

- ❖ Route taken: Panchayat Bhavan – Temples– Farms – Bus Stop – SBI, Kiosk (AEPS)– Pond, Masjid – PHC– AW – SCHOOL
- ❖ Stakeholders –Farmers, Labors, Kirana Shopkeepers, Sweepers, Auto Driver, Tea vendors, Garbage Trolley Carrier

Timeline of the Village

Period	Event / Development
1947 (Independence of India)	DAMARGIDDA remained part of Hyderabad State under the Nizam.
1948 (Operation Polo)	Integration into India after Hyderabad's annexation by Indian forces.
1956 (Reorganization of States)	Became part of Andhra Pradesh after state's linguistic reorganization.
1960s–1980s	Agricultural development, traditional crops like paddy and maize cultivated. Growth of irrigation facilities.
1990s	Basic infrastructure improvements—electricity, roads, and drinking water access improved.
2000s	Growth in education & literacy, establishment of schools. Mobile network connectivity improves.
2014 (Telangana Formation)	DAMARGIDDA became part of the newly formed Telangana State under Mahabubnagar district.
2019	New Narayanpet district created
Present Day	Gram Panchayat continues to focus on environmental initiatives, rural development, and digital connectivity.

Connectivity

- **Road Access:**

- DAMARGIDDA is accessible via local roads connecting it to nearby towns and villages.
- Approx 13.2 km long road length in village
- 11 km from Narayanpet district

- **Public Transportation:**

- The village is connected by public bus services, with the nearest bus station being the DAMARGIDDA Bus Station.
- Free TSRTC bus travel across Telangana for Women under **MahaLakshmi Scheme.**

- **Rail Connectivity:**

- The nearest railway station is more than 10 kilometers away from DAMARGIDDA.

AGRICULTURE

- ❖ Paddy cultivation - 2 / year
- ❖ rocky land
- ❖ Irrigation - Tube Wells (200-300 ft)
- ❖ Narayanpet-Kodangal Lift Irrigation Scheme (NKLIS)
- ❖ Intensive subsistence agriculture



Anganwadi Centres

- ❖ Comes under Umbrella of POSHAN ABHIYAN and AROGYA LAKSHMI Schemes
- ❖ NHTS (Nutrition & Health Tracking System) is used for monitoring purpose.
- ❖ Total 6 in numbers but 2 are running in rental houses
- ❖ 15-25 childs in each Anganwadi



POSITIVES

- ❖ Women empowerment and child welfare
- ❖ Ensuring balanced nutrition
- ❖ Creating awareness
- ❖ Kitchen at each center

NEGATIVES

- ❖ Infrastructure deficit
- ❖ Human resource shortage

WAY FORWARD

- ❖ Ensuring availability of physical resources and maintenance services at Anganwadi periodically
- ❖ Train and hire locally. Upskilling existing Anganwadi workers.
- ❖ Timely availability of funds

Education

KASTURBA GANDHI BALIKA VIDYALAYA (KGBV)

- ❖ Flagship Central Government scheme launched in 2004
- ❖ Residential schools for girls
- ❖ Target Group: Support girl child education from minorities and BPL families
- ❖ Strength= 300+ Students
- ❖ Dedicated hostel for better living standard
- ❖ No fee for tuition and fooding & lodging
- ❖ Free Books & Uniform
- ❖ Vocational training : Nursing
- ❖ Timely availability of funds

KASTURBA GANDHI BALIKA VIDYALAYA (KGBV)

- ❖ Books available in English and Telugu language
- ❖ Disciplined and Enthusiastic Students
- ❖ Visual Learning through charts, images
- ❖ Collaborative Learning
- ❖ Empowering and Strengthening Girls Education

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES DURING REPUBLIC DAY

- ❖ Awareness program about Use of Plastic
- ❖ Traditional Dance, Patriotic songs

- ❖ Roleplay of Freedom fighter like Gandhiji, Rani Laxmibai, Bhagat singh, etc.



Health Care System

Public Health Care

- ❖ On behalf of the government, one Public Health Centre and a Rural Health Training Centre is present.
- ❖ Regular vaccination drives are conducted.
- ❖ Availability of doctors was not a major issue as suggested by the villagers.
- ❖ A private clinic by a MBBS doctor is also present.

Concerns

- ❖ Scabies was showing a surge among the students residing in hostels.
- ❖ Improper cleaning of water tanks was the reason as suggested by the villagers.

Health Care System

Animal Health Care

- ❖ One veterinary hospital is there.
- ❖ **Bharat Pasudhan App** is used by the villagers to register complains and vaccination request.
- ❖ **Gopal Mitra** service available with mobile vehicles to help the doctor.
- ❖ Veterinary is doing good work in terms of providing different services like animal breeding, vaccination and treatment of animals.



Health Care System

Concerns

- ❖ Not enough space available.
- ❖ No ambulance has been issued.
- ❖ People have to come from as far as 18 km.
- ❖ Only 1 veterinary hospital for 30 village.



Water Supply

- ❖ **6 overhead water tanks** are there to provide water supply in the village.
- ❖ Pipe water supply is available under **Mission Bhagiratha**.
- ❖ 24*7 water supply is available.
- ❖ The quality of water is good and free from any contamination.



Self Help groups

- ❖ Total **46 SHGs** are there in the Mandal with around **1100** women.
- ❖ A grant of **Rs. 2 Lakhs** is provided per SHGs.
- ❖ Meeting of SHGs conducted **twice a month**.
- ❖ All members are **able to read and write** their names.
- ❖ All members are having mobile phone and connected through Whatsapp groups.
- ❖ Major activities include: School uniform cutting, Stitching, different seasonal business.



Self Help groups

- ❖ A major business of **Sitafal Processing** is undertaken every year from **September to November**.
- ❖ Around **5000 kg Custard Apples** are processed during this period.
- ❖ The pulps are sold to various Ice Cream manufacturers in Hyderabad.
- ❖ The workers earn a wage of **500 Rs.** per day.



Banking

- ❖ A branch of **State Bank of India** is present. But, running with lesser than the required number of staffs as suggested by the villagers.
- ❖ **Indian post** is available in the village.
- ❖ A Kiosk Centre present for SBI and HDFC bank with **Aadhar Enabled Payment System (AEPS)**.
- ❖ Daily deposit limit of **30000 Rs.** in the Kiosk was an issue for the ones who want to deposit more amounts.
- ❖ Services like **Jan Dhan Account** are also available.

Details Of Ward At A Glance-

1. Population-1300

a. Adult -1100

b.Children-200

2.Literacy Rate=61%

Female Literacy Rate=42%

3.The population comprises of approximately 70% muslim & 30% hindu families respectively

4. Ward consist of 1 govt School for classes 1 to 7.

Education in Ward

- 1 Govt School for classes 1 to 7
- Provides mid day meal
- 162 enrolled students
- Established in 1971
- Urdu & English Medium



- Sports Activities are organized every saturday
- The school runs with multi disciplinary subjects
- Comprises of English , Urdu & Telugu as optional language subjects.
- Has Adequate drinking water & sanitation facility
- No provision of High School in the ward.

Solid Waste Management Plant, Narayanpet

- Spread Across the area of 8 acre
- Not operational for 3 months in year
- Dump loading Rate=15 ton/day
- uses Open Duming method of waste disposal



- Recycles waste into industry grade briquettes which are used in cement factories.
- Comprises of 15 workers
- Facing loan repayment issues hence, the facility is currently shut down.
