


## Status Quo Current Landscape

India has ~2 million social enterprises (WEF) 57% founded in the last 5 years (British Council) US\$ 2.9B in impact investment (2023) (IIC India) 47% women-led (British Council) 10.05 crore women in SHGs 1.2 crore MSEs accessible through ONDC/GeM

India is among top countries piloting social procurement at scale (WEF)






## Let's Define Social Enterprises

Parameter	Characterized by
Availability	Uneven distribution of resources, social exclusion, infrastructure deficits
Accessibility	Barriers of language, discrimination, digital divide
Affordability	High costs, hidden costs, ineffective social safety nets, institutional voids

Government brings scale, mandate and infrastructure; entrepreneurs bring agility and innovation and real impact happens only when both work together.









The first AI-based forest fire detection system to be installed among any of India's tiger reserves in Pench








Marut Drones, IFFCO tie up for drone spraying over 5 lakh acre farm land in TS and AP
