




SILENCE OF THE LAMBS


POOREST OF POOR

- 11 BPL HOUSEHOLDS
- Composition:-
 - 6 SC HHDs
 - 3 BC HHDs
 - 2 ST HHDs
- LINGAMMA GUDAVALUR
 - OBC, widow of Lakshamana
 - Lives alone in a makeshift hut
 - Relatives unwilling to support her
 - Receives pension= Rs 1000/month
 - Entitled to 35kg of grains under Antodaya
 - Sanctioned house under IAY
 - Lacked supplementary resources to take it up



MGNREGA

- ■201 works taken up since inception- mostly land development works such as bund plantation
- ■95 IHHLs sanctioned in 2015-16 but work yet to start- Uptake problem



POWER OF AN ANGOOTHA

- Wages disbursed by Post Office using hand held biometric device
- ■Labour to material ratio= 88:12
- ■5 Hhds completed 100 days of work in 2015-16
- ■Average wage rate= Rs 84.37
- ■7525 persondays generated for BCs and 1140 for SC/ST



LANDHOLDING PATTERN AMONG SC




SEASONALITY



- Students asked to clean toilets as attendant is very old &mostly on leave






EIGHTH WONDER- DUAL MECHANISM BOREWELL

PRESSING CONCERNS:

- 1) LAX MONITORING OF GROWTHINDIVIDUAL PROGRESS CHARTS NOT
 MAINTAINED
- 2) CRAMPED ROOMS- NO SPACE FOR PLAY
- 3) NO TOILETS
- 4) RATIONS REPLENISHED ONCE A MONTH FROM MANDAL OFFICE: PROBLEM IN STORING PERISHABLE ITEMS LIKE EGGS-HENCE DISTRIBUTED IN THE BEGINNING OF THE MONTH TO PREGNANT AND LACTATING MOTHERS RATHER THAN SERVED COOKED UNDER AMRUTHAHASTHAM SCHEME.

3 types of beneficiaries

- Food Security Card (FSC) holders
- Annapurna Food Security Card (AFSC) holders
- Antyodaya card holders
- 450 cards issued- Identification done on basis of hhd survey

Entitlements

- Rice, Sugar, Salt
- Kerosene, LPG
- Stock arrives by the 2nd of every month from District Civil Supplies
 Dept.
- One yr contract to run FPS given to Kumari Balayogi, to be renewed every yr
- Selection based on Class 10th marks
- Any complaint against FPS to be made to MRO

Incentive to run FPS

- Commission on quantity sold- 8 paisa/kg of rice
- Empty bags

SHG REVOLUTION?

- 16 Groups led by different leaders.
- SthreeNidhi credit cooperative
 Federation Ltd supported by BMB
- Monthly savings- Rs 100 per head
- State Bank of Hyderabad
- Loans after 6 months of opening of account
- Money used mostly for consumption purpose
- 3 out of 16 SHGs in the village have NPAs
- SHG for disabled people



SANITATION AND DRAINAGE





- 40/450 households have toilets at home
- Behavioral change has not happened
- School children can be a trigger for bringing attitudinal change
