

EDUCATION

> The village has achieved 100% literacy rate in 2004

> In general there is more girl students in the school than boy students.

> The School is managed under the management of School Protection committee formed under the Gram Panchayat.

EDUCATION (CONT.)

- Mid Day Meal Scheme in school is properly functioning.
- Balanced diet consisting of all macro nutrients was provided to students.
- > Our team even had the Mid Day Meal.





- Apart from above mentioned govt. school, two private schools are also located within 1.5 km distance.
- For higher education students tend to move towards city.

ANGANWADI

- Village has one Anganwadi working in school campus.
- >Anganwadi caters to Kids, Pregnant and Lactating women. At the time of our visit 19 Children were registered visiting Anganwadi every day.
- Lactating and Pregnant women have been given 2 eggs on Wednesday and Sunday. They also receive 200 ml of milk every day.





GRAM SABHA

- Gram Sabha is working well.
- We witnessed one Gram Sabha meeting where almost 50-60 people participated. Topic of discussion was knowledge sharing about various govt. schemes.
- Ex-Sarpanch Rajamouli has contributed a lot for village development.



SELF HELP GROUP

- There 25 SHGs with 323 members.
- Main function of these SHGs was to provide interest free credit facilities for entrepreneur purposes upto the tune of 5 lakh.
- NOTE:- One stop centers were not available in village.

HEALTH

Village does not have a Primary Health Centre

But there is one PHC at the Mandal level which caters to medical needs of the 42 nearby villages including Gangadevipally village (60000 persons).

> The PHC has two doctors, 1 Pharmacist and 1 Nurse.

No. of beds – 6 (Approx. 50 to 60 patient visit daily)
No emergency ward





>From time to time the PHC goes to schools of nearby village to conduct checkup.

>Vaccination is provided every Wednesday and Saturday on biweekly basis (through Anganwadis)

>PHC have sufficient store of medicines

HEALTH

- >The PHC has the facility of conducting Normal Delivery only. There is Radiant Heat Warmer facility also.
- Facility of Conducting Vasectomy and Tubectomy available (250 case/year).
- Common health issues reported:
- Snake bite (Cobra, Krait), Pesticide poisoning
- o Dog bite- 300+
- Monkey bite 400+
- o Dengue cases 26
- o Malaria Nil
- Tuberculosis 68 (DOTS)
- o Leprosy -4
- NCD- Cancer, Diabetes, Hypertension





WATER

- > There is a water treatment plant in the village with capacity of 4000 L which is the source of drinking water for the village.
- Each household is provided 20 L of water per day at the price of Rs 1 per day.
- > The village has two big water tanks of capacity of around 2 lakh liter each to supply water. A onetime amount of Rs. 6500/- collected for each tap connection.
- > Water in these tanks is filled through a bore well by 7.5 HP pump set that is totally run by Solar Power.





Piped water supply and this water treatment plant is installed by the efforts of NGO Bala Vikas and Mission Bhagiratha.



AGRICULTURE AND VILLAGE ECONOMY

- Vegetables are supplied to nearby districts like Khammam, Karimnagar and also to Nagpur (Maharashtra).
- Cotton is taken to mills located in Warangal city. Farmers generally prefer to sell cotton to private industries rather then selling it at MSP.

AGRICULTURE AND VILLAGE ECONOMY

> Most of the milk is sold at Warangal city.

Mainly bullock carts are used for farming, Use of tractors is limited.

>Andhra bank and farmer service cooperative society are the main credit facilitators in the area. In general farmers don't have credit cards.

OBSERVATIONS

>Poor Pupil Teacher Ratio (PTR) in Primary school.

- >No Upper Higher Secondary School in village
- >Gender differentiation in general was absent. Single girl child is welcomed.
- >One stop centre is not available in village
- >Unable to tap subsidised credit facility for MSME
- Poor implementation of Central Govt scheme in particular Indira Awaas Yojana (Pradhan Mantri Gramin Awaas Yojana)
- >People were more aware about central and state govt schemes
- Groundwater level is depleting.
- Productivity of cotton has declined over a decade due to persistent usage of BT cotton
