





# ECONOMIC PARTICIPATION AND OPPORTUNITY – 149 RANK OUT OF 153 COUNTRIES

ONLY 25 % OF WOMEN ENGAGE IN LABOUR MARKET COMPARED TO 82% OF MEN

FEMALE ESTIMATED EARNED INCOME IS MERE 20% OF MALE INCOME

### WOMEN AS POLITICAL LEADERS


Women's representation has steadily increased in the Parliament. In the first-ever election, **only 5%** of the House consisted of women. Now, that has increased to **14.3%**.

The national average of women in state assemblies and state councils (upper house of the state legislatures) is **9%** and **5%**, respectively.

female representation in state assemblies was the highest in Bihar, Haryana and Rajasthan at 14%.

A third of seats have been reserved for women since 1993 in local governments. That move led to a current national average of 44% of elected women representatives in panchayats (village councils).

As many as 14 states and union territories have 50% or more elected women representatives in panchayats. Rajasthan and Uttarakhand have 56% representation, the highest in the country.



became the President of the Indian National Congress.




Kamaladevi Chattopadhyay


She founded the All India Women's Conference, which promoted legislative reforms,


In 1888, the role

In 1992, the Indian
Army began inducting
women officers in nonmedical roles

In February 2016, President
Pranab Mukherjee
announced that women will
finally be allowed to take up
combat roles in all sections of
the Indian armed
forces, signalling a radical
move towards gender parity
in one of the world's most
male-dominated professions.

### Squadron Leader Deepika Misra

the first IAF woman pilot to train for the helicopter aerobatic team, Sarang the first to be inducted into the indigenous Advanced Light Helicopter squad.

### Air Marshal Padmavathy Bandopadhyay

the first woman Air Marshal of the Indian Air Force.

She is the second woman in the Indian armed forces to be promoted to a three-star rank.
