- Suspension due to grounds other than corruption shall be for ONE year
- ✓ Grounds of corruption-TWO years
- Beyond the Aperiods of One/Two yrs can be done on basis of recommendations of Review Committee
- When suspended and after inquiry is dismissed and the dismissal order is set aside by court, the suspension period will continue
- When suspended for initiation of disc. Procdgs., suspension shall be for period not exceeding 60 days and can be extended for period not exceeding 120days
- When a suspended employee dies, the period of suspension shall be treated as on duty
- When suspended and later acquitted in courts on merits of the case, suspension period may be treated as on duty

- When suspended but la ter acquitted in a court on grounds of not on merits, suspension period need not be treated as on duty
- During suspension period subsistence allowance @ 50% will be given
- ✓ After 3 months it can be enhanced.
- Non employment certificate to be submitted each month
- Penalties-2 types- Minor & Major-Rule 6
- Minor penalties-5
