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



#### **Challenges**

- •Still not sufficient for widows with children
- •Lack of complete awareness among villagers

#### **Proposed Plan**

- •Spread awareness among the villagers about the scheme
- Awareness about the efficient use of funds



## Institutional Deliveries and Maternal Mortality



#### **Status**

- •One Health Subcenter in the village
- •Nearest Primary Health Centre in the Mandal HQ at GEESUGONDA (10 mins)
- •Ambulance is available and is availed by villagers
- •ANM (Auxiliary Nursing Midwifery) visits the village every week



- •100% Institutional Deliveries in the Primary Health Centre
- No cases of maternal mortality reported during last one year



# Institutional Deliveries and Maternal Mortality

#### **Challenges**

- •Room for ANM was newly constructed and without any equipment
- •No Medical Store in the village

#### **Proposed Plan**

- •An initiative to set up Primary Health Centre in the village
- Providing ANM with the required equipment





## Status

- One English medium private convent school which is affiliated to the Telangana board
- •No dropouts till 10th class
- •25 teachers are there
- Average class size is 30 to 35 students
- •Computer lab with 14 computers
- Functional Library
- Scholarship availability
- •0% child labour (as all are going to school)
- •100% literacy (age between 15 to 50 years)









#### **Challenges**

- No government school
- •No school for class 11th and 12th in the village

#### **Proposed Plan**

Setting up a government school till class 12th

- •Used for: Purchasing livestock, Financing education of children, Supporting agriculture

•100% SHG loan recovery





## Self Help Groups

#### **Challenges**

- •Lack of dedicated economic activity linked to the SHG Loan
- Money used to support already existing household activities

#### **Proposed Plan**

- •Skill programs for the women so that they can learn new economic activities
- Money taken as SHG loan utilized for these dedicated economic activities
- •Will prove to be more profitable and leave a larger share of income with the women to support their families

- Pucca Road Tax
- •Professional Tax (Assam, Bihar, Himachal Pradesh, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh and Punjab)
- •Entertainment tax (Assam, Gujarat, Kerala, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh and Tamil Nadu)
- User charges for public services (street lights)

- 8. Distribution of 2 dustbins to every household by gram panchayat.









- Non availability of community dustbins.

- Closed drainage system and proper sewage system.
- Community dustbins should be made available

#### Key Issues and Challenges-

- People are using hearth to boil water instead of using LPG
- Single use Plastic is not fully banned in the village
- Harmful fertilizers and pesticides are used by farmers


#### Proposed Improvements –

- Reduce use of Synthetic Fertilizers and use of prescribed dosage of green manures, vermicomposting, tank silt










## Agriculture

#### **Current Status...**

- Agriculture is the main occupation in the village
- Major Crops:- Cotton, Paddy, Turmeric, Maize, Vegetables
- •Under Rythu Bandhu, Rs. 5000 insurance is provided to farmers
- PM Fasal Bima Yojana for crop insurance during Rabi Season is available
- No Soil Health with the farmers
- Subsidies for seeds and Urea is provided to farmers
- Agricultural produce is sold to private buyers.
- •Irrigation Source: Ponds , Rain ,Borewell.
- •Under Haritha Haram, HORTICULTURE is being promoted and 32129 homestate fruits and flowers are planted






## Agriculture....

#### Key Issues and Challenges..

- 1. Proper Procurement of produce was not there.
- 2. Delay in payment when sold at MSP.
- 3. Small Landholdings.
- 4. No awareness about soil health card
- 5. Problems with crop insurance scheme
- 6. No awareness about Kisan Help Line.
- 7. Few instances of Farmer suicide.
- 8.70-80% of the farmers are small and marginal farmers






## Agriculture....

- 5. Decrease dependence on agriculture.






### MGNREGA...

- Sarpanch was interactive

#### **Key Issues and Challenges**

- •No proper functional grievance redressal system but Sarpanch was interactive with people
- Lack of infrastructure for some Government Institutions

#### **Proposed Improvements**

- 1. Proper functional grievance redressal system should be there
- 2. Digitalisation should be promoted
- 3. Proper library, proper computer labs should be constructed
