# Narrative Description of Village

## Demography & Population

Total Population: Approximately 1,205 people.

## Gender Ratio

Balanced gender profile with roughly 614 males and 591 females (approx. 963 females per 1000 males).

## Literacy

The literacy rate stands at about 57.21%, with a noticeable gap between male (69%) and female (45%) literacy, which has likely improved over the last decade due to state educational initiatives.

## Social Groups

The community is primarily Hindu, with a mix of SC, ST, BC, Muslims, Gen.

# Narrative Description of Village

## Land & Agriculture

The village spans roughly 398 hectares.

## Irrigation

Farming relies on a combination of seasonal monsoon rains, local tanks (cheruvuvu), and increasingly, borewell irrigation.

## Principal Crops

The region is known for producing rice, cotton, and groundnuts. Red gram (Pigeon pea) and castor are also common in this dry-land belt.

# Narrative Description of Village

## Infrastructure & Connectivity

The village is situated about 4 km from the Mandal headquarters, Maddur, and approximately 25 km from the district hub, Narayanpet. It is connected via rural link roads to the main Narayanpet–Mahbubnagar highway.

## Housing

There are roughly 255 households. Most houses are a mix of traditional tile-roofed homes and modern concrete (RCC) structures.

## Public Services

The village is governed by its own **Gram Panchayat**. Essential services like primary schools and Anganwadi centers are available locally, while major medical and high-school facilities are sought in Maddur.








# Villagers Issues

- Drainage facilities not proper and waterlogging in low-lying areas
- Low wages
- Less job opportunities
- Mahalaxmi scheme- Cylinder subsidies must be Rs500, but paying Rs 920
- Ration card- Only Rice distribution
- Indiramma housing schemes- Required persons are allotted house, political interference

## Self Help Groups




# SHG, PHC, Anganwadi Conditions

## Self Help Groups

- 23 groups , 240 members (All women)
- 100rs per person for membership
- Mahanidhi Srinidhi schemes for loans per group
- Loan amount is not repaid faced by SHG groups
  
- No PHC available, Weekly Nurse visit
- Single Ashaworker mainly for health related issues for villagers

# SHG, PHC, Anganwadi Conditions

## Anganwadi



- Interaction with women's benefited
- Vaccination conducted at Anganwadi centre by ANM/Nurse twice a month

## Anganwadi




- Pregnant ladies-9, 7mon-3yr – 39, 3yrs-5yrs- 15
- Arogya Lakshmi- One Full meal per day
- Balamrutham & Balamrutham plus

# School Conditions



- Interaction with students and teachers of Primary school

# School Conditions



- Single teacher, No playgrounds
- Single classrooms facilitating 1-5 class students

# School Conditions

- School upto 5<sup>th</sup> standard only
- Small infrastructure
- Cooking facilities are not proper
- Generally girls are sent to gov school and boys are sent to private school
- Single teacher (2 vacancies not filled)

# Social and economic condition of villagers

- Population socially categorized into SC, ST, BC communities
- Limited employment opportunities, mainly depended on agriculture
- Seasonal farming and uncertain income
- Gender-based wage inequality

# ULB Visit



- Population-1300 approx.
- Literacy 61%,
- Ward consists of 1 gov school for class 1-7

# ULB Slums – Ward 13



- Estimated population 3000 approx.
- Social composition- 60% hindu, 40% Muslims
- Nearest hospital 3km approx.
- School up to 5<sup>th</sup> class

## ULB – Ward 13 Issues

- Water Supply issues
- Primary School conditions are poor, No toilets available
- Small infrastructure
- Single teacher- Blind Teacher
- Vacancy
