**Preamble:**

The order of the Chief Secretary & Chairman, State Executive Committee, Karnataka State Disaster Management Authority order No. RD 158 TNR 2020, Dated: 30.05.2020 on the measures for containment of COVID-19 is as mentioned below

According to the guidelines, the following prohibitory actions to be incorporated strictly to contain the COVID-19 spread are mentioned in the guidelines as follows.

**1. Phased re-opening of areas outside the Containment Zones.**

In areas outside Containment Zones, all activities will be permitted, except the following, which will be allowed, with the stipulation of following Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) to be prescribed by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW), in a phased manner:

**Phase I**

The following activities will be allowed with effect from 8th June, 2020:

- (i) Religious places/ places of worship for public.
- (ii) Hotels, restaurants and other hospitality services.
- (iii) Shopping malls.

## Phase II

Opening of Schools, Colleges, educational/ training/ Coaching institutions etc., The State Government will hold consultations at the institutions level with parents and other stakeholders. Based on the feedback, a decision on the re-opening of these institutions will be taken in the month of July, 2020

## Phase III

Based on the assessment of the situation, dates for re-starting the following activities will be decided:

- (i) International air travel of passengers, except as permitted by MHA.
- (ii) Metro Rail.
- (iii) Cinema halls, gymnasiums, swimming pools, entertainment parks, theatres, bars and auditoriums, assembly halls and similar places.
- (iv) Social/ Political/ Sports/ entertainment/ academic/ cultural/ religious/ functions and other large congregations.

## 2. National Directives for COVID-19 Management

National Directives for COVID-19 Management, as specified in **Annexure I**, shall continue to be followed throughout the jurisdiction of Bengaluru City commissionerate.

## 3. Lockdown limited to Containment Zones

- (i) Lockdown shall continue to remain in force in the Containment Zones till 30th June, 2020
- (ii) Containment Zones will be demarcated by the BBMP authorities after taking into consideration the guidelines of Department of Health and Family Welfare, Government of Karnataka.
- (iii) In the Containment Zones, only essential activities shall be allowed. There shall be strict perimeter control to ensure that there is no movement of people in or out of these zones, except for medical emergencies and for maintaining supply of essential goods and services. In the Containment zones, there shall be intensive contact tracing, house-to-house surveillance, and other clinical interventions, as required. Guidelines of Department of Health and Family Welfare, Government of Karnataka shall taken into consideration for the above purpose.

(iv) BBMP may also identify Buffer Zones outside the Containment Zones, where new cases are more likely to occur. Within the buffer zones, restrictions as considered necessary may be put in place by the BBMP authorities.

#### 4. Unrestricted movement of persons and goods

- (i) There shall be no restrictions on inter-state and intra-state movement of persons and goods. No separate permission/ approval/ e-permit will be required for such movements.
- (ii) Based on reasons of public health and assessment of the prevalence of COVID-19 in various States separate orders will be issued by Health and Family Welfare Department regarding inter-state movement of persons to Karnataka.
- (iii) Movement by passenger trains and *Shramik* special trains; domestic passenger air travel; movement of Indian Nationals stranded outside the country and of specified persons to travel abroad; evacuation of foreign nationals; and sign-on and sign-off of Indian seafarers will continue to be regulated as per SOPs issued.

#### 5. Protection of vulnerable persons

Persons above 65 years of age, persons with co-morbidities, pregnant women, and children below the age of 10 years are advised to stay at home, except for essential and health purposes.

#### **ORDER NO: SB/INT/Prohibitory Order/18/2020, DATED: 31.05.2020**

In exercise of the powers conferred u/s 144(1) Cr.P.C. I, Bhaskar Rao, IPS, Commissioner of Police and Additional District Magistrate, Bengaluru City hereby issue a prohibitory order within the limits of Bengaluru City Commissionerate as mentioned below.

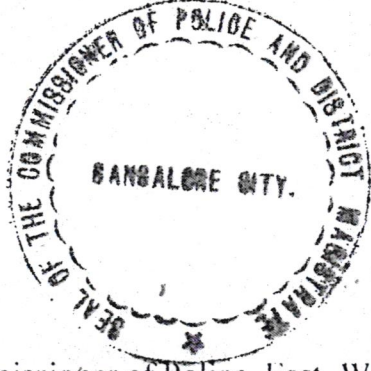
Any person violating the above mentioned containment measures will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005. besides legal action under sec. 188 of the IPC

This prohibitory order will remain in force, in all parts of the Bengaluru City Police Commissionerate for a period of thirty days with effect from 00.00 hours on 01.06.2020 upto 00.00 hours on 30.06.2020. The movement of individuals shall remain strictly prohibited between 9.00 PM to 5.00 AM on all days.

This prohibitory order is subjected to the orders of the State and Central Government.

If any person feels affected adversely by this order, can file a petition to modify or cancellation of this order u/s 144(5) & 144(6) to this office or the Government of Karnataka respectively.

**Preamble:**

The order of the Chief Secretary & Chairman, State Executive Committee, order No. RD 158 TNR 2020, Dated: 30.06.2020, issued unlock-2 guidelines which permits reopening of more activities in the calibrated manner, in aread outside the containment Zones and to extend Lockdown in containment zones upto 31.07.2020. There has been a surge in COVID-19 positive cases in Bengaluru city particularly in last 2 weeks. Hence the Government hereby orders Lockdown of Bengaluru Area to combat the spread of COVID-19 for a period of 7 days with effect from 08.00 pm on 14.07.2020 to 05.00 am on 22.07.2020. These Lockdown guidelines will continue to be enforced throughout the Bengaluru City with the additional restrictions imposed under this order in Bengaluru Area.

According to the guidelines, the following prohibitory actions to be incorporated strictly to contain the COVID-19 spread are mentioned in the guidelines as follows.

1. **Lockdown shall continue to remain in force upto 5 am on 22nd July, 2020.**
2. **Offices of the State Government and their Autonomous Bodies, Corporations, etc, shall remain closed.**

**Exceptions (outside containment zone):**

- (a) Health, Medical Education, Police, Home Guards, Civil Defence, Fire and Emergency Services, Disaster Management, BBMP and Prisons.

- (b) All offices operating and maintaining essential services such as Electricity, Water, Sanitation, etc.
- (c) BBMP and Subordinate offices, Bengaluru Urban and Bengaluru Rural DC and Subordinate offices.
- (d) Secretariate Offices in Vidhana Soudha, Vikas Soudha and MS Building with 50% strength.
- (e) Courts and Offices related to judicial work shall operate as per the existing guidelines issued by the Hon'ble High Court.
- (f) All Offices, officers, staff deputed for COVID related work.
- (g) Offices and volunteers of NGO's deployed by BBMP and Deputy Commissioners of Bengaluru Rural and Urban District for COVID 19 related work.
- (h) Treasury offices.

All other offices shall encourage their staff to work from home.

**3. Offices of the Government of India, its Autonomous/Subordinate Offices and Public Corporations shall remain closed.**

**Exceptions (outside containment zone);**

- (a) Defence, Defence PSUs, central armed police forces, and Telecommunication.
- (b) Offices operating and maintaining essential services.
- (c) Treasury (including, Pay & Accounts offices, Financial Advisers and field offices of the Controller General of Accounts, with bare minimum staff).
- (d) Public utilities (including petroleum, CNG, LPG, PNG), power generation and transmission units, post offices, Disaster management and Early warning Agencies.
- (e) National Informatics Centre.
- (f) Customs clearance at airports/land border, GSTN; and MCA 21 Registry with bare minimum staff.
- (g) Banks, Reserve Bank of India and RBI regulated financial markets and entities like NPCI, CCIL, payment system operators and standalone primary dealers with bare minimum staff.

**4. All health Services (including AYUSH and Veterinary Hospitals) to remain functional, such as: (outside containment zone)**

- (a) All hospitals nursing homes, clinics, labs, collection centers, Telemedicine facilities, dispensaries, pharmacies, chemist, Jan Aushadhi Kendras, home care providers and all kinds of medicine shops including medical equipment shops.
- (b) All pharmaceutical and research labs.
- (c) All manufacturing units of drugs, pharmaceuticals, medical devices, medical oxygen, their packing material, raw material and intermediates.
- (d) All construction pertaining to medical/health infrastructure.
- (e) Movement (inter and intra State, inter and intra district) of all medical, paramedics, nurses, scientists, lab technicians, mid-wives and other hospital support services.

**5. Agriculture and related activities (outside containment zone);**

**I. All agriculture and horticulture activities to remain fully functional, such as (outside containment zone);**

- (a) Farming operations by farmers and farm workers in field.
- (b) Agencies engaged in procurement of agriculture products, including MSP operations.
- (c) All Mandis, vegetable and fruit markets, e-marketing, direct marketing of vegetable and fruits or by industries directly by group of farmers/group of farmers, FPOs Co-operative, etc.
- (d) Shops of agriculture machinery, its spare parts (including its supply chain) and repairs to remain open.
- (e) "Custom Hiring Centers" related to farm machinery.
- (f) Manufacturing, distribution and retail of fertilizers, pesticides and seeds.
- (g) Movement (Inter-Intra state and inter-intra district) of harvesting and sowing related machines like combined harvester and other agriculture/horticulture implements.

**II. Fisheries-the following activities will be functional**

- (a) Operation of the fishing (inland)/aquaculture industry, including feeding & maintenance, harvesting, processing, packaging, cold chain, sale and marketing.
- (b) Hatcheries, feed plants, commercial aquaria.

- (c) Movement of fish/shrimp and fish products, fish seed/feed and workers for all activities.

**III. Animal Husbandry-the following activities will be functional.**

- (a) Collection, processing, distribution and sale of milk and mild products by milk processing plants, including transport and supply chain.
- (b) Operation of animal husbandry farms including poultry farms and hatcheries and livestock farming activity.
- (c) Animal feed manufacturing and feed plants, including supply of raw material, such as maize and soya. Operations of animals feed stalls/shops.

**6. Social Sector: following to remain functional outside containment zone**

- (a) Operation of homes for children/disabled/mentally challenged/senior citizens/destitutes/women/widows, etc.
- (b) Observation homes, after care homes and places of safety for juveniles.
- (c) Disbursement of social security pensions, e.g., old age/widow/freedom fighter pensions; Pensions and provident fund services provided by EPFO.
- (d) Operation of Anganwadis- distribution of food items and nutrition once in 15 days at doorsteps of beneficiaries, e.g., children, women and lactating mothers. Beneficiaries shall not attend anganwadis.
- (e) MNREGA works to be allowed with strict adherence to National directives for COVID 19 management.

**7. Unrestricted movement of all types of goods and cargo (outside containment zone);**

Movement of all types of goods through trucks (including empty trucks/goods vehicle), railways and air.

**8. The following activities will be prohibited throughout Bengaluru area:**

- (a) Only flights and trains already scheduled will continue to operate during the Lockdown period. Flight and train tickets shall serve as the passes for movement of persons by taxis/cab aggregators/auto rickshaws to board flight and trains. **No new flights or trains will be permitted.**
- (b) Metro rail services.

- (c) Taxis (including auto rickshaws) and services of cab aggregators, except while hired for emergency and as permitted in these guidelines.
- (d) Schools, colleges, educational/training/coaching institutions etc. will remain closed. Online/distance learning shall continue to be permitted and shall be encouraged. However, examination already scheduled shall be permitted with strict adherence to National Directives for COVID-19 management. ‘
- (e) Hotels, restaurants, and hospitality services, except those meant for housing health/police/Government officials/healthcare workers/ stranded persons including tourists and for quarantine facilities. **However hotels and restaurants shall be permitted to operate kitchens for take away/home delivery of food items only.**
- (f) All cinema halls, shopping malls, gymnasiums, sports complexes, stadia, swimming pools, entertainment parks, theatres, bars and auditoriums, assembly halls and similar places.
- (g) All social/political/ sports/ entertainment/ academic/cultural/ religious functions/other gatherings and large congregations.
- (h) All religious places/ places of worship shall be closed for public. Religious congregations are strictly prohibited.

#### 9. Movement of People;

- (a) No movement of people by KSRTC, BMTC, private buses or passenger vehicles except as permitted under these guidelines.
- (b) Inter-State and Intra-State movement of passenger vehicles, only in cases of emergencies or as permitted under these guidelines. The movement is through registration/obtaining valid pass through Seva Sindhu portal.
- (c) Intra-district (within Bengaluru area) movement of passenger vehicles and buses only in emergency cases or for permitted activities under these guidelines.
- (d) Movement of passenger vehicles to and from Bengaluru area only in case of emergency after obtaining valid passes and strictly adhering to the prevailing SOPs/guidelines issued by Department of Health and Family Welfare.
- (e) Movement of personnel traveling with valid ID card issued by their Organization/Institution to the place of work and back for permitted activities in these guidelines.

- (f) Students appearing for exams can use Admission ticket as travel pass and use mode of transport available to them including taxi/auto rickshaw, etc.

**10. Commercial and private establishment shall be closed down**

**Exceptions (outside containment zone);**

- (a) Shops, including ration shops (PDS), dealing with food, groceries, fruits and vegetables, dairy and milk booths, meat and fish, animal fodder to open only from 5 am to 12 noon. Home delivery of essential items shall be encouraged to minimize movement of individuals outside their homes. Operations shall be subject to adhering to National Directives for COVID 19 management.
- (b) All facilities in the supply chain of essential goods, whether involved in manufacturing, wholesale or retail of such goods through local stores, large brick and mortar stores or e-Commerce companies should be allowed to operate adhering to National Directives for COVID-19 management.
- (c) All food processing and related industries.
- (d) Banks, insurance offices and ATM.
- (e) Print and electronic media.
- (f) Telecommunication, internet services, broadcasting and cable services, IT and IT enabled services with minimum staff for essential purposes. As far possible work from home should be encouraged.
- (g) Delivery of essential items such as food, medicines, pharmaceuticals, medical equipment through E-Commerce.
- (h) Power generation, transmission and distribution units and services.
- (i) Capital and debt market services and notified by the Securities and Exchange Board of India.
- (j) Cold storage and warehousing services.
- (k) Private security services.
- (l) Delivery of goods by E-Commerce companies.

All other establishments, wherever possible, should encourage employees to work from home.

**11. Industries/Industrial Establishments (both Government and Private), as listed below will be allowed to operate (outside Containment):**

- (a) Production units which require continuous process and their supply chain.
- (b) Food processing industries, manufacturing of essential goods, including drugs, pharmaceuticals, medical devices, their raw material and intermediates.
- (c) Manufacturing of packing materials.
- (d) Manufacturing and other industrial establishment with access control in Special Economic Zones (SEZs) or outside municipal limits and Export Oriented Units (EoUs), Industrial townships adhering to National Directives for COVID-19 management.

**12. Construction activities, listed as below, will be allowed to operate outside containment zone adhering to National Directives for COVID 19 management.**

- (a) Continuation of works in construction projects, where workers are available on site and no workers are required to be brought in from outside (in situ construction).

**13. Containment Zones**

- (a) In the Containment Zones, only essential activities shall be allowed. There shall be strict perimeter control to ensure that there is no movement of people in or out of these zones, except for medical emergencies and for maintaining supply of essential goods and services.
- (b) In the Containment Zones, there shall be intensive contact tracing, quarantine watch, house-to-house surveillance, home isolation watch and other clinical interventions, as required.

**14. National Directives for COVID-19 Management**

National Directives for COVID-19 Management, as specified in **Annexure I**, shall continue to be followed in Bengaluru Area.

**15. Protection of vulnerable persons**

Persons above 65 years of age, persons with co-morbidities, pregnant women, and children below the age of 10 years, shall stay at home, except for essential and health purposes.



**Preamble:**

In view of the prevailing Covid-19 situation in the limits of Bengaluru City and the emergence of a new strain of the disease abroad, it is absolutely essential to enforce all preventive and precautionary measures to contain spread of the disease in Bengaluru City. In this regard, the Unlock-V guidelines of Government of India vide reference-1 and guidelines of Government of Karnataka with regard to celebrations in connection with New Year vide reference-2 are already in force.

In order to prevent spread of the disease, in furtherance of the above mentioned orders, certain restrictions are required to be imposed during the forthcoming New Year's celebrations for the safety of citizens.


Hence the order:

**ORDER NO. SB/INT/Prohibitory order/ 40/2020 date: 28-12-2020.**

In exercise of the powers conferred u/s 144(1) CrPC, I, Kamal Pant, IPS, Commissioner of Police and Additional District Magistrate, Bengaluru hereby issue a prohibitory order within the limits of Bengaluru City Commissionerate from 18:00 hours of 31-12-2020 to 06:00 hours of 01-01-2021, as mentioned below:

1. *Gathering of five or more people and celebration of New Year on public roads is strictly prohibited.*
2. *Any form of gatherings in public places, main roads, open areas for the purpose of any celebrations for New Year is strictly prohibited.*
3. *No New Year celebration of any type, involving a large gathering shall be held in any open place, park, grounds etc. However, in-house celebrations in residential complexes and private clubs may be held for their residents and members respectively, without organizing any special events etc.*
4. *Hotel, Mall, Restaurant, Club, Pub, Club House or any similar type of establishment holding New Year's celebration shall not organize any special DJ, events, shows, programmes or performances, music nights and musical bands or dance programmes etc. However, they may carry out their regular business activity, including music within permissible decibels, following Covid-19 protocol.*
5. *Management of the Establishments shall allow guests only with advance booking, for which a proof of booking shall be issued.*
6. *In notified areas, timing of reservation and guest movement will be regulated by jurisdictional Dy. Commissioners of Police, which will be intimated separately.*
7. *It shall be incumbent upon the management of the Establishment that no waiting crowd is allowed to form outside their premises.*
8. *Managements of the Hotels, Malls, Pubs/ Restaurants shall take all precautionary measures in accordance with prevalent Covid-19 guidelines issued by the Government, in order to ensure safety of the citizens. Alongwith this, the guidelines issued by the Police department, Pollution Control Board, Fire Service and other local authorities should also be followed.*

9. *Traffic regulations, which will be notified separately, in connection with New Year's Eve should be followed strictly.*

Any person violating the guidelines issued by the State Government and Government of India shall be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Sections 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act 2005, Epidemic Disease Act alongwith Sec 188 of the IPC and other relevant sections of law.

If any person feels affected adversely by this order, he may file a petition to modify or cancellation of this order u/s 144(5) and 144(6) to this office or the Government of Karnataka respectively.

This prohibitory order is subject to the relevant orders of the State and Central Government.

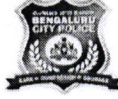

**Preamble:**

The order of the Chief Secretary & Chairman, State Executive Committee, Karnataka State Disaster Management Authority order No. RD/158/TNR/2020, Dated: 02.05.2020 & Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India vide order No. 40-3/2020-DM-I(A), Dated: 01.05.2020 on the measures for containment of COVID-19 epidemic is as mentioned below.

According to the guidelines, the districts have been divided into Green, Red and Orange Zones on the basis of the spread of COVID-19 virus. As Bengaluru City is considered as Red Zone district and the following prohibitory actions to be incorporated strictly to contain the COVID-19 spread are mentioned in the guidelines as follows.

**1. The following activities will continue to remain prohibited across the State, irrespective of the Zone with effect from 00.00 hours on 04.05.2020 to 00.00 hours on 17.05.2020**

- I. All domestic and international air travel of passengers, except for medical services, air ambulance and for security purposes or for purposes as permitted by MHA.
- II. All passenger movement by trains, except for security purposes or for purposes as permitted by MHA.

- III. Inter-State Buses for public transport, except as permitted by MHA.
- IV. Metro rail services.
- V. Inter-State movement of individuals except for medical reasons or for activities as permitted by MHA.
- VI. All schools, colleges, educational/training/coaching institutions etc. However, online/distance learning shall be permitted.
- VII. Hospitality services other than those used for housing health/Police/Government officials/healthcare workers, stranded persons including tourists, and those used for quarantine facilities.
- VIII. All cinema halls, shopping malls, gymnasiums, sports complexes, swimming pools, entertainment parks, theatres, bars and auditoriums, assembly halls and similar places.
- IX. All Social/political/sports/entertainment/academic/cultural/religious/functions/other gatherings.
- X. All religious places/places of worship shall be closed for public Religious congregations are strictly prohibited.

## **2. Measures for well being and safety of persons**

- I. The movement of individuals, for all non-essential activities, shall remain strictly prohibited between 7 pm to 7 am. Local authorities shall issue orders under appropriate provisions of law such as prohibitory orders [curfew] under section 144 of CrPC, for this purpose, and ensure strict compliance.
- II. In all zones, persons above 65 years of age, persons with co-morbidities, pregnant women and children below the age of 10 years, shall stay at home, except for meeting essential requirements and for health purposes as per the National Directives.
- III. In Containment Zones, Out-Patient Departments (OPDs) and Medical clinics shall not be permitted to operate. However, these may be permitted to operate in Red, Orange and Green Zones with social distancing norms and other safety precautions.

### 3. Activities in Containment Zones.

- I. Strict perimeter control.
- II. Establishment of clear entry and exit points.
- III. Movement of persons only for maintaining supply of goods and services and for medical emergencies.
- IV. No unchecked influx of people and transport.
- V. Recording of details of people moving in and out of perimeter.

### 4. Activities in Red Zones (Hotspots) [Outside Containment Zones]

- I. Apart from the prohibited activities mentioned at Para 4, the following activities shall **not** be permitted.
  - a) Cycle rickshaws and auto rickshaws.
  - b) Taxis and cab aggregators.
  - c) Intra-district and inter-district plying of buses.
  - d) Barber shops, spas and salons.
- II. The following activities shall be permitted with **restrictions** as specified:
  - a) Movement of individuals and vehicles only for permitted activities. Four Wheeler vehicles will have maximum two passengers besides the vehicle driver; for two wheelers, pillion rider is not allowed.
  - b) Industrial establishments in urban areas: Only Special Economic Zones (SEZs). Export Oriented Units (EOUs), industrial estates and industrial townships with access control; Manufacturing units of essential goods, including drugs, pharmaceuticals, medical devices, their raw material and intermediates; Production units, which require continuous process, and their supply chain; Manufacturing of IT hardware; Jute industry with staggered shifts and social distancing; and, Manufacturing units of packaging material are permitted.  
All industrial activities are permitted in rural areas.
  - c) Construction activities in urban areas: Only in situ construction (where workers are available on site and no workers are required to be brought in from outside) and construction of renewable energy projects are permitted.  
All Construction activities are permitted in rural areas.

- d) All malls, market complexes and markets shall remain closed in urban areas, i.e., areas within the limits of municipal corporations and municipalities. However shops selling essential goods in markets and market complexes are permitted.

**All standalone (single) shops, neighborhood (colony) shops and shops in residential complexes are permitted to remain open in urban areas, without any distinction of essential and non-essential.**

**All shops in rural areas, except in malls, are permitted to remain open, without any distinction of essential and non-essential.**

**Social distancing (6 Feet) will be maintained in all cases.**

- e) E-commerce activities will be permitted only in respect of essential goods.
- f) Private offices can operate with upto 33% strength as per requirement, with the remaining persons working from home.
- g) All the Government offices shall function: As per the State Government Order No. DPAR 123 DBM 2020 (Part), Dated 02-05-2020 and State Government Order of even number dated 18-04-2020 and 20-04-2020 the Government Offices of essential services shall function with 100% attendance. Other than the essential services departments, the officers of Group A & B shall function with 100% attendance and Group C and D Staff shall work with 33% attendance in the jurisdiction of Bengaluru City.

5. **All other activities will be permitted activities, which are not specifically prohibited/permitted with restrictions in the various Zones, under these guidelines. However, the State, based on the assessment of the situation, and with the primary objective of keeping the spread of COVID-19 in check, may allow only select activities from out of the permitted activities, with such restrictions as felt necessary.**
6. All districts shall allow inter-state movement of goods/cargo, including empty trucks.
7. No district shall stop the movement of cargo for cross land-border trade under Treaties with neighboring countries.
8. **No separate/fresh permissions are required from authorities for activities already permitted to operate under the guidelines on Lockdown measures upto May 3, 2020. The following Standard Operating Protocols (SOPs) issued by MHA will continue to operate.**

- I. SOP on transit arrangement for foreign national(s) in India and release of quarantine persons, issued vide Order dated April 02, 2020.
- II. SOP on movement of stranded labour within States/UTs, issued vide Order dated April 19, 2020.
- III. SOP on sign-on and sign-off Indian seafarers issued vide Order dated April 21, 2020.
- IV. SOP on movement of stranded migrant workers, pilgrims, tourists, students and other persons issued vide Order dated April 29, 2020.
- V. Sop on movement of stranded migrant workers, pilgrims, tourists, students and other persons by train, issued vide Order dated May 01, 2020.

**ORDER NO: SB/INT/Prohibitory order/15/2020, DATED: 03.05.2020**

In exercise of the powers conferred u/s 144(1) Cr.P.C. I, Bhaskar Rao, IPS, Commissioner of Police and Additional District Magistrate, Bengaluru city hereby issue a prohibitory order within the limits of Bengaluru City Commissionerate as mentioned below.

Any person violating the above mentioned containment measures will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action under sec. 188 of the IPC



This prohibitory order is subjected to the orders of the State and Central Government.

If any person feels affected adversely by this order, can file a petition to modify or cancellation of this order u/s 144(5) & 144(6) to this office or the Government of Karnataka respectively.

**Subject** : **Revised Prohibitory Orders** promulgated on 22.04.2020 midnight in connection with the strict adherence to certain measures by the public as mandated by the Government of Karnataka to prevent the spread of COVID-19 (Corona Virus Disease-2019) infection.

**Preamble:**

The order of the Chief Secretary & Chairman, State Executive Committee, Karnataka State Disaster Management Authority order No. RD/158/TNR/2020, Dated: 22.04.2020 & Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India vide order No. 40/3/2020-DM-I(A), Dated: 14.04.2020 on the measures for containment of COVID-19 epidemic is as mentioned below.

**1. With the extension of the lockdown period, the following activities will continue to remain prohibited across the Bengaluru City Commissionerate till 3rd May 2020:**

- I. All domestic and international air travel of passengers, except for purposes enumerated in para 5(ix) and for security purposes.
- II. All passenger movement by trains, except for security purposes
- III. Buses for public transport
- IV. Metro rail services.
- V. Inter-district and inter-State movement of individuals except for medical reasons or for activities permitted under these guidelines.

- VI. All educational, training, coaching institutions etc. shall remain closed.
- VII. All industrial and commercial activities other than those specifically permitted under these guidelines.
- VIII. Hospitality services other than those specifically permitted under these guidelines.
- IX. Taxis (including auto rickshaws and cycle rickshaws) and services of cab aggregators.
- X. All cinema halls, malls, shopping complexes, gymnasiums, sports complexes, swimming pools, entertainment parks, theatres, bars and auditoriums, assembly halls and similar places.
- XI. All social/ political/ sports/ entertainment/ academic/cultural/religious/functions/other gatherings.
- XII. All religious places/ places of worship shall be closed for public. Religious congregations are strictly prohibited.
- XIII. In case of funerals, congregation of more than twenty persons will not be permitted.

**2. Activities prohibited in Containment Zones demarcated by Local Administrations.**

- I. Hotspots, i.e., areas of large COVID-19 outbreaks, or clusters with significant spread of COVID-19, will be determined as per the guidelines issued by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW), Government of India (GoI).
- II. In these hotspots, containment zones will be demarcated by BBMP as per the guidelines issued in circular dated 15/04/2020 by Health and Family Welfare Department.
- III. In these containment zones, the activities allowed outside the containment zones under these guidelines will not be permitted. There shall be strict perimeter control in the area of the containment zones to ensure that there is no unchecked inward/outward movement of population from these zones except for maintaining essential services (including medical emergencies and law and order related duties) and Government business continuity. The guidelines issued in this regard by MoHFW will be strictly implemented by BBMP.
- IV. If any new area is included in the category of containment zone. The activities allowed in that area till the time of its categorization as a containment zone will be suspended except for the activated permitted in containment zones.

**3. Select permitted activities allowed outside containment zone with effect from 00.00 hours of 23rd April, 2020:**

- I. To mitigate hardship to the public, select additional activities have been allowed which will come into effect from 00.00 hours of 23rd April, 2020. These limited exemptions will be operationalized by BBMP based on strict compliance to the existing guidelines. Also, before allowing these select additional activities, BBMP shall ensure that all preparatory arrangements with regard to the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for social distancing in offices, workplaces, factories and establishments, as also other sectoral requirements are in place.
- II. The consolidated revised guidelines incorporating these select permitted activities have been enumerated in paras 5-20 below.

**4. Strict enforcement of the lockdown guidelines**

- I. BBMP shall not dilute these guidelines issued under the Disaster management Act, 2005, in any manner, and shall strictly enforce the same.

**5. All health services (including AYUSH) to remain functional, such as:**

- I. Hospitals, nursing homes, clinics, telemedicine facilities.
- II. Dispensaries, chemists, pharmacies, all kinds of medicine shops including *Jan Aushadhi Kendras* and medical equipment shops.
- III. Medical laboratories and collection centres.
- IV. Pharmaceutical and medical research labs, institutions carrying out COVID-19 related research.
- V. Veterinary Hospitals, dispensaries, clinics, pathology labs, sale and supply of vaccine and medicine.
- VI. Authorised private establishments, which support the provisioning of essential services, or efforts for containment of COVID-19 including home care providers, diagnostics, supply chain firms serving hospitals.
- VII. Manufacturing units of drugs, pharmaceuticals, medical devices, medical oxygen, their packaging material, raw material and intermediates.
- VIII. Construction of medical/health infrastructure including manufacture of ambulances.

- IX. Movement (Inter and intra State, including by air) of all medical and veterinary personnel, scientists, nurses, para-medical staff, lab technicians, mid-wives and other hospital support services, including ambulances.

**6. Agricultural and related activities:**

**A. All agricultural and horticultural activities to remain fully functional, such as:**

- I. Farming Operations by farmers and farm workers in field.
- II. Agencies engaged in procurement of agriculture products, including MSP operations.
- III. *Mandis* operated by the Agriculture Produce Market Committee (APMC) or as notified by the State. Direct marketing operations by the State Government or by industry, directly from farmers/group of farmers, FPOs co-operatives etc. States may promote decentralized marketing and procurement at village level.
- IV. Shops of agriculture machinery, its spare parts (including its supply chain) and repairs to remain open.
- V. Custom Hiring Centres (CHC) related to farm machinery.
- VI. Manufacturing, distribution and retail of fertilizers, pesticides and seeds.
- VII. Movement (Inter and Intra State) of harvesting and sowing related machines like combined harvester and other agriculture/horticulture implements.
- VIII. Facilities for export/ import such as Pack houses, inspection and treatment facilities for seeds and horticulture produce.
- IX. Research Establishments dealing with the agriculture and horticulture activities.
- X. Inter and intra State movement of planting materials and honey bee colonies, honey and other beehive products.

**B. Fisheries- the following activities will be functional:**

- I. Operations of the fishing (Marine and inland)/ aquaculture industry, including feeding & maintenance, harvesting, processing, packaging, cold chain, sale and marketing.
- II. Hatcheries, feed plants, commercial aquaria.
- III. Movement of fish/shrimp and fish products, fish seed/feed and workers for all these activities.

**C. Plantations- the following activities will be functional:**

- I. Operations of tea, coffee and rubber plantations, with maximum of 50% workers.
- II. Processing, packaging, sale and marketing of tea, coffee, rubber and cashew, with maximum of 50% workers.

**D. Animal husbandry- the following activities will be functional:**

- I. Collection, processing, distribution and sale of milk and milk products by milk processing plants, including transport and supply chain.
- II. Operation of animal husbandry farms including poultry farms & hatcheries and livestock farming activity.
- III. Animal feed manufacturing and feed plants, including supply of raw material, such as maize and soya.
- IV. Operation of animal shelter homes, including Gaushalas.

**7. Financial sector: following to remain functional:**

- I. Reserve Bank of India (RBI) and RBI regulated financial markets and entities like NPCI, CCIL, payment system operators and standalone primary dealers.
- II. Bank branches and ATMs. IT vendors for banking operations, Banking Correspondents (BCs), ATM operation and cash management agencies.
  - (a) Bank branches be allowed to work as per normal working hours till disbursement of DBT cash transfers is complete.
  - (b) Local administration to provide adequate security personnel at bank branches and BCs to maintain social distancing, law and order and staggering of account holders.
- iii. SEBI, and capital and debt market services as notified by the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI)
- iv. IRDAI and insurance companies.

**8. Social sector; following to remain functional:**

- I. Operation of homes for children/disabled/mentally challenged/senior citizens/destitute/women/widows, Include bed side attendants and care givers of senior citizens residing in their homes (Home Secretary, Govt. of India letter Dated: 21.04.2020)

- II. Observation homes, after care homes and places of safety for juveniles.
- III. Disbursement of social security pensions. E.g., old age/widow/freedom fighter pensions; pension and provident fund services provided by Employees Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO).
- IV. Operation of Anganwadis- distribution of food items and nutrition once in 15 days at the doorsteps of beneficiaries, e.g., children, women and lactating mothers. Beneficiaries will not attend the Anganwadis.

**9. Online teaching/distance learning to be encouraged:**

- I. All educational, training, coaching institutions etc. shall remain closed.
- II. However, these establishments are expected to maintain the academic schedule through online teaching.
- III. Maximum use of Doordarshan (DD) and other educational channels may be made for teaching purposes.

**10. MNREGA works to be allowed:**

- I. MNREGA works are allowed with strict implementation of social distancing and face mask.
- II. Priority to be given under MNREGA to irrigation and water conservation works.
- III. Other Central and State sector schemes in irrigation and water conservation sectors may also be allowed to be implemented and suitably dovetailed with MNREGA works.

**11. Public utilities: following to remain functional:**

- I. Operations of Oil and Gas sector, including refining, transportation, distribution, storage and retail of products, e.g., petrol, diesel, kerosene, CNG, LPG, PNG etc.
- II. Generation, transmission and distribution of power at Central and State/UT levels.
- III. Postal services, including post offices.
- IV. Operations of utilities in water, sanitation and waste management sectors, at municipal/local body levels in States and UTs.
- V. Operation of utilities providing telecommunications and internet services, include recharge facilities for prepaid mobile connection (Home Secretary, Govt. of India letter Dated: 21.04.2020)

**12. Movement, loading/unloading of goods/cargo (inter and intra State) is allowed, as under:**

- I. All goods traffic will be allowed to ply including cement, steel, jelly, tiles, paint, bricks and tar.
- II. Operations of Railways: Transportation of goods and parcel trains.
- III. Operations of Airports and related facilities for air transport for cargo movement, relief and evacuation.
- IV. Operations of Seaports and Inland Container Depots (ICDs) for cargo transport, including authorized custom clearing and forwarding agents.
- V. Operations of Land Ports for cross land border transportation of essential goods, including petroleum products and LPG, food products, medical supplies.
- VI. Movement of all trucks and other goods/carrier vehicles with two drivers and one helper subject to the driver carrying a valid driving license; an empty truck/vehicle will be allowed to ply after the delivery of goods, or for pick up of goods.
- VII. Shops for truck repairs and dhabas on highways, with 20 kms distance.
- VIII. Movement of staff and contractual labour for operations of railways, airports/ air carriers, seaports/ships/vessels, landports and ICDs is allowed on passes being issued by the local authority on the basis of authorizations issued by the respective designated authority of the railways, airports, seaports, landports and ICDs.

**13. Supply of essential goods is allowed, as under:**

- I. All facilities in the supply chain of essential goods, whether involved in manufacturing and food processing units such as bread factories, milk processing plants, flour mills, Dal mills etc, located in urban areas and wholesale or retail of such goods through local stores, large brick and mortar stores or e-commerce companies should be allowed to operate, ensuring strict social distancing without any restriction on their timing of opening and closure.
- II. Shops (including Kirana and single shops selling essential goods) and carts, including ration shops (under PDS), dealing with food and groceries (for daily use), hygiene items, fruits and vegetables, dairy and milk booths, poultry, meat and fish, animal feed and fodder etc, should be allowed to operate, ensuring strict social distancing without any restriction on their timing of opening and closure.

- III. District authorities may encourage and facilitate home delivery to minimize the movement of individuals outside their homes.

**14. Commercial and private establishments, as listed below, will be allowed to operate:**

- I. Print and electronic media including broadcasting, DTH and cable services
- II. Data and call centres for Government activities only
- III. Government approved Common Service Centres (CSCs) at Gram Panchayat level.
- IV. Courier services.
- V. Cold storage and warehousing services, including at ports, airports, railway stations, container Depots, individual units and other links in the logistics chain.
- VI. Private security services and facilities management services for maintenance and upkeep of office and residential complexes.
- VII. Hotels, homestays, lodges and motels, which are accommodating tourists and persons stranded due to lockdown, medical and emergency staff, air and sea crew.
- VIII. Establishments used/ earmarked for quarantine facilities.
- IX. Services provided by self-employed persons, e.g., electrician, IT repairs, plumbers, motor mechanics and carpenters in local areas.
- X. IT and IT Enabled Services with essential minimum staff only. Rest to work from home.
- XI. Shops of Educational books for students. (MHA Order dated: 21.04.2020)
- XII. Shops of Electric Fans (MHA Order dated: 21.04.2020)

**15. Industries/Industrial Establishments (both Government and private), as listed below, will be allowed to operate:**

- I. Manufacturing units of essential goods, including drugs, pharmaceuticals, medical devices, their raw material and intermediates.
- II. Food processing industries in rural areas, i.e., outside the limits of municipal corporations and municipalities.
- III. Coal production, mines and mineral production, their transportation, supply of explosives and activities incidental to mining operations.
- IV. Manufacturing units of packaging material.

**16. Construction activities, listed as below, will be allowed to operate:**

- I. Construction of roads, irrigation projects, buildings and all kinds of industrial projects, including MSMEs, in rural areas, i.e., outside the limits of municipal corporations and municipalities and all kinds of projects in industrial estates, where workers are available on site and no workers are required to be brought in from outside (**in situ** constructions only)
- II. Metro Rail construction projects within the limits of Municipal Corporation, where workers are available on site and no workers are required to be brought in from outside (**in situ** constructions only)

**17. Movement of persons is allowed in the following cases:**

- I. Private vehicles with passes for emergency services, including medical and veterinary care.
- II. All personnel travelling with passes to place of work and back.
- III. Sign-on and sign-off Indian Seafarers at Indian Ports and their movement for the aforesaid purpose as per attached Standard Operating Protocol (SOP).
- IV. All Government vehicles and Government employees vehicles on Government Duty as directed by the State Government.

**18. Offices of the Government of India, its Autonomous/Subordinate Offices will remain open, as mentioned below.**

- I. Defence, Central Armed Police Forces, Health and Family Welfare, Disaster management and Early Warning Agencies (IMD, INCOIS, SASE and National Centre of Seismology, CWC). National Informatics Centre (NIC). Food Corporation of India (FCI), NCC, Nehru Yuva Kendras (NYKs) and Customs to function without any restriction.
- II. Other Ministries and Departments, and offices under their control, are to function with 100% attendance of Deputy Secretary and levels above that, Remaining officers and staff to attend upto 33% as per requirement.

**19. Offices of the State Governments, their Autonomous Bodies and Local Governments will remain open, as mentioned below:**

- I. Police, home guards, civil defence, fire and emergency services, disaster management, prisons and municipal services will function without any restrictions.
- II. State level officers including the secretariat and the departments providing the essential services like 1] Health & Family Welfare department 2] Medical Education Department 3] Department of Internal Affairs 4] Revenue Department 5] Rural Development & Panchayatraj Department 6] Urban Development Department 7] Food, Civil Supplies & Consumer Protection Department 8] Department of Information & Public Relations (DIPR) 9] Transport Department 10] Power Department 11] Department of Personnel & Administrative Reforms (e-Administration) 12] Finance Department including all the Treasuries in the State 13] Animal Husbandry & Fisheries Department 14] Department of Forest, Ecology & Environment 15] Department of Agricultural Products & Services 16] Agriculture Department 17] Labour Department & 18] Horticulture Departments.

Except the above mentioned departments, in the remaining all other offices the Group-A & Group-B officers of all the Government offices/Autonomous bodies/local Governments/Boards & Corporations and 33% of the Group-C & Group-D staffs can report for the duty.

- III. District administration and Treasury (including field offices of the Accountant General) will function with restricted staff. However delivery of public services shall be ensured and necessary staff will be deployed for such purpose.
- IV. Resident Commissioner of Karnataka State, New Delhi, only to the extent of coordinating COVID-19 related activities and internal kitchen operations.
- V. Forest offices: staff/ workers required to operate and maintain zoo, nurseries, wildlife, fire-fighting in forests, watering plantations, Forestry Plantation and related activities, including silviculture operations, patrolling and their necessary transport movement.

**20. Persons to remain under mandatory quarantine, as under:**

- I. All such persons who have been directed by health care personnel to remain under strict home/institutional quarantine for a period as decided by local Health Authorities.

- II. Persons violating quarantine will be liable to legal action under Section 188 of the IPC, 1860.
- III. Quarantined persons, who have arrived in India after 15.02.2020, after expiry of their quarantine period and being tested Covid-19 negative, will be released following the protocol prescribed in the SOP issued by MHA.

**21. Instructions for enforcement of above lockdown measures:**

- I. All the district magistrates shall strictly enforce the National COVID-19 directives as specified in **Annexure-1**. Penalties prescribed shall be levied and collected from all persons and entities violating these directives.
- II. All industrial and commercial establishments, work places, offices etc. shall put in place arrangements for implementation of SOP as in **Annexure II** before starting their functioning.
- III. In order to implement these containment measures, the District Magistrate will deploy Executive Magistrates as incident Commanders in each Containment Zone and in the respective local jurisdictions. The incident Commander will be responsible for the overall implementation of these measures in their respective jurisdictions. All other line department officials in the specified area will work under the directions of such incident commander. The incident Commander will issue passes for enabling essential movements as explained.
- IV. The incident Commanders will in particular ensure that all efforts for mobilization of resources. Workers and material for augmentation and expansion of hospital infrastructure shall continue without any hindrance.
- V. **Additional activities permitted in these guidelines shall be implemented after making all arrangements necessary for strict implementation of the guidelines. These will come into force with effect from 00.00 hours on 23rd April, 2020.**

2. Offices of the State/Union Territory Governments, their Autonomous Bodies, Corporations, etc. shall remain closed.

**Exceptions:**

- a) Police, home guards, civil defense, fire and emergency services, disaster management and prisons.
- b) District administration and Treasury.
- c) Electricity, water, sanitation.
- d) Municipal bodies- Only staff required for essential services like sanitation, personnel related to water supply etc.
- e) Coordinating Covid-19 related activities and internal kitchens operations.
- f) Forest offices: Staff/workers required to operate and maintain zoo, nurseries, wildlife, fire fighting in forests, watering plantations, patrolling and their necessary transport movement.
- g) Social Welfare Department, for operations of Homes for children/disables/senior citizens / women; Observation homes; pensions.
- h) Agencies engaged in procurement of agriculture products, including MSP operations.
- i) 'Mandis' operated by the Agriculture Produce Market Committee or as notified by the State Government.

*The above offices (Sl.No 1 & 2) should work with minimum number of employees. All other offices may continue to work-from-home only.*

3. Hospitals and all related medical establishments, including their manufacturing and distribution units, both in public and private sector, such as dispensaries, chemist and medical equipment shops, laboratories, clinics, nursing homes, ambulance etc, will continue to remain functional. The transportation for all medical personnel, nurses, para-medical staff, other hospital support services be permitted. Veterinary hospitals; pharmacies (including Jan Aushadhi Kendra) and Pharmaceutical research labs.
4. Commercial and private establishments shall be closed down.

**Exceptions:**

- a) Shops, including ration shops (under PDS), dealing with food, groceries, fruits and vegetables, dairy and milk booths, meat and fish, animal fodder, Bakery & Biscuit, Condiments, Confectionery & sweet for manufacturing, supply & operating retail outlets. However, district authorities may encourage and facilitate home delivery to minimize the movement of individuals outside their homes.
- b) Banks, insurance offices and ATMs. includes IT Vendor for banking operations; Banking Correspondent and ATM operation and cash management agencies.
- c) Print and electronic media
- d) Telecommunications, internet services, broadcasting and cable services. IT and IT enabled Services only (for essential services) and as far as possible to work from home.
- e) Delivery of all essential goods including food, pharmaceuticals, medical equipment through E-commerce.
- f) Petrol pumps, LPG, Petroleum and gas retail and storage outlets, shops for seeds and pesticides.
- g) Power generation, transmission and distribution units and services.
- h) Agencies engaged in procurement of agricultural products, including MSP operations.
- i) Farming operations by farmers and farm workers in the field.
- j) Manufacturing and packaging units of Fertilizers, Pesticides and Seeds.
- k) Infra and Inter-state movement of harvesting and sowing related machines like combined harvester and other agriculture/horticulture implements.
- l) Capital and debt market services as notified by the Securities and Exchange Board of India.
- m) Cold storage warehousing services.

n) Private security services.

All other establishments may work-from home only.

5. Industrial Establishments will remain closed.

**Exceptions:**

a) Manufacturing units of essential commodities.

b) Production units, which require continuous process, after obtaining required permission from the State Government.

c) Manufacturing units of essential goods, including drugs, pharmaceutical, medical devices, their raw material & intermediates.

d) Coal and mineral production, transportation, supply of explosives and activities incidental to mining operations.

e) Manufacturing units of packaging material for food items, drugs, pharmaceutical and medical devices.

The above industries/factories to strictly follow the guidelines issued by the Health department during the lockdown period.

6. All transport services- air, rail, roadways- will remain suspended.

**Exceptions:**

a) Transportation for essential goods only.

b) Fire, law and order and emergency services.

c) Operations of Railways & Airports for cargo movement, relief and evacuation and their related operational organizations.

d) Cross land border movement of essential goods including petroleum products and LPG, food products, medical supplies.

7. Hospitality Services to remain suspended.

**Exceptions:**

a) Hotels, home stays, lodges and motels, which are accommodating tourists and persons stranded due to lockdown, medical and emergency staff, and air.

b) Establishments used/earmarked for quarantine facilities.

8. All educational, training, research, coaching institutions etc. shall remain closed.

9. All places of worship shall be closed for public. No religious congregations will be permitted, without any exception.

10. All social/Political/ Sports/ entertainment/ academic/ cultural/ religious functions/ gatherings shall be barred.

11. In case of funeral, congregation of not more than twenty persons will be permitted.

All persons who have arrived into India after 15.02.2020, and all such persons who have been directed by health care personnel to remain under strict home/ institutional quarantine for a period as decided by local Health Authorities, failing which they will be liable to legal action under Sec. 188 of the IPC.

Wherever exceptions to above containment measures have been allowed, the organizations/employers must ensure necessary precautions against COVID-19 virus, as well as social distance measures, as advised by the Health Department from time to time.

All enforcing authorities to note that these strict restrictions fundamentally relate to movement of people, but not to that of essential goods.

Any person violating these containment measures will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action under sec. 188 of the IPC



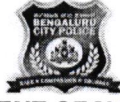

**Preamble:**

There was an order promulgated on 23.03.2020 in connection with an increase in the spread of Corona Virus-2019 (COVID-19) in Bengaluru City, it is imperative to take stringent measures to contain the spread of the disease.

In continuation, it is necessary to **Addendum the order to elaborate** the list of exempted essential services as mentioned in the Government of Karnataka Order No. HFW/54/CGM/2020, Dated: 23.03.2020.

**ORDER NO: SB/INT/Prohibitory order/10(A)/2020, DATED: 24.03.2020**

In exercise of the powers conferred u/s 144(1) Cr.P.C. I, Bhaskar Rao, IPS, Commissioner of Police and Additional District Magistrate, Bengaluru city hereby issue a prohibitory order with in the limits of Bengaluru City Commissionerate on **midnight 12-00 A.M of 23.03.2020 to midnight 12.00 A.M. of 31.03.2020** as mentioned below.

- Gathering of more than 5 persons shall be prohibited in public places.
- All shops, Commercial establishments, Offices, workshops, godowns etc. shall close their operations.
- All industries and factories except those dealing with essential goods and services, food, medical equipment, drugs, fuel, agricultural inputs etc. shall remain closed.
- All home quarantined persons shall remain at home.

- All the religious prayers/ceremonies/festivals/cultural events and the distribution of mass food and prasadam shall be stopped.
- All I.T. & B.T units should ensure their employees to work from home.
- Plying of private vehicles shall be permitted only for procuring essential commodities.
- All Ola, Uber, Taxies, Autorikshaw and other hired services shall not be permitted for passenger transport except for procuring essential commodities and medical emergencies.
- Bengaluru City borders with neighboring districts shall remain closed for any incoming passenger traffic.
- Cinema Theatres, Malls, Marriage halls, Pubs, Night clubs, Dramas, Exhibition, musical festivals and other entertainment programmes, etc., shall be cancelled.
- Schools, Colleges, Universities and Coaching classes shall be closed.
- Swimming pools, Gyms and other sports centers shall be closed.
- Major sports events being held in stadiums like Cricket, Football, Hockey and other sports activities shall be cancelled.
- All Summer Camps, Meetings, Workshops including International Conference shall be cancelled.
- Bar and Restaurants, wineshops, Retail M.R.P. Shops or any other liquor supply shops shall be closed.
- Social distancing shall be mandatorily followed.

**The following essential services mentioned in the Karnataka Government Order No. HFW/54/CGM/2020, Dated: 23.03.2020 shall be exempted.**


- Food, ration shops, milk, vegetables, groceries, meat, fish, fruit, wholesale and retail markets and shops.
- Petrol Bunks, gas, LPG, oil agencies and related godowns
- Transport of all goods.
- Hospitals, clinics, pharmacies, optical stores, diagnostic centres and other health and medical related shops, establishments, godowns, factories

- Police & Fire Services
- ULBs & Panchayati Raj institutions offices, postal services
- Government offices dealing with essential services as notified by Government.
- Electricity, Water & Municipal services
- Bank teller services, ATMs, Telecom, internet, cable services
- E Commerce/home delivery from the restaurants
- Canteen services provided by Government & Local bodies
- Print and electronic media
- Security services including private security services
- Drinking water production, supply and distribution in bulk and in containers.
- Bus Stations, Railway Station, Aripports and allied services.
- Transport of passengers to and from Hospitals, railway stations, bus stations, Airports.
- Private establishments required for efforts to contain COVID-19 including for production of drugs, masks, PPEs etc.
- Production and manufacturing units which are in continuous process mode

**If the order is breached, the concerned will be dealt with serious legal action.** If any person feels affected adversely by this order, can file a petition to modify or cancellation of this order u/s 144(5) & 144(6) to this office or the Government of Karnataka respectively.
