRL, Riverfront Development Corpns, & new UDAs of new Urban growths
- **Creation of Additional Collector, Local Bodies for every District to strengthen the functioning of Urban Local Bodies.**
- 10% Green Budget and mandatory 85% survival of plantations
- **Unified service Rules**
- TSbPASS – Online / Instant / single window building approvals on self certification
- **Ecentric and Citizen centric services of Municipal Services.**
- **Focus to planned development by taking up critical town wide infrastructure through TUFIDC funding and Pattana Pragathi funding**



Pattana Pragathi (State level flagship Programme)



VISION

- **Pattana Pragathi” programme was conducted in all the 141 ULBs with an objective to lay a strong foundation for best urban living, Urban areas to become clean with good sanitation and greenery, planned progress and citizens should get better services and with Larger participation of the people.**
- **1st phase of “Pattana Pragathi” from 24.02.2020 to 04.03.2020**
- **2nd Phase from 1st to 8th June, 2020 – Only Sanitation**
- **3rd phase from 1st to 10th July,2021.**
- **4th Phase from 03.06.2022 to 18.06.2022**



Pattana Pragathi- Status



1.PP grants Releases to 142 ULBs:-

- An amount of Rs.148 Crs per month was released from Feb-2020 to March, 2021 i.e., (Rs.78Crs to GHMC & Rs.70Crs to 141 ULBs).
- Rs.112 Crs per month(Rs.59 Crs to GHMC & Rs.53 Crs to 141 ULBs) was released from April-2021 to March 2022.
- Rs.116 Crs per month is being released from April-22 to March-2023 (Rs.61.10 to GHMC & Rs.55.06 Crs to 141 ULBs)
- Rs.122.82 Crs per month is being released from April-23 to June-2023 (Rs.64.60. to GHMC & Rs.58.22 Crs to 141 ULBs)
- An amount of Rs.2723.30 Crs is released to GHMC from Feb 2020 to June, 2023.
- An amount of Rs. 2338.14 Crs is released to 141 ULBs from Feb 2020 to June, 2023.
- Total amount released is Rs.5061.44 Crs

2. Payment of wages to workers

- Salaries for all the out Sourcing employees working in ULBs have been paid upto August-2023. Wages of all the Sanitation workers are being paid before 5th of every month.

3.Payment of CC charges:

- The CC charges are being paid regularly from Feb, 20.
- All the ULBs have paid CC charges upto July, 2022 i.e, Rs.556.14 Crs
- Payment of Power Bills is Charged expenditure

4. Sanitation Vehicles:

- Under Pattana Pragathi programme, as per norm instructions were issued to all MCs to purchase required No. of vehicles for sanitation & swm.
- Accordingly, 2254 No. of new vehicles were purchased in the ULBs
- Earlier with the existing 2628 Vehicles, only 2397 TPD of garbage was lifted. Now with the purchase of 2254 new vehicles, additional 1919 TPD of garbage is being lifted. Present total 4295 TPD, (100 % garbage is being lifted)
- Total 4882 vehicles are used for lifting of 4316 TPD of Garbage (lifting of 100% garbage generated) in 141 ULBs.

5. Ward Committee:

- Ward Committee are constituted in every ward as per section 17 of the TMA, 2019 for four categories representing (i) Youth, (ii) women, (iii) Senior Citizens and (iv) other eminent people.
- Each Ward Committee shall consists of a maximum of 15 members consisting of residents from the ward, and from among the resident welfare associations, community based organization, Community based organizations, other such groups and individuals, by rotation annually.
- Under Pattana Pragathi programme, ward Committee were constituted with above categories consisting of 2,04,448 members.
- As per the section 30 of the Act, the ward Committee members shall meet once in a quarter and the issues raised by them shall be placed before the council during next meeting.



Status of Solid Waste Management



Solid Waste Management –Existing situation:

- A total of 11,522TPD waste (7206-GHMC + 4316-141 ULBs) is being generated in 142 ULBs in the state.
- Quantity of total waste processed (TPD): 7206 (GHMC) + 1960 (141 ULBs) = 9166
- Quantity of wet waste generated (TPD): 2522 (GHMC) + 2373 (141 ULBs) = 4895
- Quantity of Wet waste processed (TPD): 2522(GHMC) + 1210 (141 ULBs) = 3732 (includes Jawaharnagar Plant, 229 Compost sheds of 1120 TPD, processing facilities at Suryapet, Manikonda and Medchal & 4 Bio gas Plants of 18.5 TPD)
- Quantity of Dry waste generated (TPD): 4684 (GHMC) + 2240 (141 ULBs) = 6924
- Quantity of Dry waste processed (TPD): 4684 (GHMC) + 750 (141 ULBs) = 5434 (includes Jawaharnagar Plant & 206 DRCCs with a capacity of 750 TPD)

Proposed interventions to bridge the gap in scientific processing of waste:

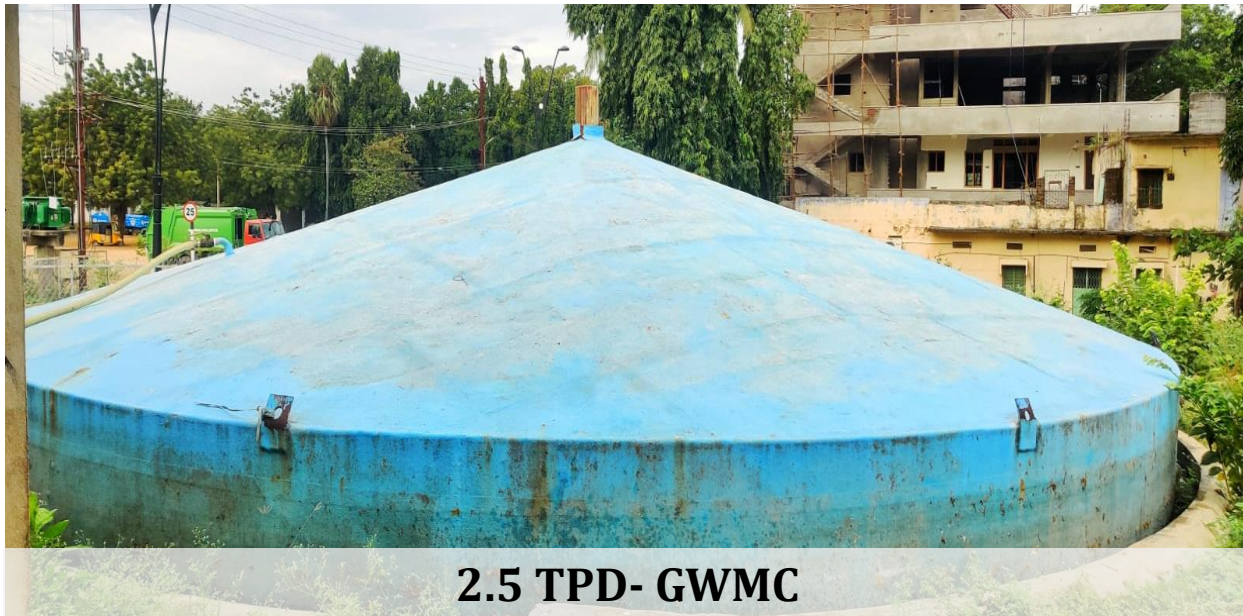
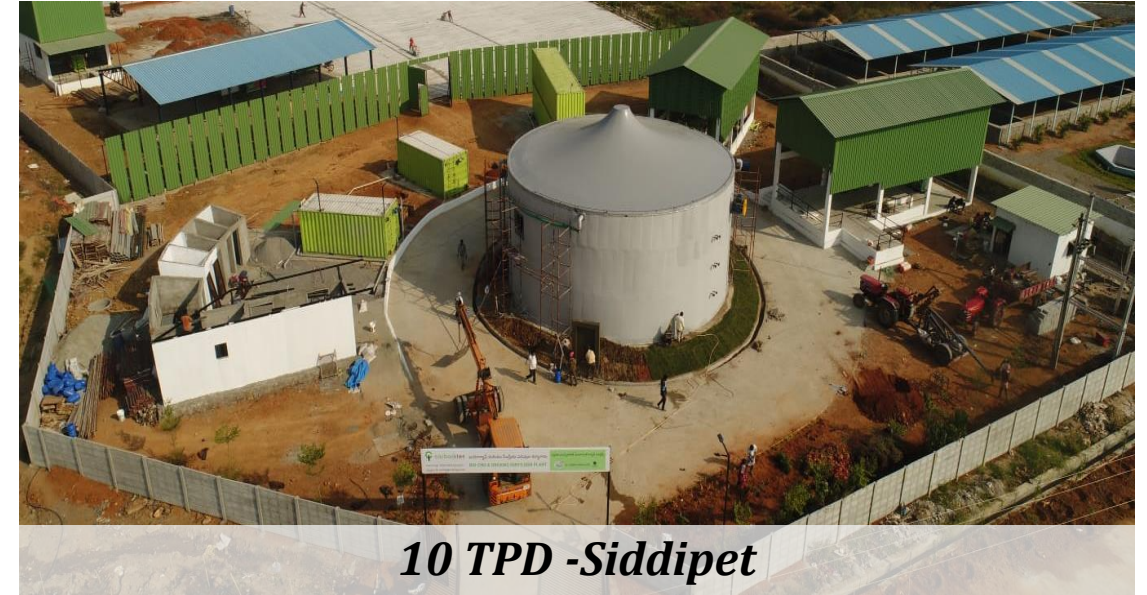
- Out of 4316 TPD of waste generated in 141 ULBs, 1960 is being processed and there is gap of 2356 TPD of waste to be processed.
- For this, 130 ULBs have been clustered into 9 clusters for establishing scientific processing plants with a capacity of 2974 TPD with projected waste generation.
- Technical and financial evaluation have been completed and LoAs will be issued by end of August 2023.
- Further, 05 ULBs i.e., Badangpet (40TPD), Dammaiguda (70 TPD), Jawaharnagar (55 TPD), Kompally (31 TPD) and Narsingi (35 TPD) are transporting their waste to Jawaharnagar Processing facility. GWMC (765), Karimnagar (160), Vikarabad (35) have identified the agencies for establishing processing unit with a cumulative capacity of 960 TPD within the ULB.

Best Practices in waste management:

- Suryapet and Siddipet ULBs are promoting plastic waste management in a sustainable manner by converting the plastic waste from the city into pavement tiles and bricks.
- An initiative named 'Holy Waste' adopts a circular economy approach and recycles floral waste into useful products such as charcoal-free incense, soaps, organic compost, and biodegradable packaging material. This initiative is being taken up in temple towns of Vemulawada, Dharmapuri & Yadagirigutta

- ULBs viz. Karimnagar and Warangal are implementing bio-mining projects under Smart City Mission
- ULBs such as Badangpet, Meerpet, shamshabad, Turkyamjal, Manikonda, Narsingi, Bandlaguda Jagir, shankarpally, Amangal, Kothur, Kompally, Medchal, Boduppall, Peerzdiguda, Jawaharnagar, Dammaiguda, Gundlapochampally and Nakrekal doesn't have legacy waste.



Role of AC(LB)s in execution of Bio mining of Legacy Waste



- **To conduct, initial meeting with the contractor and Municipal Commissioner, ME, SI to review the time bound action plan as submitted by the Contractor and direct to complete the activities as per submitted schedule. It may be noted that a compliance report has to be submitted to Hon'ble NGT periodically.**
- **To conduct fortnightly meeting, if required on earlier periodically, with the Municipal Commissioner and others on the progress made and if needed conduct the review meeting with all relevant stake holders to sort any issues and periodical update may be submitted to the Dist Collector.**
- **Inspect the bio mining activities and validate the progress made in view of the NGT and SPCB compliances.**
- **Monitor the performance of agencies for successful completion of the bio mining activity and utilization of the recovered land for useful purpose.**
- **Recommend payments based on quantity of work done on submission of weekly report by the Municipal Commissioner.**
- **Since the rate and project is already approved by the Government (GoT & GoI), no further approvals are required for the project. The subject may be placed before council for information only.**
- **Shall be single Nodal officer at District Level for implementation of the project. Hence, all further decisions for successful timely completion of project in terms of finances or administration shall be taken by the him/her under intimation to this office.**
- **They shall also ensure that the fund flow for the project is not affected. In case of any financial crunch in respect of any ULB, the same may be brought to the notice of this office. The SBM-U funds and Pattana Pragathi (50% State Matching & 50% CFC) can be utilized for the project.**



Role of MCs in execution of Bio mining of Legacy Waste



- To designate himself as nodal officer at ULB level so as to be in contact with the contractor or a person appointed by the contractor to carry out the bio remediation operations.
- To handover the contractor the exact site to be recovered and provide possession of Dumpsite for Remediation & Reclamation through Bio-mining as per Concession Agreement.
- Ascertain the Implementation Plan submitted from the Agency immediately.
- Ensure before and after photos are taken from same angle at every stage/activity and both hard & soft copies are maintained for the purpose of records, and for reports as well as audit.
- Assist in documentation and approvals, whenever necessary, for the Water and Power connection.
- Monitor the process of ascertaining the quantity of legacy waste using the topo survey and drone survey and intimate the same (Qty.) to the CDMA office.
- To conduct periodical inspection on weekly basis and appraise the progress supported with pictures to the O/o CDMA and also validate the data provided by the Agency in monthly progress reports after seeking comments of the IE.
- Monitor the provisions of dust barriers around the legacy waste to avoid any immediate air pollution to the nearby residents provided by the agency.



Role of MCs in execution of Bio mining of Legacy Waste (contd..)



- **Direct the contractor to collect any leachate in a temporary pond created using plastic sheets and utilize the leachate for spraying on the existing legacy waste for treatment.**
- **Have right over assets and technology in case of Termination or expiration of Concession Period, whichever is earlier.**
- **Take guidance of the AC(LB) relating to furtherance of project and follow the directions.**
- **Ensure weekly / fortnightly payments to the agencies after approval of the AC (LB)**
- **Ensure that the conditions of contract are fulfilled in true spirit.**
- **Any deviations/lapses in the matter the Municipal Commissioner and the concerned Engineer Shall be held responsible.**
- **As it is a time bound project utmost care shall be taken for adhering to the timelines.**

Status of Pattana Pragathi- Public Toilets (PTs) in all ULBs



- Construction of Toilets @ one for every 1000 population was taken up in a mission mode in Telangana under Pattana Pragathi programme.
- **There were only 4970 No's of PTs existing in the State.**
- Under Pattana Pragathi, 4118 toilets are constructed, out of which (Male-2060 & Female-2058).
- **Total PTs are 9088, (Male- 5448 & Female-3640)**
- **To monitor the operation and maintenance of these public toilets, State govt. has introduced Pattana Pragathi- Toilet Monitoring System (PPTMS).**
- **Further, to capture feedback from citizen, State govt. has introduced Pattana Pragathi- Citizen Monitoring System (PPCMS).**

Real-time monitoring system for tracking the progress, quality and sustainability of public sanitation facilities on 18 Parameters:

- **Covid-19 response (04)- Hand sanitizer is available at the entrance, PPE is used by care taker and toilet cleaners, toilet block is disinfected twice a day and covid-19 area helpline**
- **Ambience and other amenities (02)-Fittings and fixtures inside the toilet are in working condition**
- **Registers (03)-Daily user register is maintained, cleaning register and average monthly toilet usage**
- **Signages (03)- Customer feedback machine, septic tank complaint, suggestion register, cleaning, schedule board, sanitary pads, posters/ information is displayed at the entrance / inside the toilet block such as opening hours/ schedule, Signage display for user groups, Service level standards**

Maintenance of all the public toilets are being reviewed by Sanitary Inspectors on every Tuesday and Friday on above indicators and review is being held at the O/o CDMA on every Tuesday during the VC with MCs.

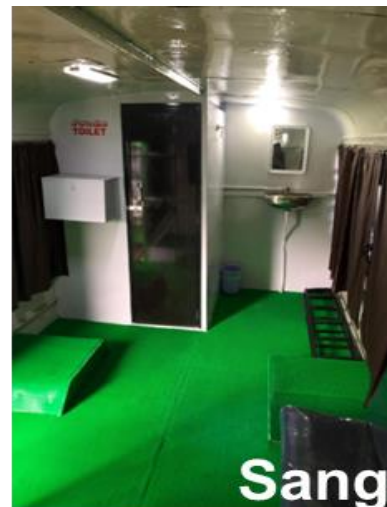

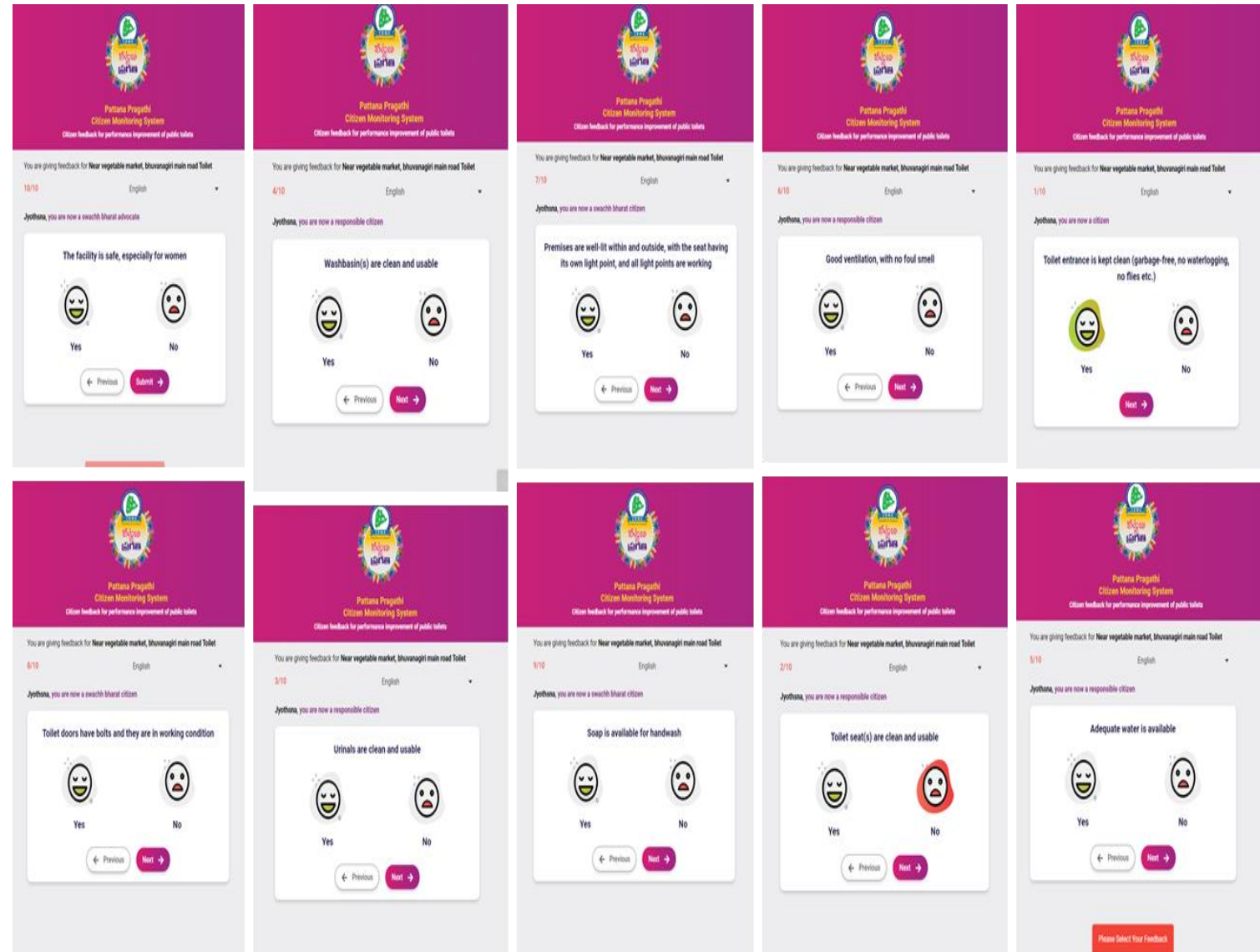

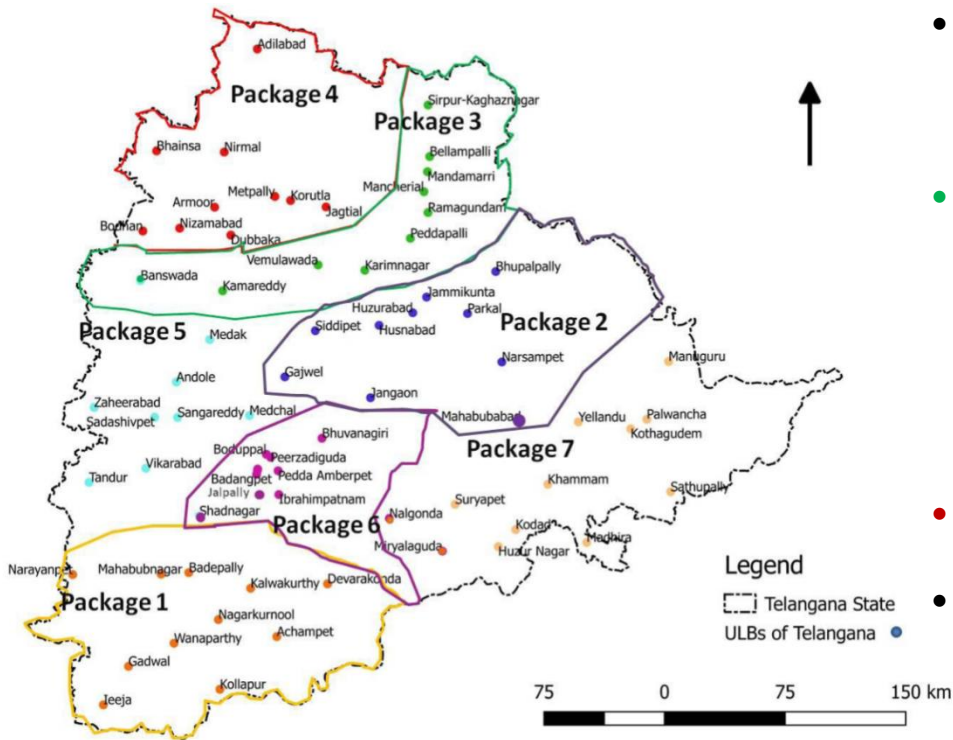

Scheduled Desludging of on-site containment systems



- **Telangana is one of the first few states to issue FSSM policy and operating guidelines vide G.O.Ms.No.176.**
- **Govt. vide GO .MS. No- 47 has notified scheduled desludging of septic tanks/pit latrines in all ULBs which was one of the essential components of the FSSM policy.**
- **ULBs are directed to undertake following activities:**
 - **Establish FSSM cell to plan and oversee implementation of scheduled desludging.**
 - Duly demarcate the area (within the city/ town jurisdiction) into three zones and from each zone ensure that all the septic tanks in every household are desludge once in every three years and that in commercial and public properties (bulk generators) are emptied twice in a year.
 - Undertake geo tagging of all the septic tanks in the city, residential, commercial, institutional PT and CTs in the cities.
 - Empanel private desludging operators for undertaking scheduled desludging activities and procure additional vehicles as per the town's requirement.
 - The ULB shall pay the private desludging operators a 'per trip fee' for the services rendered.
 - **The expenses for implementing the scheduled desludging system would be met through collection of sanitation charge by the ULB from households, institutions, and commercial establishments then set for.**
 - The sanitation charge could be collected annually along with the property tax/water charge, where ULB pays per trip fee.
 - **Conduct IEC campaigns to create awareness on scheduled desludging among citizen.**

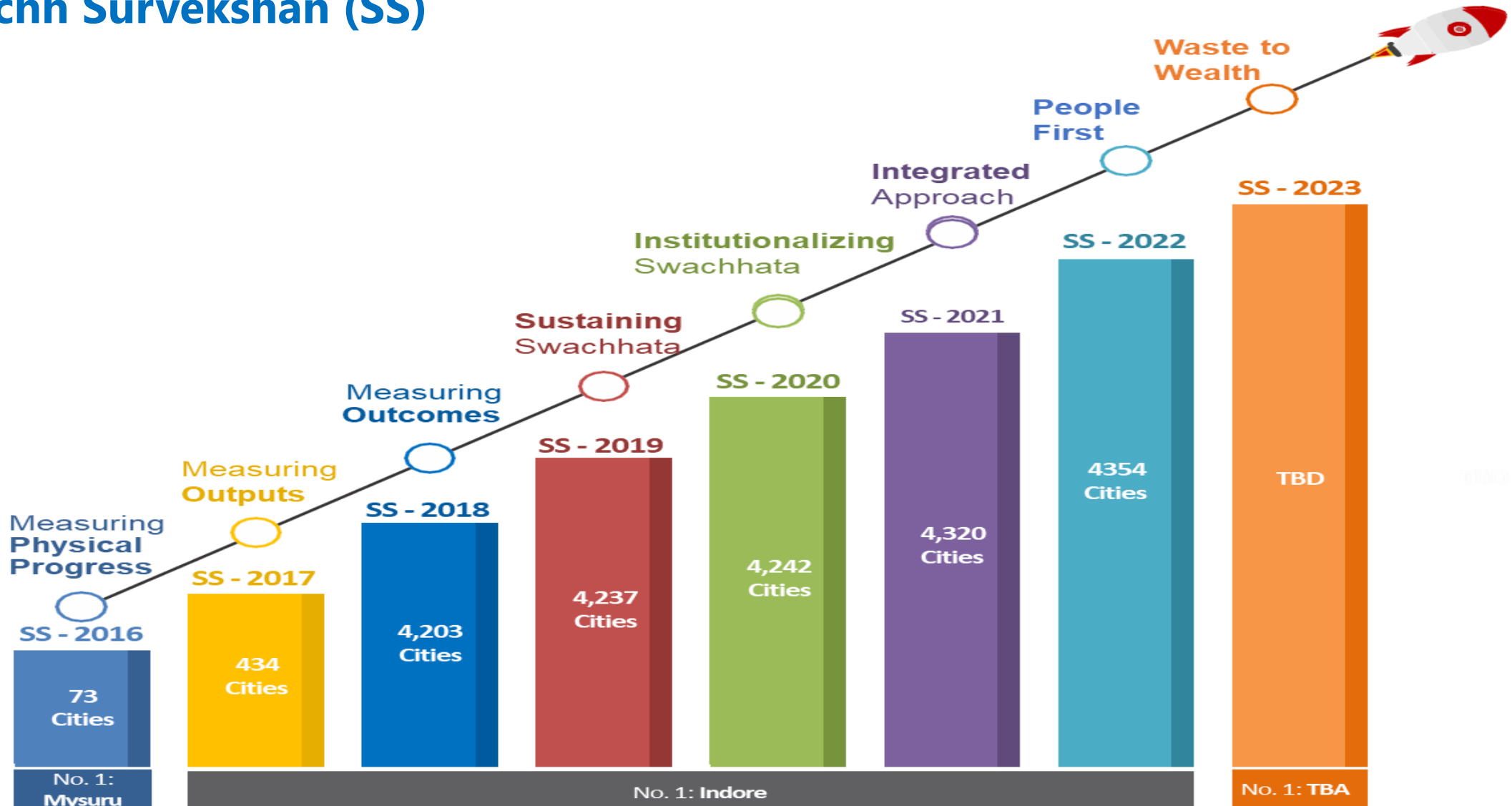

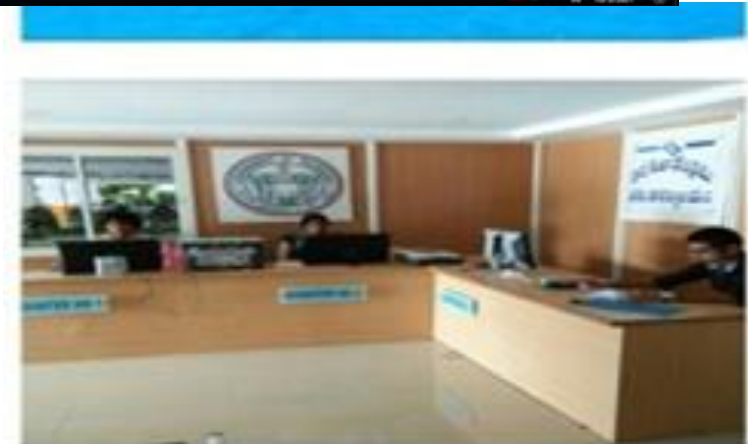

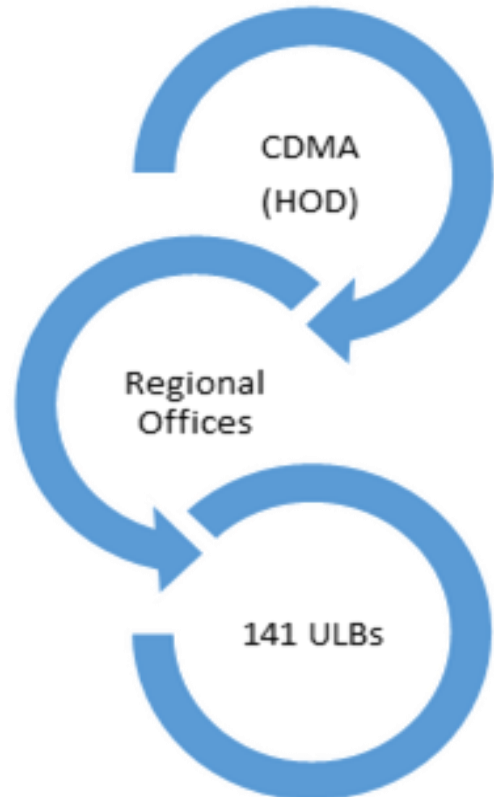
- In addition, reforms are brought through new Telangana Municipal Act, 2019 which provides for:-
 - Self Assessment of Property Tax
 - Self Assessment of Trade License
 - Capital Value based Property Assessment system
 - Auto Mutation, wherein on registration of property, the auto mutation takes place at Registration office and gets update in Property Tax online record.
- Telangana Government have issued necessary required rules vide G.O.Ms.No.230 MA., dt.11.12.2020, wherein guidelines for linking of property tax to the prevailing circle rates (i.e., Capital Value) have been notified. The said orders also provide for revision of property tax as and when the market value of the land is revised by the Stamps & Registration Department. However, there is provision for revision for wo years in the absence of periodic revision to be undertaken by the Registration Department.
- Henceforth, statutorily, the Government provided sufficient reform based laws for strengthening ULBs.

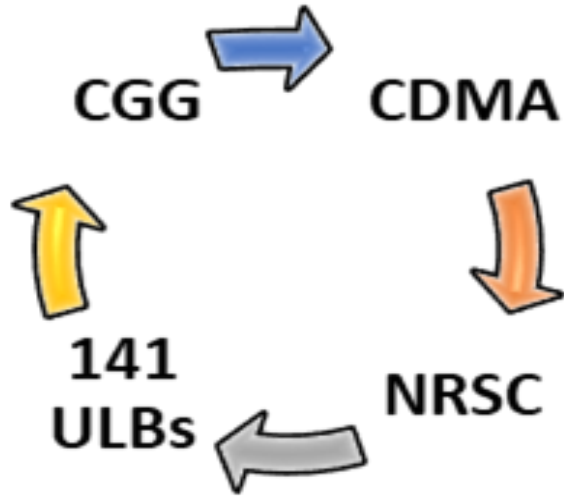

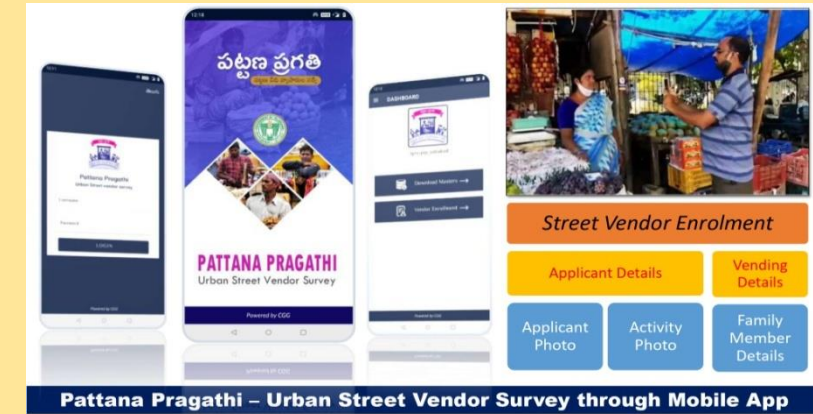

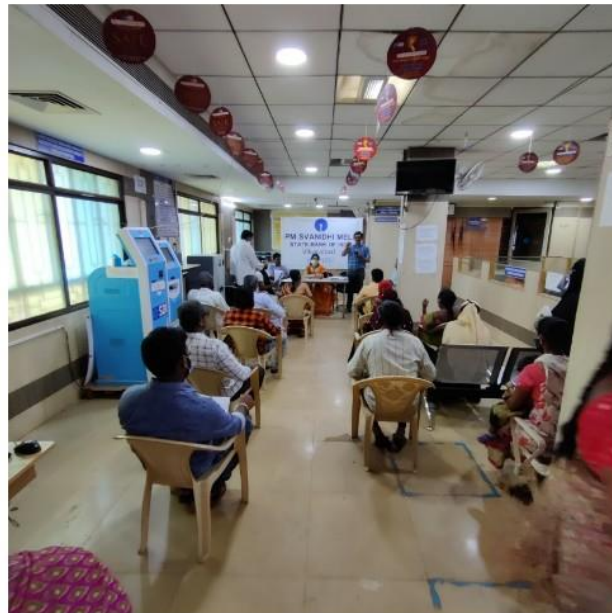
