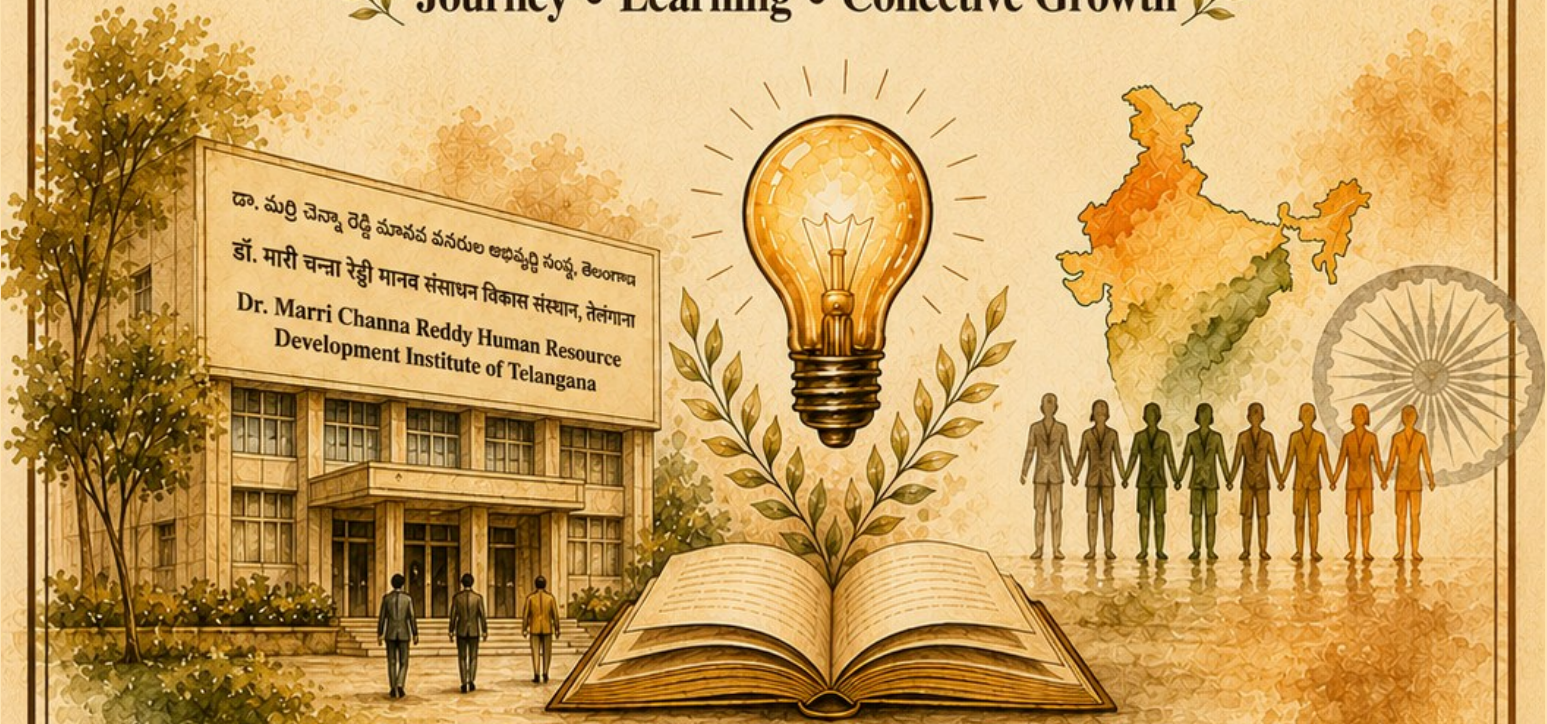

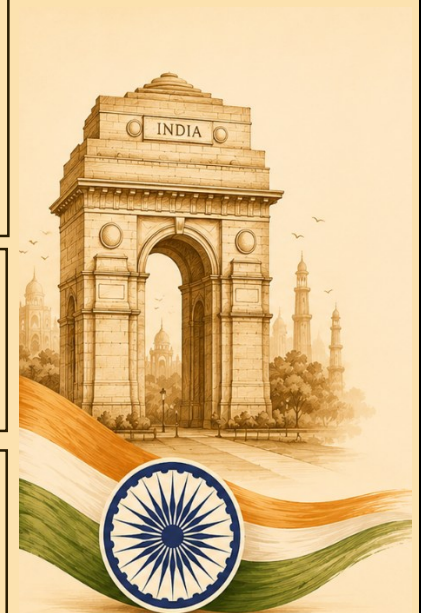

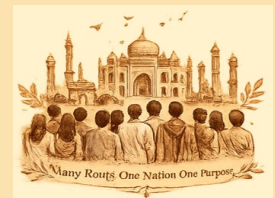
## Our Collective Identity: Makes a Nation in One Room

**Tungabhadra**, our dining hall, brings everyone together, offering not just nourishment but a sense of community and shared experience.

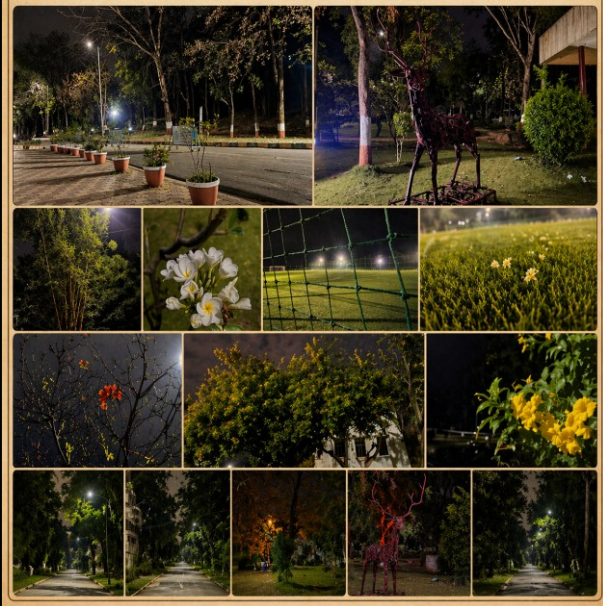

## Sports & Recreation: Beyond the Classroom

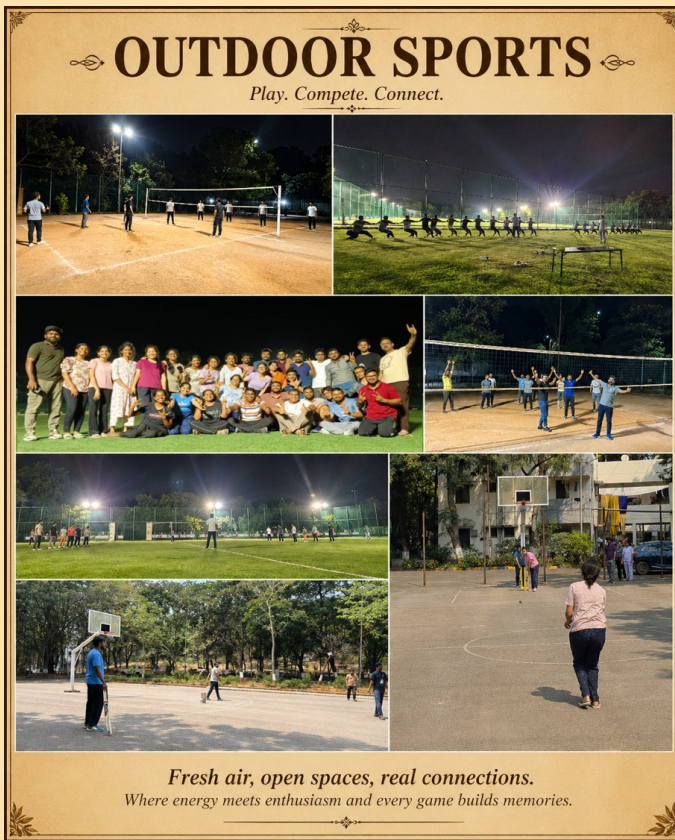
### Outdoor Action

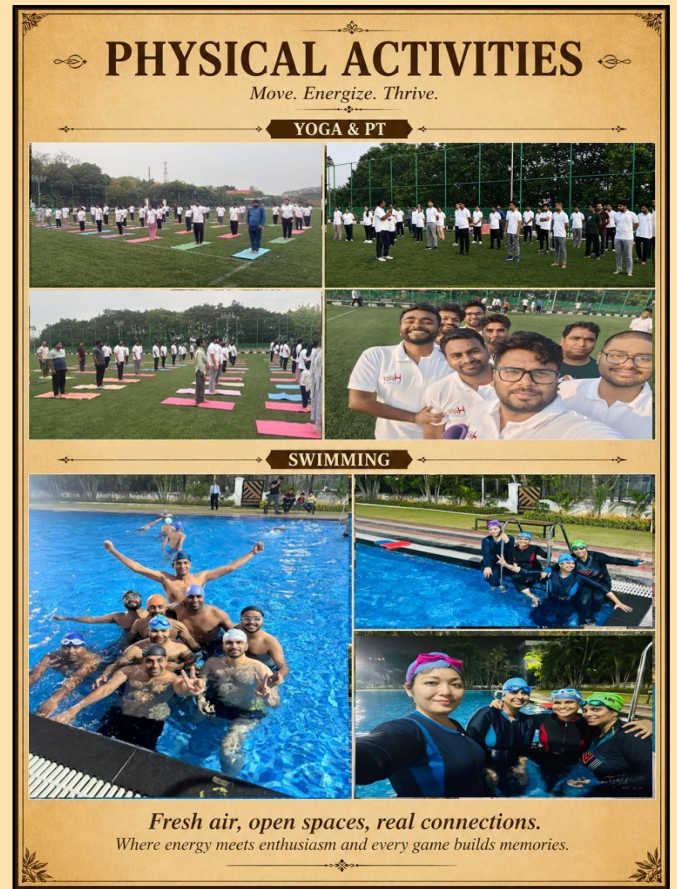
