




#### **MARITIME INTERESTS**





Surpassed US Navy in 2020, as the largest Navy in the World







Threat to trade/ seafarers; resurgence of piracy

> > 38 Capital ships deployed since Nov 23


Safe transit of ~ 124 Lakh MT Cargo over 321 MVs (5.4 Bn USD)

Anti-Piracy: Surveillance over piracy hot spots, > 1000 boarding ops and apprehended pirates


>169 maritime incidents

Assistance rendered towards SAR, FF assistance, MEDEVAC, EOD sanitisation


