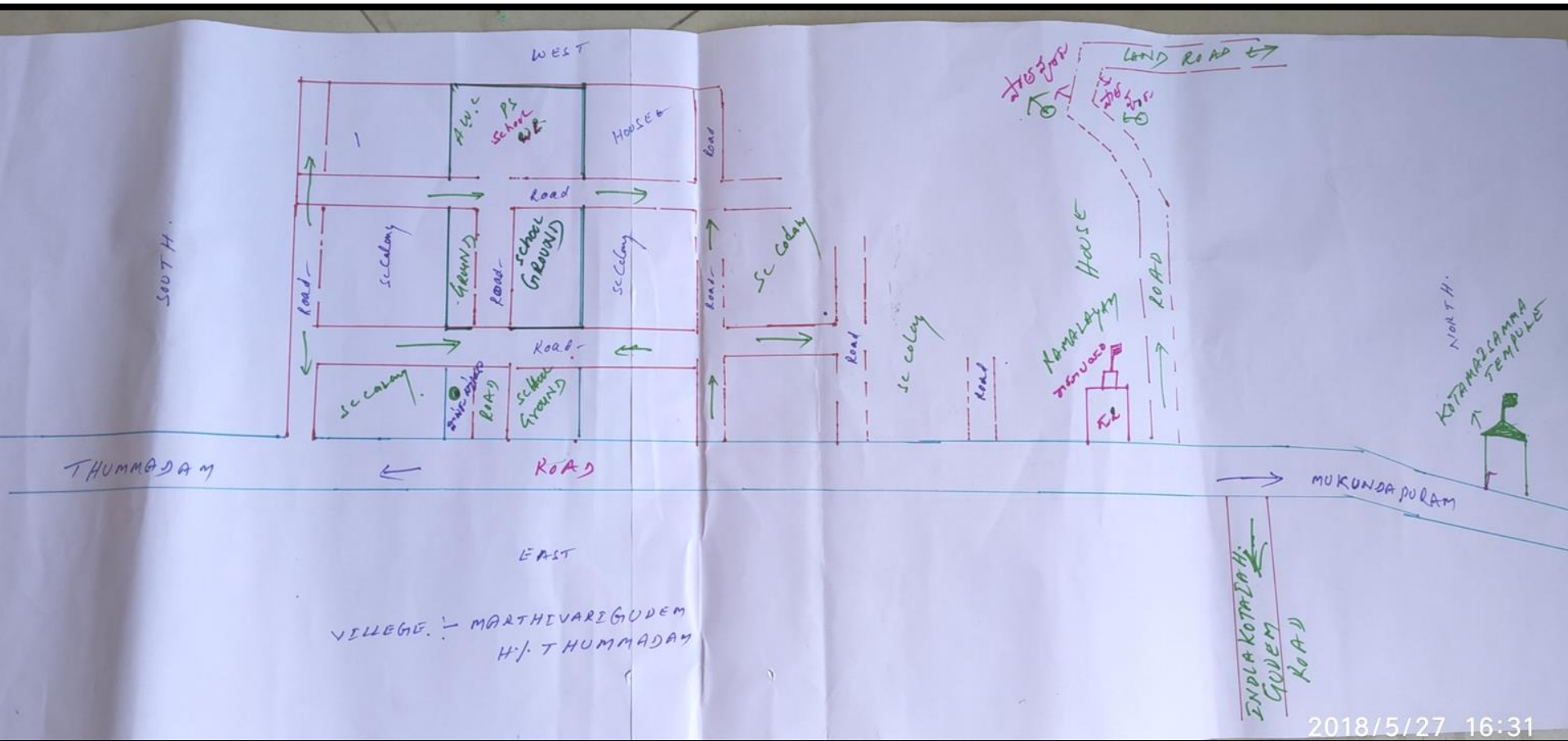

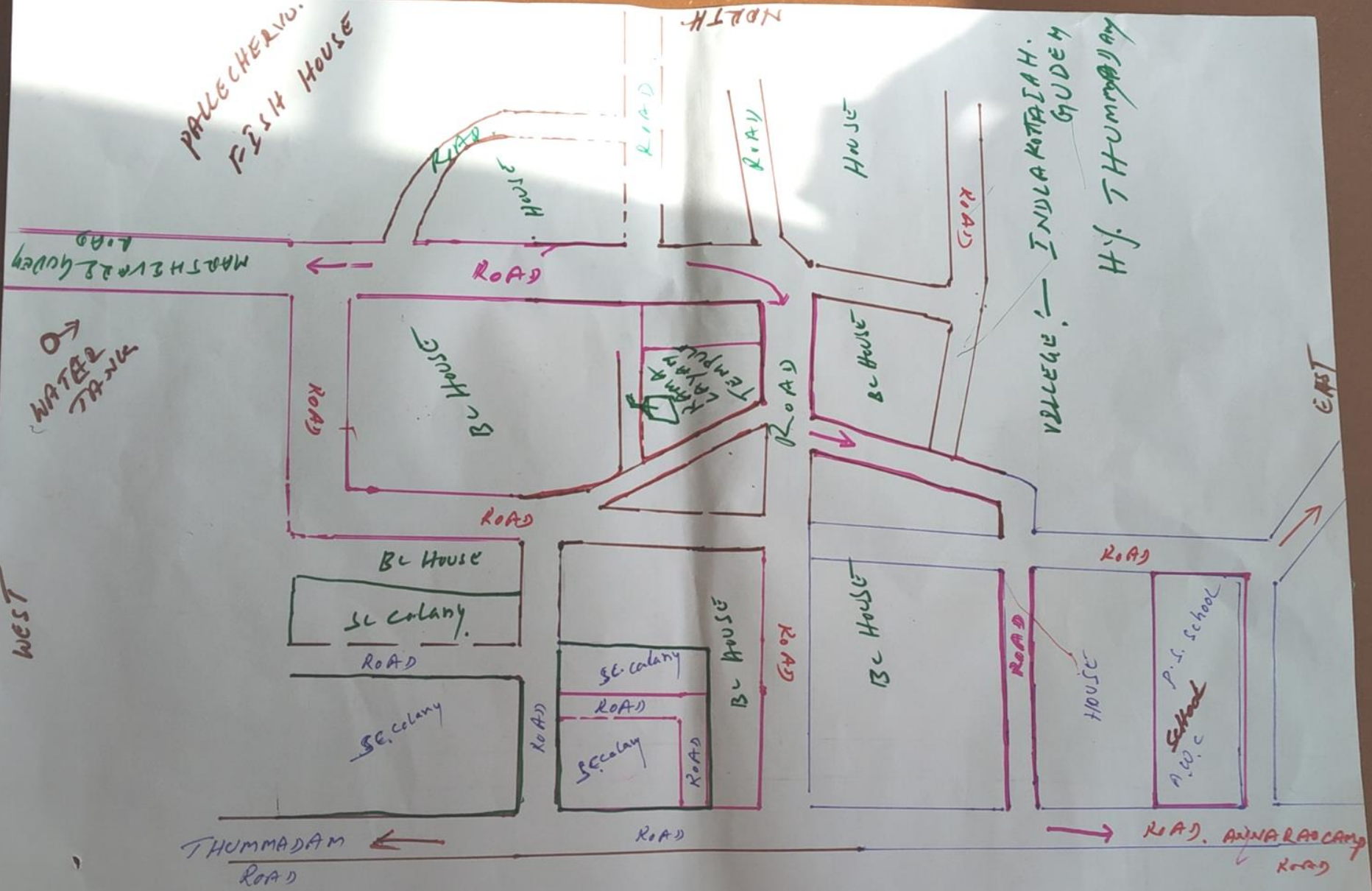

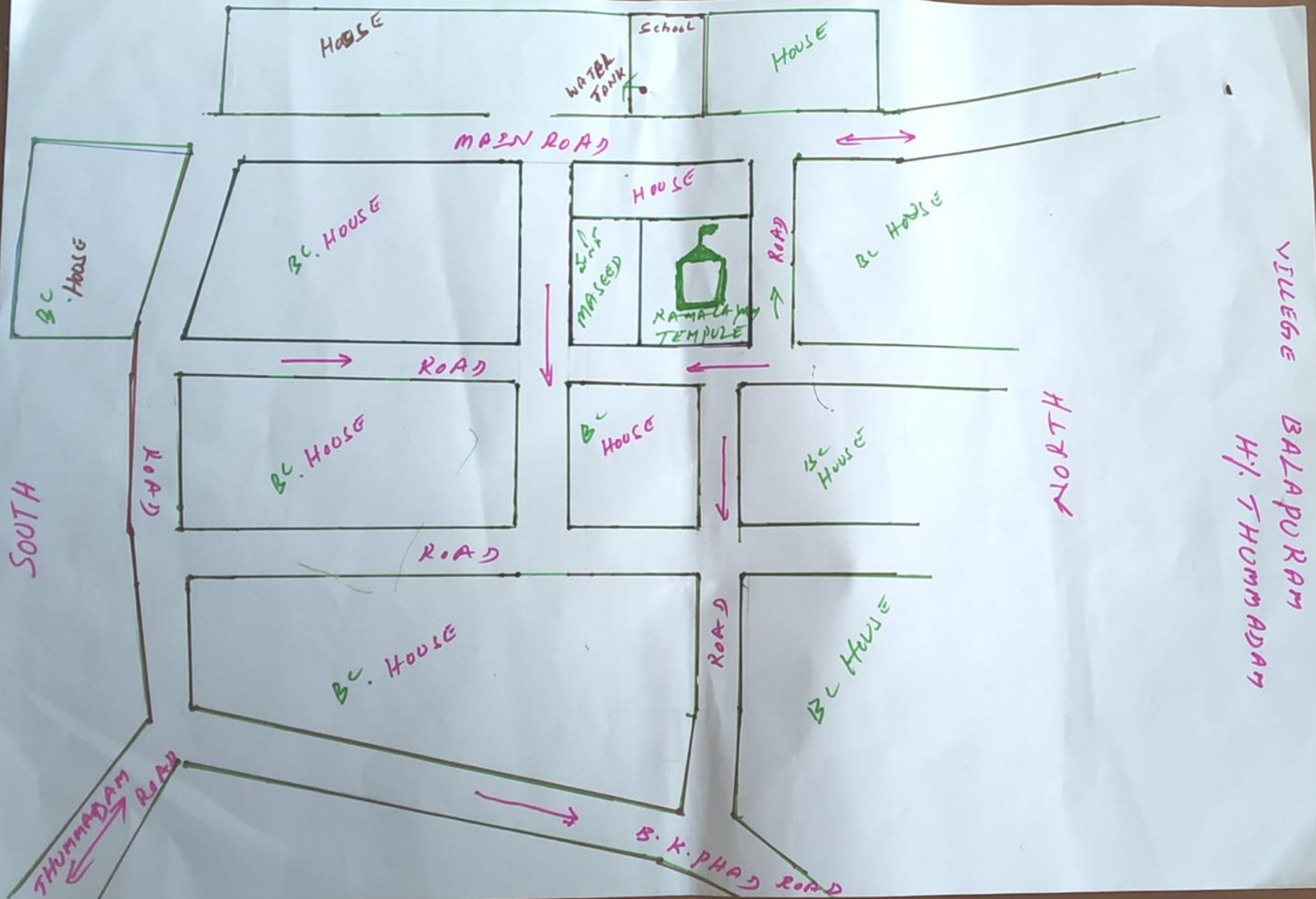

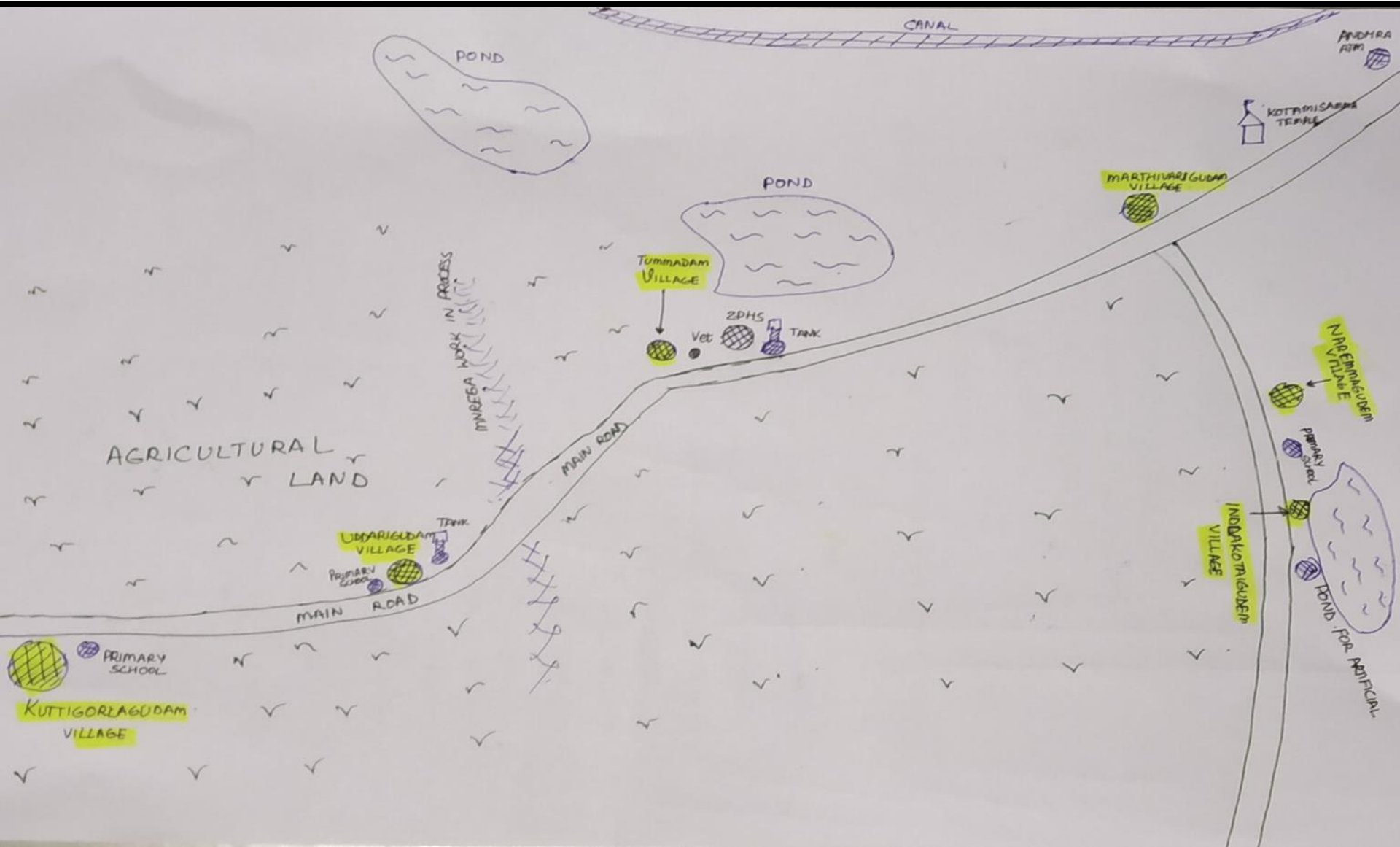

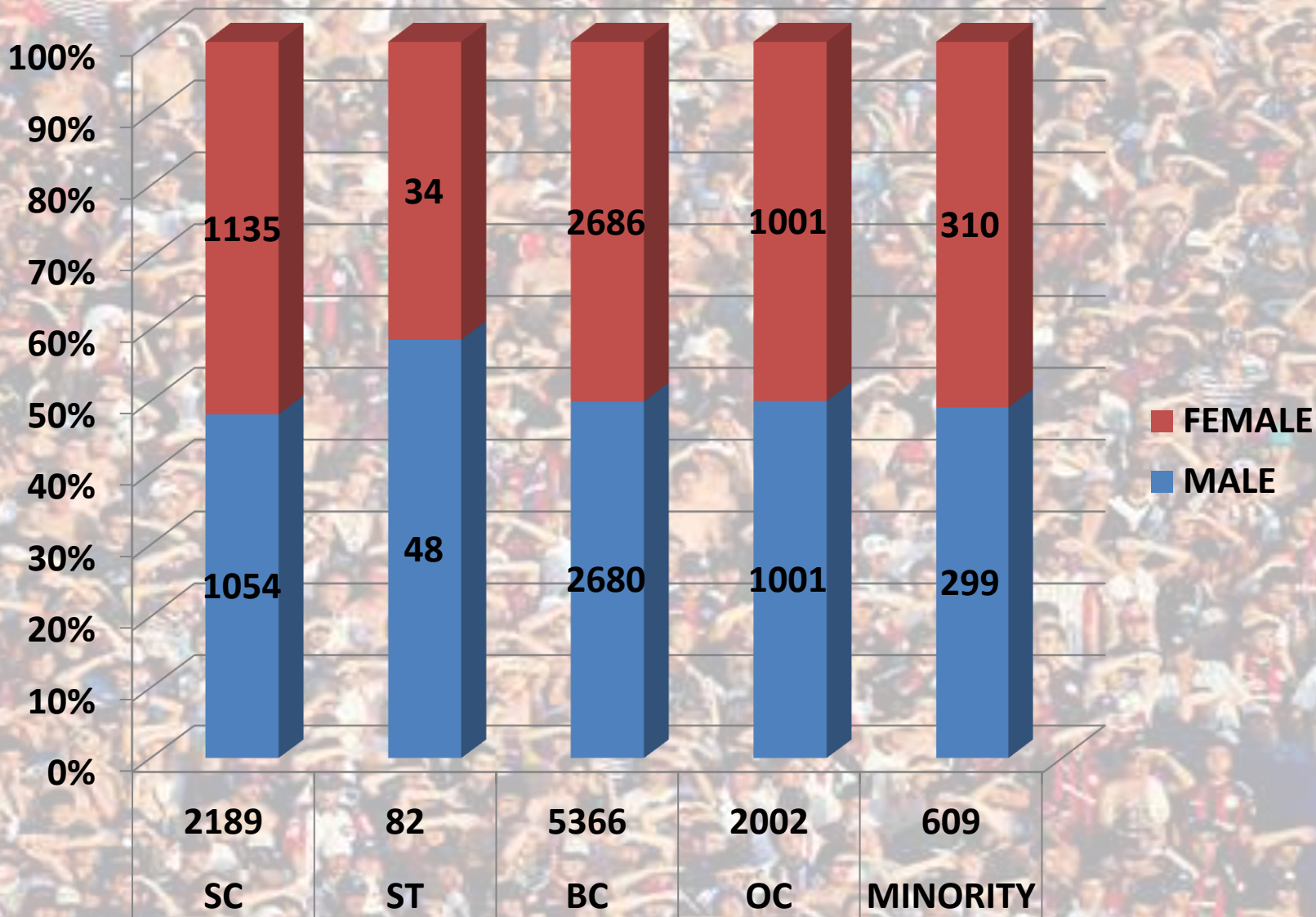

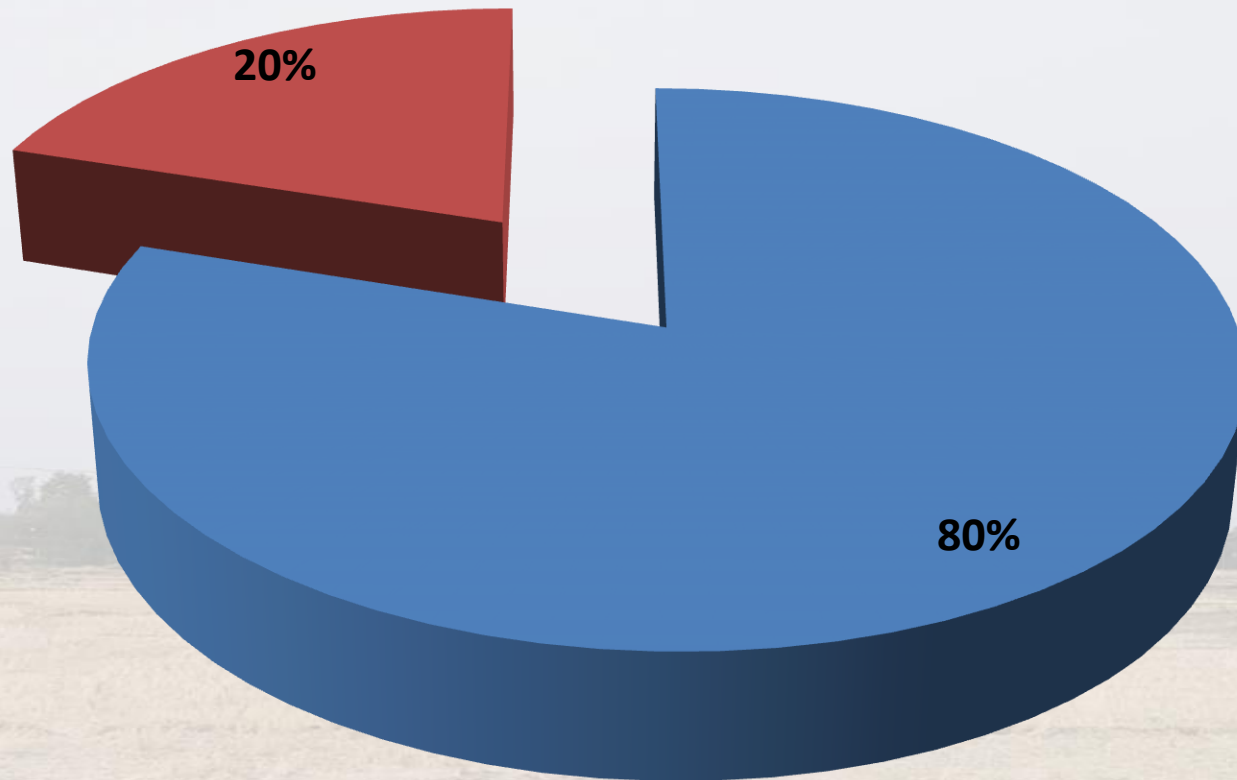

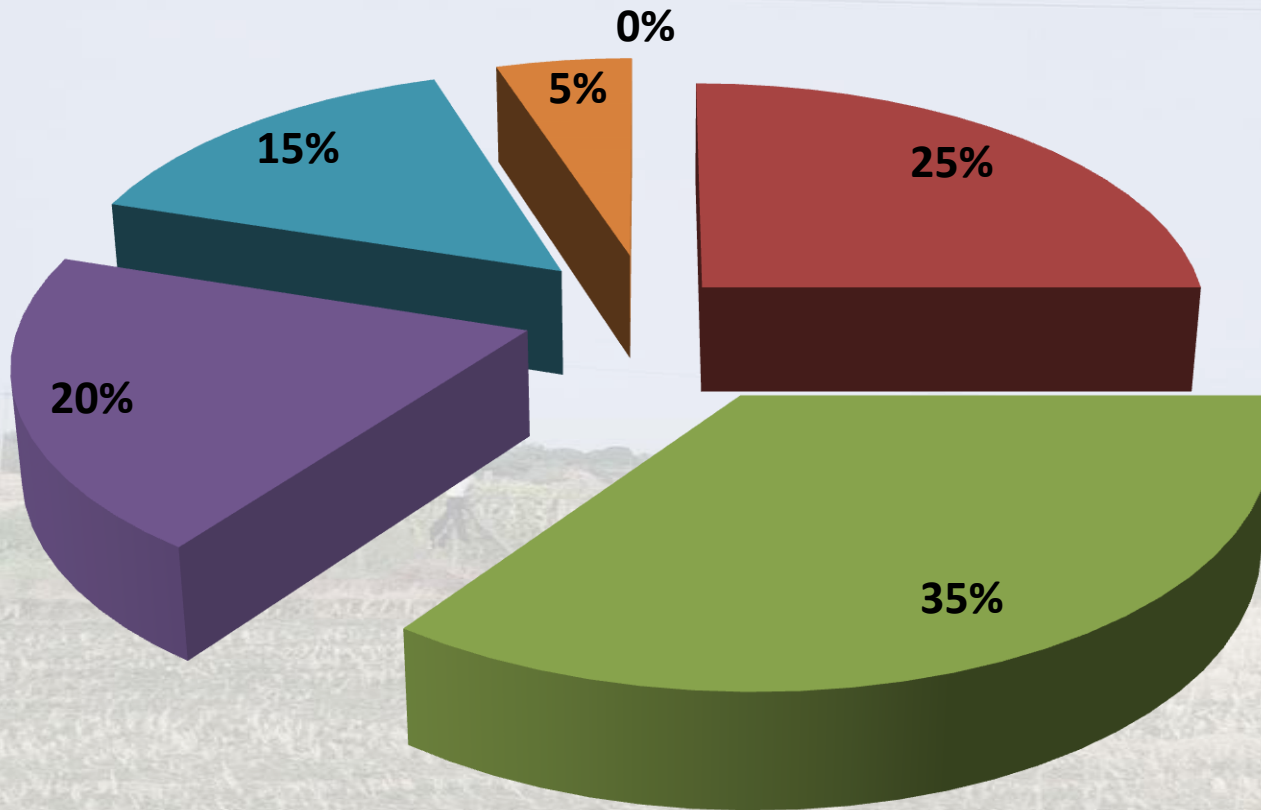
Land Use Pattern

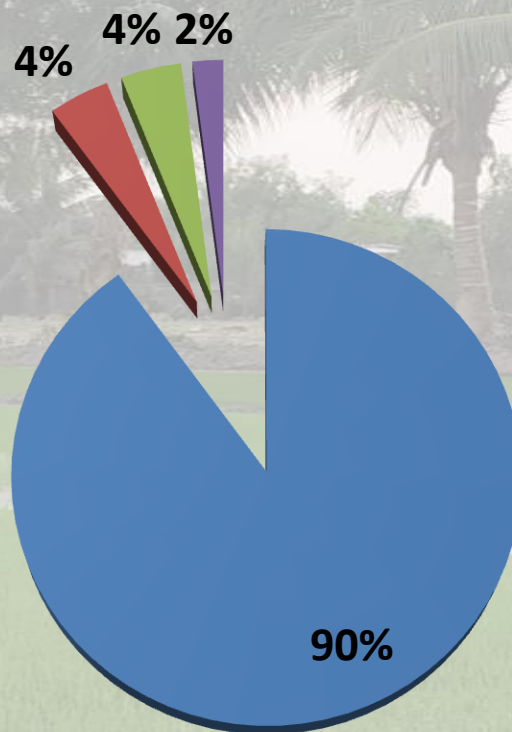
LAND DISTRIBUTION

■ Landless ■ Below 3 acres ■ 3 to 5 acres ■ 5 to 10 acres ■ above 10 acres

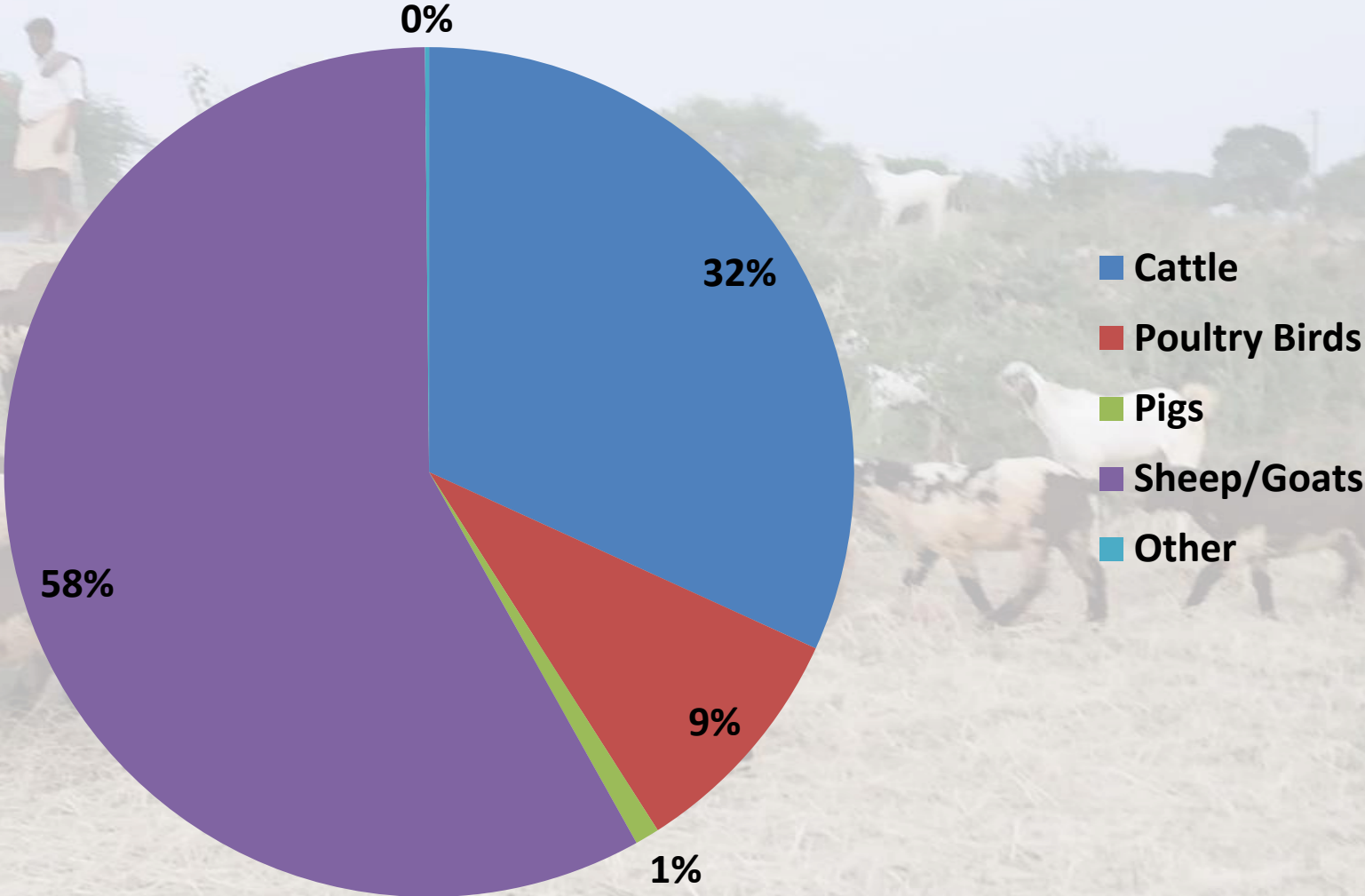


CROP DISTRIBUTION

Aanganwadi

- 7 Aanganwadis
- Lack of basic amenities like proper electricity connection, fans, arrangements for pregnant women
- Under Balamrutham food packets of 2.5 Kg are distributed per child per month.



Health Sub Centre

- 7 Health Sub Centres
- Primary Health Centre - Nidamanoor
- Lack of basic amenities like bed, refrigerator
- no rooms to accommodate staff and patients.

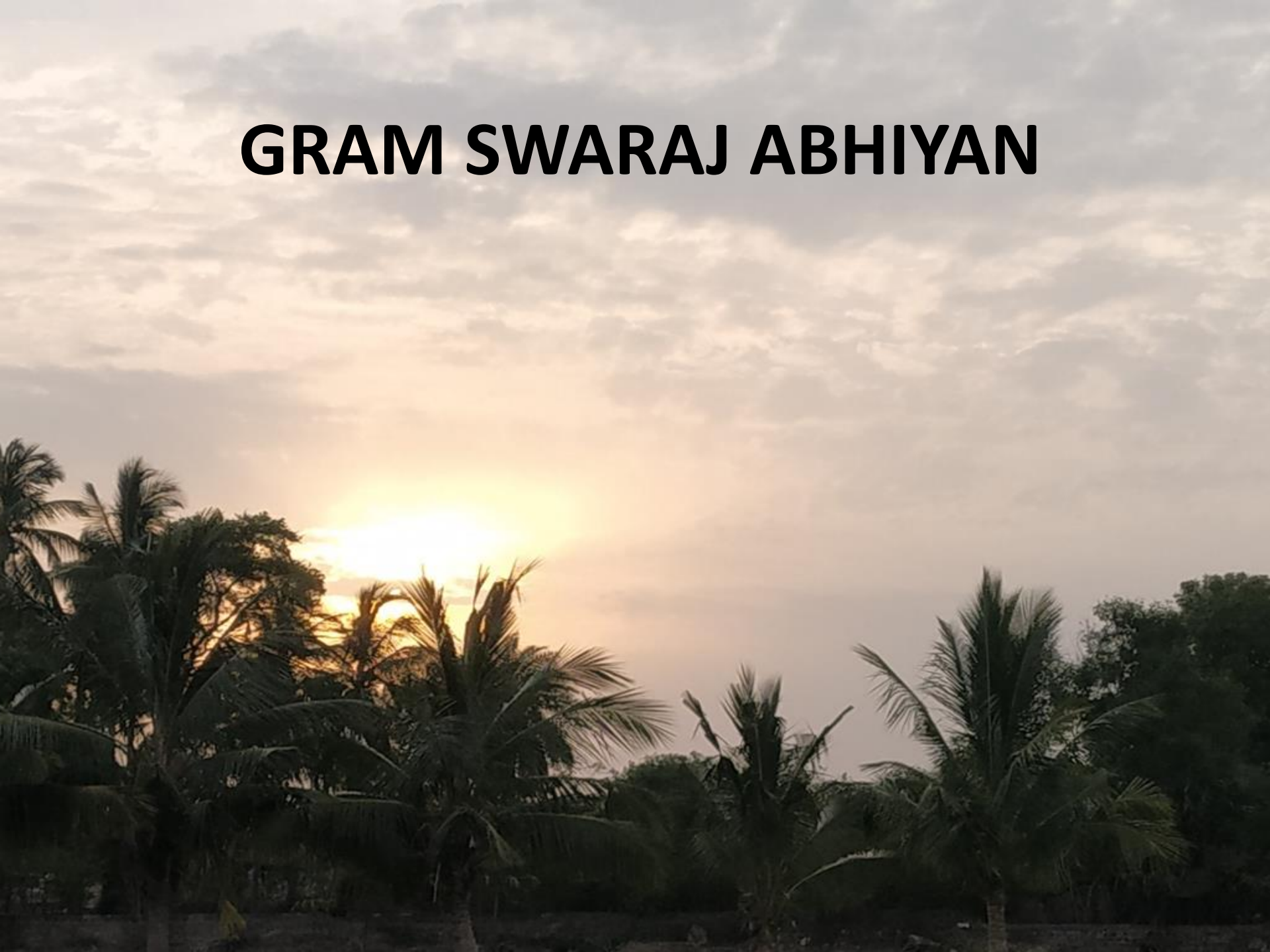


Schools

- 1 primary school in each habitation and one high school in Thummaddam.
- Each primary school has around 50 students with an average attendance of 30. Each primary school has 2 teachers.
- New kitchens are being constructed in each primary school for providing mid day meals.



Ujala Scheme

- "UJALA" - an acronym for Unnat Jyoti by Affordable LEDs for all
- Objective – to spread the message of energy efficiency in the country to reduce energy consumption with help of energy efficient bulbs like LEDs
- Govt's target is to replace 77cr incandescent bulbs in India with LEDs by 2019 to save around 20000 MW with annual estimated savings of 10.5 billion KWH

- Launched on 9th may 2015
- Offers a renewable one year term life cover of Rs. 2 lakhs to all subscribing bank account holders in the age group of 18 to 50 years. Covering death due to any reason for a premium of rs. 330 per annum per subscriber, to be auto debited from subscriber's bank account.
- To provide insurance cover to common people, specially poor and under privileged.

PM Suraksha Bima Yojana

- An accident insurance scheme, PMSBY offers a one-year accidental death and disability cover, which can be renewed annually.
- Rs 2 lakh for accidental death and permanent total disability, and Rs 1 lakh for permanent partial disability for premium of Rs. 12 per annum per person

Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana ↔ **Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana**

Accident insurance worth ₹ 2 lacs at just ₹ 12 per annum

- For all Bank account holders whose age is between 18 to 70 years
- Insurance also covers permanent disablement due to accident

Life insurance worth ₹ 2 lacs at just ₹ 330 per annum

- For all Bank account holders whose age is between 18 to 50 years
- Life Insurance amount for your family, in your absence

Period of Insurance, Annual : 1st June – 31st May

- The premium will be deducted from the account holder's savings bank account through 'auto debit' facility
- The person would be eligible to join the scheme through one savings bank account only

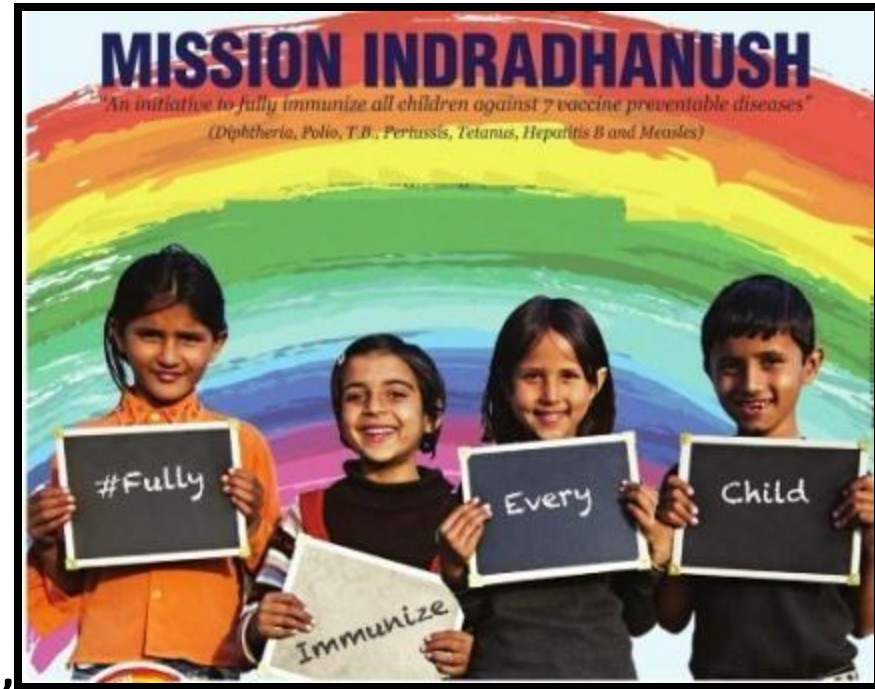

Mission Indradhanush

- Launched on 25th December 2014
- Objective: to immunize all children under the age of 2 years, as well as all pregnant women, against seven vaccine preventable diseases.
- The diseases being targeted are Diphtheria, Whooping cough, Tetanus, Poliomyelitis, Tuberculosis, Measles and Hepatitis B.

STATE SPONSORED SCHEMES

KCR Kit

- Distributed among new mothers who have opted govt. hospitals for delivery that consists 16 items necessary to keep newborn babies warm and hygienic.
- The items include: clothes, quality baby soaps, baby oil, baby powder, mosquito nets, toys, napkins, and diapers

KCR Kit contains

• Mosquito net worth Rs 350	• Baby napkins Rs 100	• Baby soap Rs 90
• Baby mask cap Rs 90	• Johnson's baby Powder Rs 120	• Toys: Rs 50 • Kit bags Rs 150
• Dress Rs 200	• Baby shampoo Rs 85	• Plastic buckets Rs 50
• Two towels Rs 100	• Baby oil Rs 200	• Two sarees for mother Rs 350



Mission Bhagiratha

- Water grid project that aims to provide safe drinking water to all even to remotest places in Telangana.
- Objective is to provide 100 liters of clean drinking water per person in rural households and 150 liters per person in urban households



Haritha Haram

- Envisages increasing the green cover of the State.



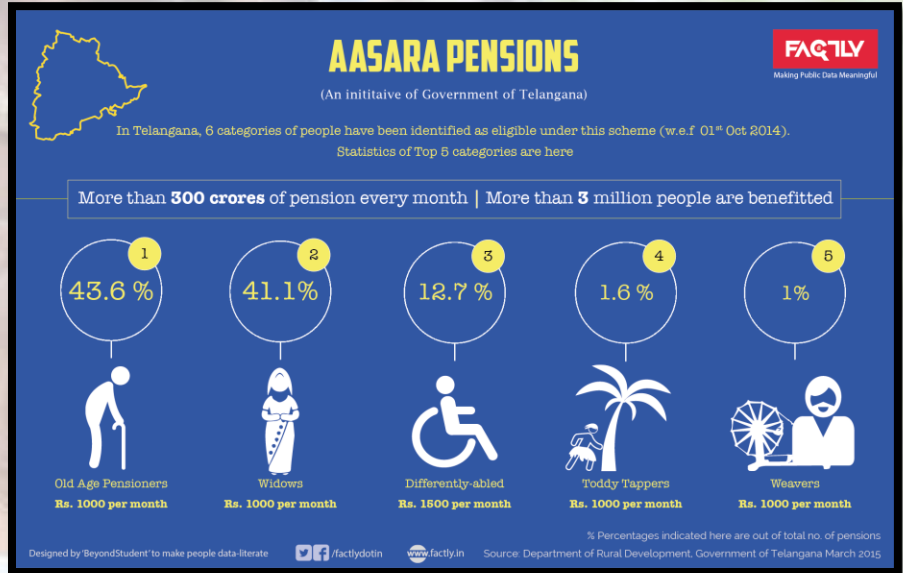
Arogya Lakshmi

- Government provides one nutritious meal every day to pregnant and lactating women and children below the age of six through Anganwadi centers.



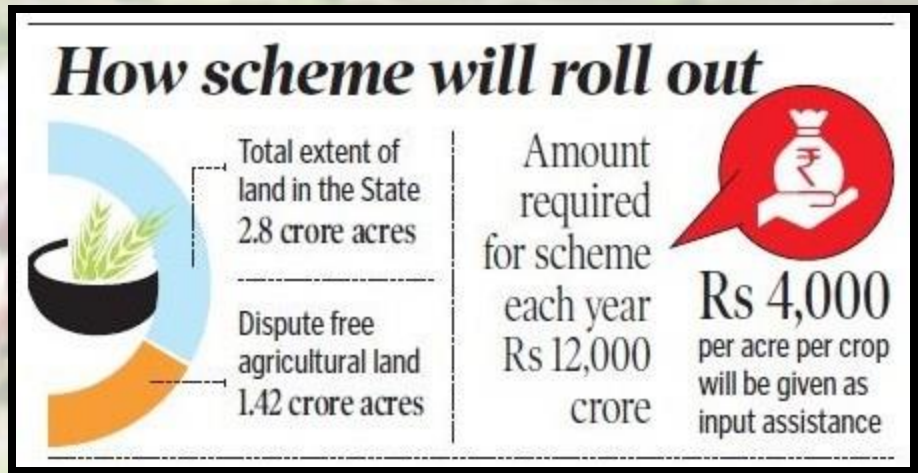
Aasara Pensions

- Ensures secure life with dignity for all the poor.
- Pensions to the weavers, toddy tappers, widows and differently abled.



Rythu Bandhu

- Welfare program to support farmer's investment for two crops a year by the Government of Telangana.
- ₹4000 per acre per season to support the farm investment, twice a year, for rabi and kharif seasons.



Swachh Bharat Abhiyan

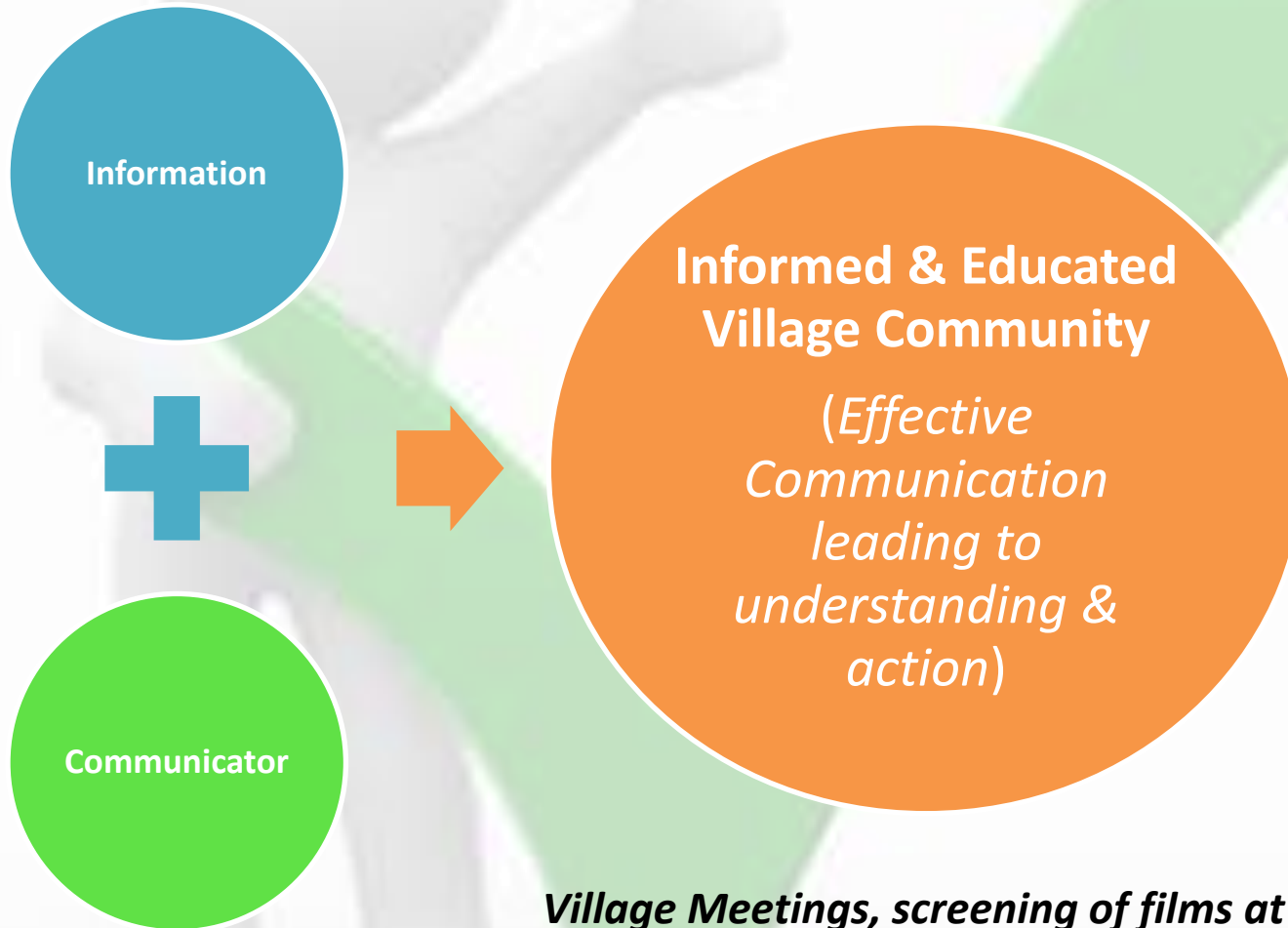
- Launched on 2nd Oct, 2014.
- Objective- clean up streets, roads and infrastructure of India's cities, smaller towns and rural areas.
