The journey was far from easy. Coaching fees, study materials, and daily living expenses gradually exhausted his savings. At the same time, he had family responsibilities, including supporting his sister. Despite his hard work and determination, he narrowly missed qualifying for the ESE Preliminary Examination by just a few marks. It was one of the most difficult phases of his life. During this period, while traveling by bus to appear for an NPCIL examination, he met a senior candidate. During their conversation, he learned that students with a strong GATE score and a CGPA above 7.5 could directly pursue a PhD after completing their B.Tech. Inspired by this opportunity, he applied to several IITs. He was rejected by IIT Bombay and IIT Kanpur, but eventually secured admission to IIT BHU. He believed that pursuing a PhD would allow him to continue preparing for UPSC alongside his academic research. He spent nearly a year in the PhD program. However, research work, laboratory responsibilities, and academic commitments left him with very little time for UPSC preparation. Then, another significant opportunity arrived—he was selected for a government position as an Assistant Sub-Inspector in Madhya Pradesh. Since the posting was in his home state and his family also lived there, he thought he would finally be able to balance both his career and exam preparation. However, things did not go as planned. Because of his dedication and efficiency, more and more responsibilities are assigned to him. Gradually, his studies began taking a back seat. There came a point when he almost gave up on the dream he had pursued for so many years. He felt that life had finally become stable, and with a secure government job in hand, perhaps it was time to think about marriage. About a year later, through a marriage proposal introduced by their families, he met a young woman. What began as formal conversations gradually developed into friendship, understanding, and mutual respect. Over the next several months, they got to know each other better and realized that they shared similar values and dreams. Eventually, they decided to get married. For the first time in many years, life felt peaceful. He had a loving wife, a stable career, and a hopeful future ahead. Their happiness grew even greater when they were blessed with a baby boy.

Then tragedy struck!!

When his son was only ten days old, a horrifying incident changed his life forever. It was not an accident. Someone attempted to take his life. The attack was so severe that he suffered catastrophic injuries and lost one arm and one leg. Against all odds, he survived. The physical pain was unimaginable, but the emotional burden was even greater. As he lay in the hospital fighting for his life, he could think only about his wife, his newborn son, and the responsibilities waiting for him at home. Months of treatment and rehabilitation followed. He desperately hoped that he would recover and return to a normal life. However, the doctors delivered a devastating verdict- “You are permanently disabled,” they told him. “Returning to your previous physical condition is impossible.” Those words shattered him. For a time, he struggled with pain, anger, and uncertainty. The dream he had pursued for years seemed farther away than ever. Yet, during his darkest moments, a powerful realization emerged. He thought to himself, “I survived when I was not supposed to survive. If life has given me a second chance, I must make it count.”

That thought changed everything.

Instead of surrendering to despair, he decided to fight once again for the dream that had remained alive in his heart for years—the dream of becoming a UPSC Engineering Services officer. With limited physical abilities but unlimited determination, he returned to his books. Every day was a challenge. Tasks that once seemed simple now required extraordinary effort. But he refused to complain. He focused on what he still had rather than what he had lost. Months turned into years. He studied relentlessly while continuing to fulfil his responsibilities as a husband, a father, and a government employee. Eventually, he appeared for the examination again. This time, he successfully cleared the written stages and reached the interview round. After everything he had endured, it felt as though victory was finally within reach. But once again, he faced disappointment. He was not selected. The result hurt deeply. Yet unlike before, he did not allow failure to break him.

Life had already taught him that setbacks are temporary and that every failure carries a lesson. He carefully analysed his mistakes. He worked on his communication skills, improved his personality, strengthened his technical knowledge, and refined every weakness he could identify. Then he prepared once more. This time, something was different. The years of struggle had transformed him. The young man who once feared failure had become a warrior who was no longer afraid of it. One by one, the examinations he appeared for began yielding success. The person who had once faced repeated rejections started clearing every competitive examination he attempted. Finally, the day arrived that he had dreamed about for more than a decade. The UPSC Engineering Services Examination results were declared. With trembling hands and a hopeful heart, he checked the result.

For a few moments, he could not believe it. The dream that had survived financial hardship, academic rejection, heartbreak, family responsibilities, physical disability, a brutal attempt on his life, and countless failures had finally become reality. But destiny had one more surprise waiting for him. Around the same period, he was also selected as an Examiner of Patents and Designs under the Office of the Controller General of Patents, Designs and Trade Marks (CGPDTM). For many people, choosing between the two opportunities would have been difficult. However, for him, the decision became clearer with time. As an Examiner of Patents and Designs, he would spend every day evaluating new inventions, studying emerging technologies, and interacting with innovative ideas from across the country and the world. His natural curiosity and engineering mindset made the role especially appealing. More importantly, the position relied primarily on intellectual ability rather than physical activity. Despite losing an arm and a leg, his greatest strength—his mind—remained untouched. He realized that while life had taken away certain physical abilities, it had not taken away his intelligence, determination, analytical skills, or passion for learning. Therefore, he chose to join CGPDTM as an Examiner of Patents and Designs. It was not a compromise. It was a conscious decision to build a future where his knowledge, curiosity, and technical expertise could create the greatest impact. Every day at work brought a new invention, a new problem to solve, and a new opportunity to contribute to India's innovation ecosystem. The profession perfectly matched his love for engineering and continuous learning.

Looking back, he understood that success is not always about reaching the destination you originally imagined. Sometimes success is discovering a destination that is even more aligned with who you have become through your struggles. The boy who once left a secure job to chase a dream, who faced rejection from prestigious institutions, who lost love, who survived an attempt on his life, who lost an arm and a leg, and who was told that recovery was impossible, ultimately built a life of purpose, dignity, and achievement. His journey became a symbol of courage, perseverance, and hope. Because in the end, his greatest achievement was not clearing a particular examination or securing a prestigious position. His greatest achievement was proving that no obstacle, no tragedy, and no failure is greater than the power of an unbreakable human spirit. And that is why his story continues to inspire everyone who hears it.

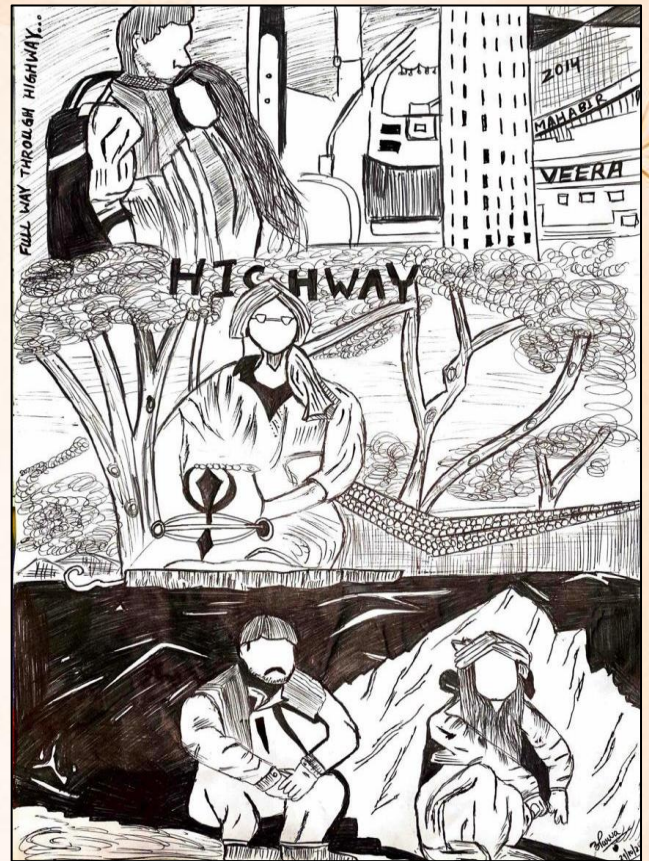

Patents or Pretence? Safeguarding the Spirit of Innovation

A patent is often regarded as a symbol of innovation, but its true worth lies not in the certificate itself, but in the originality and impact it represents. In recent times, however, concerns have emerged over the growing trend of “fake patents,” where inventorship positions on design registrations are marketed to academics as a shortcut to enhance their professional credentials. While these registrations may appear impressive on paper, they often lack the essential ingredient that defines innovation—genuine creativity. In the race for recognition, some are choosing the patent over the purpose, turning innovation into imitation.

The increasing dependence on numerical indicators such as patent filings, publications, and institutional rankings has unintentionally created fertile ground for such practices. As universities and researchers compete for better rankings and career advancement, a market has developed that exploits these pressures. The result is a shift from meaningful research to metric-driven achievements, where the focus is on accumulating numbers rather than generating knowledge. When success is measured only by quantity, quality inevitably becomes the silent casualty.

Experts have stressed that patents should reflect real technological progress capable of benefiting society and

industry, not merely serve as academic decorations. A granted patent with practical application carries far greater value than multiple filings or design registrations obtained solely to inflate a résumé. Strengthening ethical awareness, encouraging responsible research practices, and implementing robust institutional oversight are essential to preserving the credibility of scientific innovation. After all, the goal is not to collect patents, but to create progress.



As the research ecosystem continues to evolve, evaluation systems must also shift their emphasis from counting achievements to assessing their impact. Institutions and regulatory bodies can play a pivotal role by rewarding originality, practical application, and integrity over numerical targets. In the end, a patent should be proof of an invention, not an invention of proof. By valuing substance over statistics, the academic community can ensure that innovation remains a beacon of progress rather than a race for paper credentials.

They do not only ask, “How much can I earn today?” They ask, “How can I build something enterprises that lasts?” This long-term vision has helped many family businesses grow into respected enterprises.

Another important part of this mindset is adaptability. Markets change, technology changes, and customer needs change - but successful entrepreneurs change with

them. A small trader, a factory owner, or a start-up founder all follow the same principle: **learn continuously and improve constantly.**

Trust is another powerful asset in Gujarati business culture. Relationships are often built over years through honesty, commitment, and reliability. A business is not seen only as a transaction; it is seen as a connection between people.

जीवन, मृत्यु और अनंत का महासंगम

बहुत हद तक यह कल्पना कितनी सच लगती है कि समुद्र का तट ही दो अलग दुनिया का संगम-स्थल है। दर्शनशास्त्र की दृष्टि से, यह तट 'द्वैत' और 'अद्वैत' का महासंगम है। एक तरफ हमारी यह दृश्यमान धरती है—ठोस, निश्चित सीमाओं से बंधी हुई, जहाँ हमारे घर हैं, हमारे रिश्ते हैं और हमारा अहंकार है। दूसरी तरफ अगाध, असीम और रहस्यमयी समंदर है, जिसका कोई अंत नहीं दिखाई देता।

तट वह सीमा रेखा है जहाँ हमारी छोटी-सी मर्यादित दुनिया, उस असीमित 'अनंत' से टकराती है। यह वह स्थान है जहाँ पहुँचकर इंसान को अपनी लघुता का एहसास होता है और वह यह जान पाता है कि जिसे वह अपना पूरा संसार समझता है, वह इस ब्रह्मांड के सामने रेत के एक कण से ज्यादा कुछ नहीं है।

सुख-दुख और यादों का ज्वार-भाटा

समुद्र के किनारे पर खुशियाँ और दुख मिलते हैं। यहाँ पर कुछ लोग मिलते भी हैं और कुछ सदा के लिए विदा भी हो जाते हैं। लहरों का स्वभाव ही आना और लौट जाना है। ठीक इसी तरह, हमारे जीवन में भावनाएँ आती हैं। जब कोई प्रिय मिलता है, तो मन में सुख का ज्वार उठता है; जब कोई सदा के लिए विदा हो जाता है, तो दुख का भाटा आता है।



इस दर्शन को यदि और गहराई से देखें, तो किसी के आँसू समुद्र के पानी बन जाते हैं तो किसी की हँसी किनारे पर बहने वाली ठंडी हवाएँ। समय के इस महासागर में सब कुछ विलीन हो जाता है— न हँसी स्थायी है, न रोना। सब कुछ हवा के झोंकों और पानी की तरंगों में रूपांतरित हो रहा है। मौसम के साथ-साथ यहाँ सब कुछ बदलता रहता है, कभी पानी का स्तर नीचे तो कभी हवाओं की गति धीमी, सब कुछ एक मानव जीवन की भांति, उतार-चढ़ाव से भरा हुआ।

यमराज बनाम केवट: अंत नहीं, यात्रा का विस्तार

इस पूरे विचार का सबसे सुंदर और गहरा दार्शनिक मोड़ तब आता है, जब हम मृत्यु के पारंपरिक देवता 'यमराज' के भय से मुक्त होकर एक 'केवट' (नाविक) की कल्पना करते हैं। यही वजह है कि मुझे यमराज की कल्पना मेरे मन को उतना नहीं भाती, जितना एक केवट की कल्पना आकर्षित करती है, जो जीवन को एक दुनिया से किसी दूसरी दुनिया ले जा रहा है।

यह बदलाव भारतीय दर्शन के मूल तत्व को दर्शाता है। यमराज का विचार जहाँ भय, जबरदस्ती, और एक झटके में सब कुछ छीन लिए जाने का प्रतीक है, वहीं केवट का विचार सहजता, यात्रा और मार्गदर्शन का प्रतीक है।

केवट हमें डराता नहीं, वह हमें हाथ थामकर नाव में बिठाता है। वह मृत्यु को एक 'पूर्णविराम' (End) की तरह नहीं, बल्कि केवल एक 'घाट' से दूसरे 'घाट' की यात्रा की तरह दिखाता है। इस पार का संसार यदि स्थूल और नश्वर है, तो उस पार का संसार सूक्ष्म और अमर है। केवट हमें इस पार के मोह से मुक्त कर, उस पार के सत्य से मिलाने का जरिया है।

THE EXAMINER AS NATION-BUILDER
*Reading India's Communication Story through a
Patent Lens*

"One protects the nation's boundaries of law; the other protects the law of ideas. Both, in their own silence, build the nation."

Every nation writes its history twice - once in its constitution, and once in its patents. As a trainee Examiner, I have begun to read India's silent second history: the story of how a colonised economy, once dependent on imported radio sets, now examines indigenous claims in 5G, 6G, semiconductor design, and quantum communication.



There is a quiet parallel between administrative service and patent examination - both demand the same discipline: to weigh evidence impartially, to separate the genuine from the derivative, and to serve a larger public interest invisible to the applicant standing before you. When we examine a claim on adaptive antenna arrays or IoT mesh protocols, we are not merely checking novelty against prior art but deciding what enters India's technological commons, and what does not. Electronics and Communication Engineering, in this light, is not just circuits and signal processing. It is the connective tissue of a republic - the towers that carry a farmer's voice to a mandi app, the satellites that map a flood before it strikes, the chips that may one day carry "Made in India" silicon to the world. Training here, away from textbooks of administration yet steeped in the same ethic of service, I have learnt that the examiner's chair is also a chair of nation-building - quieter than an administrator desk, but no less consequential.
