#### **Community engagement strategies**

- Two prong strategy: Facilitating rapid development of remote backward area on one hand and stern action against those indulging in violence with participation of community
- Broken window theory
- Sweat more in peace for ensuing community partnership

- WHAM Strategy "Go to the people, live with them, learn from them, plan with them, built with what they have & built what they want."
- CAMP model of community policing
- Consultation: The community is consulted on a regular basis to know and enumerate all their felt needs and they are actively encouraged to suggest all possible legally acceptable solutions.

- Adaptation: means changing or devising new policing methods and adopting appropriate legal procedures for solving the local problems.
- Mobilization: Once the felt needs of the community and their solutions are identified, necessary manpower, material and financial resources are mobilized for implementing the solution
- Problem Solving: After the resources are mobilized, the actual work of solving the problem is launched and completed.

#### **Sir Robert Peel's Nine Points of policing**

- The basic mission for which the <u>police</u> exist is to prevent crime and disorder.
- The ability of <u>the police</u> to perform their duties is dependent upon public approval of police actions.
- Police must secure the willing co-operation of the public in voluntary observance of the law to be able to secure and maintain the respect of the public.

#### Contd....

- The degree of co-operation of the public that can be secured diminishes proportionately to the necessity of the use of physical force.
- Police should demonstrate absolute impartial service to the law.
- Police should always direct their action strictly towards their functions and never appear to usurp the powers of the judiciary.

#### **Robert Peel**

- Police use physical force to the extent necessary to secure observance of the law or to restore order only when the exercise of persuasion, advice and warning is found to be insufficient.
- Police, at all times, should maintain a relationship with the public that gives reality to the historic tradition that the police are the public and the public are the police;

- the police being only members of the public who are paid to give full-time attention to duties which are incumbent on every citizen in the interests of community welfare and existence.
- The test of police efficiency is the absence of crime and disorder, not the visible evidence of police action in dealing with it





#### Situation prior to Police mekosam in Adilabad District

- 1970 Lachu Patel was beheaded at public place- praja court
- 1978- Tapalpur killing of a land lord Pitambarrao
- 20th April,1981- Indraveli police firing-
- 200 police personnel & civilians lost their life in Naxal violence ..
- Property worth Rs.50 Crores were destroyed
- Rs.100 crores were extorted at gun point from civilians.

## Reasons for taking up tribal areas for community policing activities

- 46% forest cover & more than 20% population is tribal, most of whom are Gonds.
- A complete lack of trust in the govt. institutions.
- Naxal movement primarily targeted the tribals and became strong in tribal areas.
- Formation of people's guerilla army (2<sup>nd</sup>
  December 2000), Guerrilla base in forest areas
  of Mangi & Aipet in the tribal belt
- Exploiting innocent tribal youths as Militant, Sympathisers, Couriers and then recruiting them in to Dalams. Sending them far away to Chattisgadh DK area.

#### CHANGE IN ROLE OF POLICE

- Interface with community -police launched police mekosam (police for you) gram sabhas in 1200 villages (900 tribal hamlets). to give empathic listening ,to ventilate their feelings & to identify felt needs of people.
- Community orientation led to attitudinal changes in police force respecting tribal customs and sentiments like greeting tribals with Ram Ram and removing shoes and chappals while entering in to their houses.
- Discussion on balance sheet in gramsabhas
- Felt needs identification.-Health, Education, Communication, water, Governance. Absence of Grassroots' level administrative machinery-Teachers, Doctors absence even after 50 years of Independence.

#### Police- as facilitators

- GOOD GOVERNANCE
- Action against erring Government officers like Teachers and Doctors
- Health -organized 113 mega health camps in remote villages along with 1000 cataract operations to give new vision. More than 1,00,000 people benefited. Use of Police cultural troupes, appeal for surrenders to UG cadres by their parents
- During Police mekosam Health camp in Boath area, 6 minors & 3 Adult Heart patients were identified and operated at Care Hospital, Hyderabad

#### Police as facilitators contd.

- Platform for emphatic listening of problems. - Restarted Kesalapur darbar from 2001, organizing Komram Bhim Anniversary at Utnoor from 2002 & raicenters annual meeting for providing them a platform
- 4000 cattle cured in 5 veterinary camps
- Took up interventions to solve various problems of remote tribal villages: Drinking water (Dedra), Electricity (Chorpally), RTC buses in affected villages.

#### **PSYOPS**

- WHAM STRATEGY
- History sheets of sympathizers & presently not active naxalites were dropped to win over the community support in a novel programme called 'Parivartan'. Sufferings of tribals due to weekly attendance stopped.
- Adnyatam Swechcha-Surrender and rehabilitation melas

- To keep them away from the influence of Extremists: Vocational trainings, Pre Army & Pre Police Recruitment training programmes etc. were started in collaboration of District Administration.





#### District Police of Adilabad Government of Andhrapradesh, India

The Adilabad district provided a perfect setting for terrorist groups to threaten citizens, and the terrorists murdered more than 300 people, including 100 police officers. The district police decided to engage villagers in preventing these strong-arm tactics and held several community meetings. Through this forum, they determined that one of the main problems was the need for a road to nearby towns to decrease isolation and enable villagers to have more freedom — economically and socially. The open discussions resulted in a joint front to isolate terrorist threats while building a road to better the community. Approximately 140 of the 170 terrorists surrendered, and hundreds of villagers openly refused entry to extremists.

#### 2004 Homeland Security Honorees

This year the Community Policing committee created a Homeland Security category to acknowledge the efforts of honorees that demonstrated how community policing philosophy and practices are integral in terrorism prevention and response. Through involvement, awareness and action, agencies and communities moved another step closer to winning the war on terror.

#### **ENFORCEMENT**

#### 'AN OUNCE OF PREVENTION IS WORTH A POUND OF CURE'

- O Frequent raids on prostitution dens. Arrest of organizers, procurers, brothel keepers and pimps under Immoral Traffic Prevention Act & other IPC sections. Rescue of victims of trafficking.
- O History sheets/suspect sheets of traffickers are opened for surveillance.
- From 19/04/2005 to 8/10/2006 100 cases are registered under sections of ITP Act & IPC (366a, 372, 773, 376 sections)) against traffickers are pending trials in court.
- O Magistrates have served notices to trafficking organizers for closure of brothels.

## REHABILITATION & EMPOWERMENT OF VICTIMS OF ORGANIZED TRAFFICKING

- Child and Police (CAP)/SARIQ project launched. 70 victims are being employed after a three months training in customer relation & marketing, Information technology, White goods servicing & soft skills with 100% employment guarantee
- The govt. of Andhra Pradesh and world bank sponsored Velgu project facilitated organizing four self help groups consisting of 26 women members from Dommara community.

### REHABILITATION & EMPOWERMENT OF VICTIMS OF ORGANIZED TRAFFICKING

 District Collector also launched a training programme organized under Indira Kranti Pathakam scheme and the District rural development agency (DRDA). The members were given training for two months to make Agarbattis (incense sticks), plates and bowls of dry leaves, baskets and were also imparted training to learn tailoring at Yadgirigutta in order to provide them with the alternative sources of livelihood. District Collector made Rs. 3.5 Lakhs available as micro finance to these groups to start their activities.

#### **REHABILITATION & EMPOWERMENT**

 Two girls have been appointed as Home Guards with police department otherwise they could have been dragged into hereditary profession of prostitution.

 One month training related to security of vital instalations was imparted by police to 12 youth from Dommara community, who are the children of trafficking victims & traffickers from Dommara community. These young men have now been employed as security guards for the security of Yadgirigutta temple.

- OBut for this intervention, these men would have been indulging in organizing trafficking activities acting as pimps, procurers etc.
- OUnder "Vimukthi" programme that was by the police department, two girls were rescued from the clutches of the organizers of the brothel houses. they have been rehabilitated in Hyderabad
- OThe Mandal revenue officer, Yadagirigutta has issued 50 cards to the families of the Dommara community under Antyodaya (AAY) scheme on request of the police department.

#### **EDUCATION TO CHILDREN OF SEX WORKERS**

- O Prevention of 2<sup>nd</sup>
  generation prostitution
  providing free education
  to children by joining
  them in schools so that
  at least next generation

- O A residential bridge school started at yadgirigutta up to 5th standard with the help of Indian red cross Nalgonda district. 64 children are facilitated and admitted into regular schools.



#### Schools for kids of brick kiln workers

CITY BUREAU Hyderabad

Several hundreds of miles away from their homes, nearly 400 children from Odisha whose parents work in brick kilns here, can now get enrolled at schools where they will be tutored in Oriya language. The Rachakonda police, along with the local district administration, are opening two schools for the children. Close to 370 children were rescued by the police along with the district administration last month.

"All the children had come along with their parents to work in brick kilns. We have counseled the parents and asked them to enroll their children at the school where they will be taught in Oriya language," said Mahesh M Bhagwat,

Commissioner of Rachakonda. One school was opened on Saturday at Chikatimamidi village in Bommalaramaram mandal of Bhuvangir district. Around 170 children are enrolled at the school. One more school will be opened at Chotuppal or another 200 children were rescued from brick kilns.

The district administration is providing accommodation, food and other articles like slates, chalks and books. Two teachers familiar with Oriya language are now teaching them. "We wanted the children to study in Oriya so that they continue their education when they go back to their native places after six months or so. Again when they are here, they will continue their education," Bhagwat told Telangana Today.

Another eight teachers will join the schools in the next few days. "I had personally contacted a local NGO in Odisha and they arranged the teachers. The teachers will be paid salaries by the district administration," he said.

The owners of brick kilns, too have come forward to support the education of the children. They are contributing whatever possible in the form of books and clothes to the children.

STATING that a lot of awareness needs to be created among public with respect to safety of women, senior IPS officer and director of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel National Police Academy (SVP NPA) Aruna M Bahuguna appealed to women victims to come forward in lodging complaints.

Aruna Bahuguna was the chief guest at an event to commemorate completion of six months of the Rachakonda Commissionerate SHE teams, held at LB Nagar on Friday. Speaking on the occasion, he said that SHE teams help the women by providing safety

and secure measures. If any woman is facing harassment from miscreants, they can come forward in lodging complaint with the police to sought justice and to punish such miscreants. The NPA director launched the SHE teams Logo on the occasion.

The Telangana State Crime Investigation Department (CID) Inspector General (IG) Sowmya Mishra, who launched the facebook page of SHE team of Rachakonda police, said that the state government introduced SHE teams for providing safety of women in the state.

With SHE teams working perfectly by taking stern action

against miscreants, it would help in reducing the crime against women.

The Rachakonda Police Commissioner Mahesh M Bhagayat said that around 600 cases have been registered in last six months and it was revealed that most of the eve-teasing cases are found in colleges and schools.

"Rachakonda SHE teams are all set to start a programme "SHE for HER" in which two students will be selected from each college and will be trained by SHE teams to fight against the eve-teasing crimes in colleges. It will help us in preventing the offences of crime against women," Mahesh M Bhagavat felt.
