- II. The Edakkal Caves hold immense cultural significance for the indigenous tribes of Kerala, particularly the Kurichiyas and Kurumbas. These communities regard the caves as sacred sites and often conduct rituals and ceremonies in the vicinity. The caves also feature in local folklore and legends, further enhancing their cultural importance.
- III. The caves consist of two main chambers, formed by large boulders wedged between rock formations. The natural crevices and clefts in these boulders create openings that allow light and air to penetrate, illuminating the interiors. Visitors can explore the narrow passages and chambers within the caves, marvelling at the intricate rock formations and the ancient petroglyphs adorning the walls.
