





- They are meeting once in a month.





- ➤ Tentative Date for foundation stone 27 July 2019


Various Govt. Schemes

- > Transport facility for pregnant woman before and after delivery
- 5. Aasara Pension Scheme –
- ➤ For Bidi Worker, HIV Patients, Old Person, Toddy Tappers, Disabled Persons, Widows and Weavers.


7. Harita Haram –


