

About the Aspirational District Project

- Launched by Hon'ble Prime Minister in January, the 'Transformation of Aspirational Districts' programme.
- 115 districts from 28 states were selected as aspirational districts
- The program aims to quickly and effectively transform these districts.
- The broad features of the programme are
 - Convergence (of Central & State Schemes / funds),
 - Collaboration (of Central, State level 'Prabhari' Officers & District Collectors),
 and
 - Competition among districts driven by a mass Movement.
- The program will focus on the strength of each district, identify easily achievable indicators for immediate improvement, measure progress, and rank districts.

The Areas of Focus

- The 'Transformation of Aspirational Districts' programme focusses on the following 6 thematic areas
 - Health & Nutrition,
 - Education,
 - Agriculture & Water Resources,
 - Financial Inclusion &
 - Skill Development, and
 - Basic Infrastructure.
- Each theme has several indicators and data-points which were selected after wideranging consultations with the ministries concerned.
- Weightage, and number of indicators and data-points in each theme is given in Table 1.



About the workshop (10-12th October, 2018)

- A 3-day workshop conducted for district and mandal officers with the following objectives:
 - To generate awareness among district and sub-district level officers about the indicators, data-points, current status.
 - To build capacities of district level officers of Aspirational districts to prepare respective District Action Plans
 - To equip the district officers to further train their field staff within their departments, in accordance with the 6 thematic areas
 - To identify and share best practices / success stories and to customize / replicate the models to suit their local needs.
 - To take stock of process, deliberations of the workshop that will be captured in the form of a package of e-Learning Module. This will help generate awareness to cutting-edge functionaries about the program

Way Forward (for District Administration)

- On the current ranking, identify sector wise areas to be improved
- Sector wise SWOT analysis to be carried out
- Map the weakest mandals based on the indicators
- Map financial and human resources available in the districts
- Map resources from State and Centre
- Analyze the resource gap
- Prepare action plan for improvisation of weakest pockets / indicators by departments concerned by convergence of funds
- Involve CSR NGOs for resource mobilization and partnerships

Way forward (for State Level)

- Nominate a nodal officer for each sector for regular monitoring
- Ensure flow of funds on priority to these districts and sectors
- Ensure sufficient man power to achieve the desired results
- Include as one of the agenda item in the monthly reviews of the department
