What is Ecotourism?

"Tourism that involves traveling to relatively undisturbed natural areas with the specified object of studying, admiring and enjoying the scenery and its wild plants and animals, as well as any existing cultural aspects (both of the past and the present) found in these areas ". (WTO 1999)

TIES defines ecotourism as "responsible travel to natural areas that conserves the environment and sustains the well-being of local people."

JLR – A history

- Set up in 1980 as the State's wildlife and ecotourism initiative as a Pvt. Ltd. company by M/s Tiger Tops Pvt. Ltd., Nepal
- M/s Tiger Tops Pvt. Ltd. withdrew in the year 1987 by selling their entire share to Govt. of Karnataka

Objectives






Safaris

Structures

- Tents a tent base over which there is a brick and mortar structure only for the bathroom and toilet. The living area is a canvas tent.
- Loghuts A concrete slab that supports the entire structure that is on stilt.
- Wooden cottages The entire wooden cabin is erected on a concrete platform
- Rooms and cottages: These are traditional brick and mortar structures.
- None of the structures have a RCC roof






- 23 operational trek routes developed by KEDB
















What are some of our good practices?

Naturalist presence in most of the resorts

Right from the start, JLR has employed naturalists in most of its resorts to accompany guests. It is one of the main USP of the company now being emulated by private operators today. The naturalist is involved in creating awareness among guests and the main contact person for the guest



Naturalists

- Over 30 naturalists working at the various facilities run by JLR
- Most are certified
- Periodic training and refresher programmes are conducted
- Training is also imparted to other staff aspiring to become naturalists

Employment to locals

About 90% of all the staff employed at the resorts are locals. This is in line with the principles of eco-tourism. It creates employment opportunities and thereby enhances the economic status of the local community.

Most of the resorts are small

Disturbance to the ambience of the environment is kept to the minimum by keeping the resort small and therefore the limiting the number of visitors using the place.

Use of local vendors where possible

Local vendors are contacted for regular supply of perishable items. This again leads to the betterment of the economic status of the local community.

Solar Energy (to a limited extent)

Renewable energy is used to a very limited extent for purposes of lighting, etc. in some of our properties.



Relationship with the Forest Department

- As a stakeholder in the company dividends are disbursed to FD
- Entry fee, camera charges, etc. are paid
- Other support extended to the FD
 - a. Support during fire season
 - b. Help with road maintenance
 - c. Lantana clearance
 - d.Sponsorship for the many events conducted by Forest Department Wildlife Week, Bird festivals, Hornbill Festival, Butterfly festival, seminars and conferences


