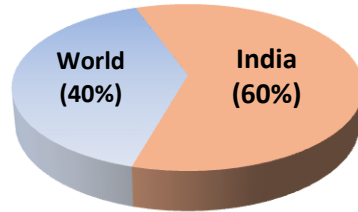

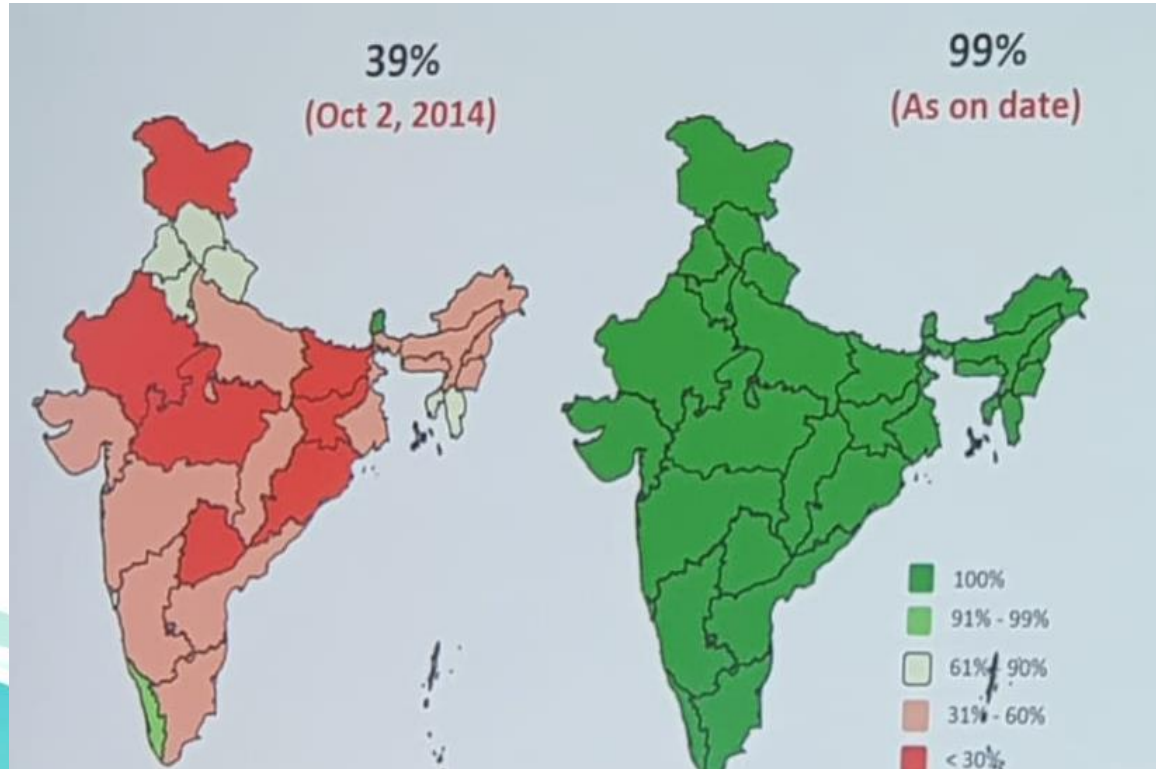

7. **Swachha Shukravaram:** Initiated the Swachha Shukravaram campaign for door to door awareness on sanitation, Friday in the District.

Manufacture Biodegradable Sanitary Pads

Hyderabad: The success story of the Government of Andhra Pradesh in making Peddapalli the overall best District Swachh Sarva Shiksha award in the country.

As wearing a sanitary napkin is a taboo, self-help groups came forward and set up their own brand of non-plastic, biodegradable sanitary napkins under the name Sabala. They have their own manufacturing unit and go door to door to women in all villages, distributing the sanitary napkins.

A pre-survey done by district authorities found that 65 per cent of women between the ages of 18 and 40 years were using cloth pads during periods. But with the introduction of Sabala, things have changed. TOI visited one of

the unimproved self-help groups in Shamangiri in Peddapalli on Thursday when the Hyderabad women's manufacturing unit of Peddapalli formed a community interest group. The group got ₹25 lakh

from the PrIME Mission Employment Guarantee Programme and got individual contributions of ₹50,000 each, amounting to a total of ₹40 lakh. They got a Chaitanya Zyco with Zilla Samithya loan of ₹5

lakh, bringing the total investment to ₹40 lakh. Since its inauguration in September 2011 it has made 1,200 packs of napkins and is making around 8,000 packs every month. The regular size are sold at ₹9 a pack and the extra large pads are sold at ₹6 for a pack.

S. Suresh, president of Sportsarth society told TOI: "Continuous use of plastic sanitary napkins results in several health issues. Till now in the villages, people use cloth pads instead of sanitary napkins. They don't dry them openly, leaving women to see it. They don't even throw the cloths on as they believe that if someone walks over them, it will bring the person ill luck. With the help of district administration, we brought machinery from Uttar Pradesh and set up this unit. Around 20 women work here, and we make sanitary pads under strict conditions."

Hyderabad-based Lucid Laboratories Pvt Ltd's last report on the padball that is seen observed after the napkin had absorbed 20 ml of coloured water. In a biodegradable use, the pad disintegrated in water within 15 minutes.

Women Development Mutual Aided Co-operative Society from Peddapalli. The unit is located in Shant Nagar near Peddapalli town. The group got 25 lakh

lakh, bringing the total initial investment in the lab. Since its inauguration in September 2018 it has made 1000 pieces of napkins a day making around 60,000 packs every month. The regular size are sold at 100 a pack and the extra large pads are sold at 120 a pack.

G. Sivaprasad, president of sports secretary said "The continuous use of plastic sanitary napkins results in serious health issues. Till today in the villages, people use cloths pads instead of sanitary napkins. They don't dry them properly. Many women will see it. They don't even throw the cloths out so they believe that if someone walks over them, it will bring the person ill back. With the help of district administration, we brought machinery from Uttar Pradesh and set up this unit. Around to women work here, and we make sanitary pads under the brand name Sabda."

Hyderabad-based Laxmi Enterprises Pvt Ltd's last report on the padwomen that no state observed after the padwomen had observed 90 per cent of women to be satisfied with the use of biodegradable pads. They get 25 lakh rupees to list, the pad distributed in better within a village.
