28th April

We reached Bangalore in the morning, then from there we went for Ooty. On the way we visited Bandipur National Park and Mudumalai Tiger Reserve.

Bandipur National Park

Bandipur National Park is located in Gundulpet taluk, Chamarajanagar district. It has second highest Tiger population in India. This Park is the part of Nilgiri Biosphere Reserve making it largest protected area in Southern India and largest habitant of Wild Elephants in South Asia.



Mudumalai Tiger Reserve

This is the first Sanctuary to be set up in India and forms part of the Jawharlal Nehru National Park. It is located 36 kms from Ooty from Kalhatty and 67 kms via Gudalur. From Mysore it is 91 kms away. This Sanctuary extends over an area of 321 sq.kms in the junction of the three states of Tamil Nadu, Karnataka and Kerala. It is at an elevation of 1,140 mtrs. A variety of habitat ranging from tropical evergreen forest, moist deciduous forest, moist teak forest, dry teak forest, secondary grasslands and swamps are found here.



29th April

After staying overnight in Ooty we went to visit Doddabetta Peak, Tea factory, Chocolate factory and Ooty lake.

Doddabetta Peak

Doddabetta Peak, located in the Nilgiri Hills of Tamil Nadu, is the highest peak in the Nilgiri mountain range. Geographically, it sits at an elevation of 2,637 meters (8,650 feet) above sea level, offering stunning vistas of the surrounding landscape. The peak is characterized by its rolling hills, dense forests, and tea plantations, creating a picturesque backdrop for visitors.





Tea factory and Tea Museum at Ooty

Ooty is renowned for producing high-quality tea, particularly Nilgiri tea, which is appreciated for its brisk and bright flavour profile.



There we get an guided tour that provide us with insights into the teamaking process, from plucking the tea leaves to withering, rolling, fermenting, drying and packaging. We witnessed each stage of tea production first hand and learn about the nuances of tea cultivation and processing.





Chocolate factory at Ooty

Ooty's chocolate factories are known for their artisanal approach of chocolate-making. They often produce handcrafted methods, ensuring high-quality and distinct flavours.



The Chocolate factory provided guided tour that offered insights into the chocolate-making process. We witnessed the various stages of chocolate production, from roasting and grinding cocoa beans to tempering and moulding chocolate into delectable treats.



Ooty Lake

Surrounded by the majestically-tall eucalyptus trees and dotted with green bushes along the shores, the Ooty Lake is an impressive spot in Nilgiris district. The Lake, spanning over 65 acres, was originally constructed for fishing. It was later transformed into a tourist park when the Tamil Nadu Tourism Development Corporation took over it in 1973.

There are many fun activities that tourists can indulge in when they are at the Ooty Lake. Cycles are available for rent to ride around the Lake. Boating is another attraction. A tranquil ride through the waters is an attractive pastime as it lets one take in the entire beauty of the Lake. Paddle boat-, motor boat- and rowing boat services are also available. The ride offers a view of the serene greenery around and also of the distant hills.



30th April

We left Ooty in the morning and went for Wayanad. On the way we visit Botanical garden and Pykara falls.

Ooty Botanical garden

The garden, sprawling across 55 acres, showcases a stunning array of exotic plants, flowers, and trees, providing a peaceful sanctuary away from the hustle and bustle of city life. Walking through its well-maintained pathways, visitors can admire a diverse collection of flora from around the world, including rare species of roses, orchids. The highlight for many is the fossilized tree trunk, estimated to be over 20 million years old, offering a glimpse into the region's ancient history.



Pykara Falls

Pykara Falls is a scenic waterfall located near Ooty in the Nilgiris district of Tamil Nadu, India. It is one of the most popular tourist attractions in the region, known for its natural beauty and tranquil surroundings.



The waterfall cascades down from a height of approximately 55 meters (180 feet) into a series of pools and streams, creating a mesmerizing sight and a soothing sound. Here we captured the beauty of the falls through photography and simply immersed oneself in the serenity of nature, Pykara Falls offers a memorable experience for visitors of all ages.


2nd May




2. Riverside Camping:

Visitors can explore the opulent halls, royal chambers, and private quarters, learning about the palace's storied past and the royal family's legacy through guided tours and informative exhibits.


c)Royal lifestyle:
