

Objectives of Village Study


- Sensitizing the officer trainee towards rural life.








• The Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA) was notified in September 2005. The Act provides guaranteed 100 days of wage employment in a financial year to every rural household whose adult members volunteer to do unskilled manual work at the notified wage rate.

Objectives of the Act

- i. Providing not less than one hundred days of unskilled manual work as a guaranteed employment in a financial year to every household in rural areas as per demand, resulting in creation of productive assets of prescribed quality and durability.
- ii. Strengthening the livelihood resource base of the poor.
- iii. Proactively ensuring social inclusion.

ii. Strengthening Panchayat Raj Institutions.

Implementation

MGNREGS is in implementation in 32 rural districts in Telangana (excluding Hyderabad)covering 540 rural mandals and 12751 rural Gram Panchayats of the State. 53.06 lakh jobcards issued to 1.04crore individuals

Funding Pattern

The Central Government shall pay 100% of the wage payments, 75% of the material payment and 6% Administrative expenditure.

The State Government shall pay 25% of the material payments, Unemployment allowance and State Council expenditure.

• Eligibility in a family Old Age /Toddy Tappers/Weavers/ Dialysis/ART/Filaria/FA to Beedi Thekadar One Pension per family Widow, Disabled and Beedi Workers More than one any number of pensions per family can be sanctioned.

Socio-economic Criteria (exclusion)

The households whose annual income is less than Rs.1.50 lakhs in rural areas and Rs.2.00 lakhs in Urban areas are eligible provided they are not in the following exclusion list:

- (i) Having land more than 3.0 acres wet / irrigated dry or 7.5 acres dry.
- (ii) Having children who are Government / Public sector / Private sector employment / Out-sourced / Contract employees.
- (iii) Having children who are doctors, contractors, Professional and self employed.
- (iv) Having large business enterprises (oil mills, rice mills, petrol pumps, rig owners, shop owners etc.)
- (v) Persons already receiving any pensions either from State or Central Government.
- (vi) Owners of light and/or heavy automobiles (four wheelers and heavy vehicles).
- (vii) Any other criteria in which the verification office may assess by the manner of life style, occupation and possession of assets rendering the household as ineligible.
