
AP & CYCLONES

- AP Second larget coastline in Country next to Gujarat - 974 KMs
- 9 coastal districts with 69% population and 4 non coastal districts with 30.8% population
- Since 1891, Hudhud is 77th cyclone crossing AP coast and 8th cyclone crossing Visakhapatnam (Nellore district with highest - 32 storms)
- Out of 77, october (32), november (21) and December (9) months carried 62 cyclones -80.5%

HUDHUD CYCLONE

- In the living memory of Visakhapatnam, a VERY SEVERE CYCLONIC STORM WITH CORE OF HURRICANE WINDS 'HUDHUD' crossed at Visakhapatnam on 12.10.2014 by 1300 hrs
- Max sustained wind based on Satellite Cloud imageries -167-185 kmph
- Peak wind in gust 260 kmph at 1012 hrs from N-NW direction.
- In a period of 144 years (since the start of observatory at Maharanipet), a record rainfall in 24 hrs - 400.6 mm was recorded at Visakhapatnam airport by 13.10.2014 morning as against the previous recorded high on 20.10.1958
- Yelamanchili recorded the highest rainfall of 47 cms in association with storm

HUDHUD CYCLONE....


- Tidal Wave or Storm Surge did not affect Vizag
 - Off shore bathymetry / bottom topography or slope of coast is steep at Vizag
 - Max Storm surge of 1.4 m above astronomical tide has been reported at Tide Gauge at Visakhapatnam
 - But Sea Waves can erode beaches
- Visakhapatnam coast is practically STORM RESISTANT COAST
- Even a SUPER CYCLONE INTENSITY STORM cannot create a storm surge of 2 metres above MSL
- Three districts are located on north of the Storm Centre
- Effect on southern Half of the system is practically nil except EG district
- This is the usual phenomena of October Storms in this area

HUDHUD CYCLONE.....

- The Hudhud storm dissipated over East UP on 14.10.2014
- It travelled 2600 km 7.10.14 to 14.10.14 8 days.
 - 1450 km over sea 6 days
 - 1150 km over land 2 days
- Wrong belief that hills of Visakhapatnam can protect it from Cyclones
 - Cyclones normally extends to a height of 6 km and violent winds prevail upto a height of 3 km
 - Hills cannot protect from cyclones
 - But act as a barrier
 - Can reduce its strength to some extent after crossing



HUDHUD CYCLONE.....

- Past Two Major Storms of Vizag
 - 4.10.1983 crossed near Bheemunipatnam and caused heavy rains from Srikakulam to Guntur District
 - 16.6.1996 Cyclonic storm with gale wind of 85 kmph speed due to which Koida in Khammam district recorded a record rainfall of 675 mm on 17.6.1996 with average rainfall ofn 20 cm between Vizag to Krishna districts

Comparision with two storms of Hudhud

- Those are associated with more rain
- Hudhud cyclone affected with Hurricane winds
- In the past, Vizag Airport recorded a max wind of 146 kmph in gust at 1842 hrs on 1.6.1967

PREPARATORY ACTIONS BY STATE AND DISTRICTS

- 24X7 Control Room
- Evacuation of fishermen and vulnerable villages to Relief Centres 310
 - Srikakulam 120 RCs 68575
 - Vizianagaram 17 RCs 16832
 - Vizag 94 RCs 102427
 - East Godavari 79 Rcs 34626
- Senior IAS officers to Districts
- Senior District Level Officers to Mandals
- Suspension of rail / road / air transport one day before the crossing of cyclone
- Periodical dissemination of information to public through FM Radio, TV and other media including social medias
- Positioning of NAVY / NDRF / ARMY / POLICE / COAST GUARDS / FIRE PERSONNEL in required places
- Review through VC by Cab-Sec and Chief Secretary on regular intervals till 11.10.2014 evening for necessary assistance
- Stocking of ECS
- Running the Water Schemes through Generators
- Alerting of Telecom Service Providers and Tower operators for having enough fuel
- All District Heads are given proper instructions to remain at Mandal / Village HQ and take necessary actions

FEW ISSUES IN PREPARATION

- PEOPLE'S BELIEF ON THE SYSTEM
- BRINGING FISHERMEN TO RELIEF CENTRES
- SENSITIZATION OF OFFICERS AND ORGANIZATIONS
 - BSNI
 - TELECOM OPERATORS
- LIASION WITH GOI ORGANIZATIONS LIKE RAILWAYS, NHAI, ETC
- PROPER ASSESSMENT OF THE REQUIREMENT OF MATERIALS

DAY OF FINAL HUDHUD. WMV STORM

- Trees started falling since early morning of 12.10.2014 Sunday
- Traffic is affected
- Collectorate Control Room is affected and leaking
- Power is suspended since 11.10.2014 late evening and is the major Casualty of the cyclone
- Connectivity is affected and hence, could not talk to those in RCs
 - Satellite phones function only when you come out and speak and we cannot come out in stormy winds
 - Except land line phone at one place at Collectorate Control room, there was no contact with State HQ
- Repeater Stations for Wireless sets have also blown
- Radar Station at Vizag becomes dysfunctional since noon
 - Hence, no chance of real time monitoring of movement

MAIN ISSUES

- IMD changed the speed of the wind from 150-180 kmph to above 200 kmph few hours before the storm hit
 - Damage assessment changes according to the speed of the wind
 - Preparations cannot change at last moment
- Timing of crossing could not be assessed correctly
 - LUCKILY, IT WAS SUNDAY AND DAY TIME
- Chances of multiple-command centres
 - Averted due to the presence of CM

AT THE END OF STORM... TASKS AHEAD.....

- MAIN CASUALITIES ARE
 - POWER
 - TELE CONNECTIVITY
- AT THE SAME TIME, ARRANGING EXTRA FACILITIES REQUIRED LIKE
 - SAW CUTTERS
 - JCBs
 - TIPPERS / DUMPERS / TRUCKS
- REGULAR FACILITIES
 - DRINKING WATER
 - MILK
 - POWER TO HOSPITALS

FEW ISSUES ON THE DAY OF STORM

- CONTROL ROOM IS LEAKING; ALTERNATIVE CONTROL ROOM??
- UNAWARE OF WHAT IS THE SITUATION ELSEWHERE AS CONNECTIVITY IS GONE
 - AGENCY AREA CAME TO KNOW THE STATUS AFTER 36 HOURS
- FLOODING OF VVIPS / OFFICIALS
- ALL HOSPITALITY FACILITIES AFFECTED
- EXPLOITATION BY PEOPLE THEMSELVES
 - Was aware

POST STORM - RELIEF, REHABILITATION AND RESTORATION

- Honourable CM camped since 13.10.2014 and monitored the operations
- Honourable PM reached and reviewed on 14.10.2014 and announced release of immediate package
- Important Principal Secretaries, HoDs and other field officers are present since 13.10.2014 morning
- All Ministers of the State, District and public representatives have worked for the work along with the officials in the early restoration works

RELIEF WORKS

- Clearance of the Road for Making the men and public move around
 - Started the moment cyclone stopped by 8.30 pm on 12.10.2014 itself
 - Deployment of JCBs, Trucks and men
 - Tree Cutters / Power Saws -
- Assessment of needs for men and material at locations
 - Difficult task as the damage is extensive
 - Moved in large numbers from other districts
- Making the Essential Commodities available
 - Milk
 - Sold at higher rate in first day controlled in the next day by flooding the market with more milk
 - Tankers from Orissa and lesser rate supply from local players

WATER RESTORATOIN





- Drinking Water
 - More tankers are mobilized from neighbouring districts
- Food in larger quantity were moved from other districts
 - Air lifted from other District HQs
 - Moved through roads
 - Both rural and urban areas are covered
 - Directly served by NGOs and various associations
- Making Essential Services readily put into service
 - Hospitals
 - Made to run immediately
 - Buses and Autos
 - Put on road at the earliest

RELIEF MEASURES

- Supply of free essential commodites to all affected families
 - BPL and APL
 - Cardless families also enumerated and covered
 - 9 commodities are given
 - Mobilized in record time and distributed
 - Huge exercise in the history of the State
- Ex Gratia to all the deceased cases @ 5 lakhs from available funds
- Similarly, Ex gratia to all the injured cases based on the degree of injury and duration of hospitalization

ENUMERATION OF DAMAGES

- Team from other districts deployed to enumerate
 - Housing Damages
 - Damages to Cattlesheds
 - Damages to petty shops / street vendors / rickshaws / push carts
 - Agricultural
 - Horticultural
 - Coffee
 - Animal Husbandry including poultry
 - Fisheries

POST ENUMERATION CHECKS

- All collected data are ported in website specially designed for this purpose
 - With photo of the individual damages
 - Aadhaar numbers
 - Bank accounts numbers
- Aadhaar validation is must
- The compensation is being released to the bank accounts of the individual directly on the cases where Aadhaar validation is done
- In case of no-aadhaar cases and no-bank account cases, the same are collected and then the amounts are released

UNIQUE ACTIONS

- Huge quantity of vegetables are supplied form other districts to contain inflation
- Under AP State Skills Upgradation Mission, skilled manpower like electricians, plumbers, carpentors, etc are supplied to necessary households for repairing free of cost duly maintaining a call centre
- Power saws are supplied to villages to help them to cut the fallen trees and put the field for next crops
- Under NREGA, per tree amount is calculated at district level and paid for the fallen trees to clear the field and under convergence, next horticultural crops are given
- Under 75% subsidy, the seeds are supplied
- The Insurance companies are regularly reviewed on the claim settlement
- The industry department has released the pending incentives and reimbursement amounts immediately
