


Laxmipuram TimeLine




RESOURCE MAP + SOCIAL MAP


Demography of Laxmipuram















Agricultural Land Use Profile

Agricultural Economic Activities

- Chilli is one of the most important crop in the village. The "Teja" chilli is grown and is one of the hottest chillis in India.
- Cotton is another major cash crop grown in most land under cultivation area. It is supplemented by a ginning factory in the village itself.
- Maize is third major crop and is largest job provider in the agriculture sector.
- Paddy & sugarcane also plays a major role in agricultral economic activities evident by rice mill & sugar factory nearby.



Saturday, 14" April 2018

Social Justice Day (Samajik Nyaya Diwas)

The birth anniversary of Bharat Ratna Dr. B.R. Ambedkar will be celebrated as Social Justice Day. The nature of commemorative celebrations would be National and District level. Hon'ble Prime Minister will address the nation LIVE on this day. The event will be organised by Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment,

Wednesday, 18" April 2018

Swachch Bharat Day (Swachch Bharat Diwas)

On this day, Cleanliness movement will be celebrated in all Gram Panchayats especially whose which are not ODF. Efforts will be made to hasten the process of making these Gram Panchayats ODF. The process of ODF PLUS will be fast tracked. The event will be organised by Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation.

Friday, 20" April 2018

On this day, the beneficiaries of Ugwala Yojana will be distributed LPG gas cylinder during a District Level Functions. The Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas will organise LPG Panchayat meetings to sensitise the Ujjwala beneficiaries regarding safety and utility of LPG, health benefits of using clean fuels, etc.

Tuesday, 24° April 2018

National Panchayati Raj Day (Panchayati Raj Diwas)

On this day, a National level event to commemorate the National Panchayati Raj Day will be organised. Gram Panchayat will be requested to organise Special Gram Sabhas to discuss important social issues viz. Immunisation and Health Women Empowerment, Social Development, etc. Efforts will be made by the Ministry of Panchayati Raj to reach out to rural population in campaign mode with programmes focussed on their economic and social development. Hon'ble Prime Minister will address all the Gram Sabhas of the country LIVE.

Saturday, 28° April 2018

Gram Swaraj Day (Gram Swaraj Diwas)

On this day, the beneficiaries will be distributed the entitlements of important schemes viz. Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojana, Pradhan Mantri Sobhagya Yojana, etc. Various District level programmes will be organised for distribution of benefits to the beneficiaries. The event will be organised by Ministry of Rural Development.

Monday, 30" April 2018

Swasth Bharat Diwas or Ayushmaan Bharat Diwas

During this event, the information regarding Medical Insurance/Ayushmaan Bharat scheme will be imparted to the beneficiaries during Health Camps organised in the rural areas. The event will be organised by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare

Wednesday, 02" May 2018

Farmers Welfare Day (Kisan Kalyaan Diwas)

On this day, awareness campaign and training programmes at Gram Panchayat level will be organised in order to disseminate information regarding interventions for doubling the income of farmers by 2022. The event will be organised by Ministry of Apriculture and Farmers Welfare.

Saturday, 05" May 2018

Anleevika Diwas or Kaushal Vikaas Diwas (Swa-Sahayata Samooh Sammelan)

Various District level programmes of Self Help Groups - (Swa-Sahayata Samooh Sammelan) will be organised. On this day Hon ble Prime Minister will address the nation. The event will be organised by Ministry of Rural Development.

MGNREGS

- A total of 21 groups/ batches, each consisting of 10-15 labours.
- Main beneficiaries of the scheme were women.
- Minimum age 18years to enroll in MGNREGS and no upper limit of age.





WAGE COMPONENT

- Minimum wage of ₹ 105 was guaranteed under the scheme in Laxmipuram.
- 50% wage compensation in case of sickness.
- ₹ 50,000 cover in case of death of the labourer.
- Fully covered medical treatment in case of accidents onsitu.
- ₹ 5 were given to labours who were using baskets, ₹ 10 to labours using crowbars and ₹ 5 extra to labours who bring their own water with them.










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
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
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


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MGNREGA Attendance Sheet

MGNREGA MONITORING TECHNIQUES








Age Group 14 and above

Health sector





Aanganwadi Centre

- 1. 7 month 3 years kids are provided with Balamrutham food packets of 2.5 kg per month.
- 2. There are 15 pregnant women under the care of this institution
- 3. There are 27 kids under the care of this institution (17 boys + 10 girls)
- 4. There are two workers One aanganwadi worker and one teacher (they work alternatively for 15 days each.)
- 5. Infrastructure & rice quality needs improvement.

Health Sector (Contd..)

- 1 ANM for 4 GPs incl. Laxmipuram GP assisted by one ASHA worker in each GP
- The village had 3 Rural Medical Practitioners (RMP) –
 Raju, Vijay, Ramesh.
- KCR kit Scheme 18 member benefitted out of 21 members (Mrs. R Purna)
- No sub health centres (SHCs)
- Plus debriefing with the DM, it was informed that how the SHC is loosing its importance in the modern care centres, it is only used for OPD purposes. SHCs are to be converted into wellness centres.
- Dial 104 for mobile vans in case of medical emergencies.
 They conduct tests, distribute medicine every fourth
 Wednesday of the month.

Health Sector (Contd..)

National Health Mission & Mission Indradhanush

- National Health Mission is already been implemented in the village.
- Under Mission Indradhanush, they are only covering the left out & drop outs.
- Except Pneumonia other 11 diseases are covered in the scheme.

Banking & Government Institutions (Contd..)

SELF HELP GROUPS (SHGs)

- There are currently 32 SHGs in the Village, each consisting of about 15-20 members.
- The members include only females & physically disabled people.
- Started with BPL, after 2002 all joined.
- There is one Community Coordinator for 5 GPs. The role CC is provide project funds & ensure implementation of the funds.
- From 2012, Shreenidhi Co-operative Scheme was launched
 - General Loans Rs. 25,000 only for 1-6 members
 - Micro Loans Rs. 50,000 for shop
 - Tiny Loans Rs. 1,00,000 per person

 As seen from the video, other people are often discouraged to implement these schemes because of the delays in benefit transfers to beneficiaries.

Suggestion:

When conveyed the same to DM, we got to learn about the delayed funding to the district under MGNREGS. So we suggest there can be monetary transfers in phases to the beneficiaries.

Other grievances include:

When talked with other households also we came across the lack

of awareness about the schemes.

Lack of awareness campaigns in the village.

Suggestions

- There should be speed breakers on the village main road specially near the school.
- School need better infrastructure like more benches, better colouring, etc for lively environment in classrooms.
- Aanganwadi need playing equipment like swings, toys, and compound should be children friendly, quality of rice should be changed.
- Elders of the village expressed the need for a public library, Gymnasium and sports amenities especially for the youth.
