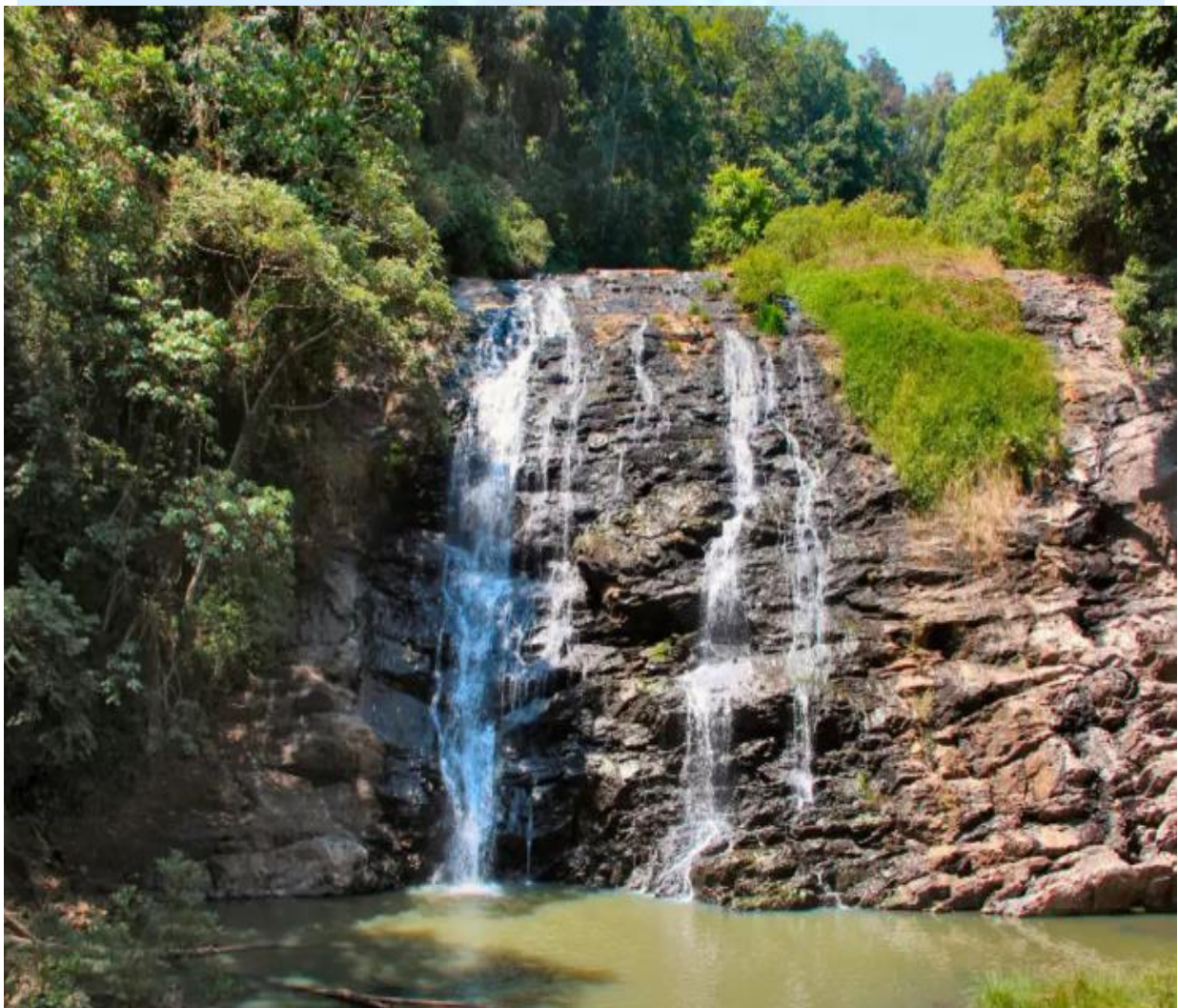


## 10. Abbey Falls
