- The Company Act amended in 2013
- Section 135 talks about CSR
- Every company having
 - net worth of Rs.500 crore or more, or
 - turnover of Rs.1000 crore or more or
 - a net profit of Rs. 5 crore or more
- during any financial year shall constitute a Corporate Social Responsibility Committee

135 (5) The Board of every company shall ensure that the company spends, in every financial year, at least two per cent of the average net profits of the company made during the three immediately preceding financial years, in pursuance of

its Corporate Social Responsibility Policy

Vegetarianism, the mantra to overcome climate change challenges

Vegetarianism is emerging as a new solution to solving the climate change challenge. The latest to champion the cause is the best-known climate economist Nicholas Stern, who has said that turning vegetarian would help to check climate change.

He told FE in an exclusive interview, "A vegetarian diet is climate friendly. It's less carbon intensive. Though eating food is a matter of personal choice, it is desirable to help people make informed decisions."

The director of the India Observatory at the London School of Economics was in the capital to deliver a lecture on "Building an Equitable Agreement on Climate Change", which was organised by Indian Council for Research on International Economic Relation along with the Management Development Institute.

He is not alone in taking up the dietary aspect of climate change. Earlier, Inter-governmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) chairman Rajendra Pachauri called upon people to reduce meat intake to become climate friendly. United Nation Framework Convention on Climate Change chief Yvo de Boer has also said on record that the best climate change solution is to turn vegetarian.

Now, even celebrities are joining the campaign. Paul McCartney and family are asking people to turn vegetarian for a day in a week. Apart from stars like Kevin Spacey, Woody Harrelson and Joanna Lumley, the Meat Free Monday campaign is reported to have the support of Virgin chief Richard Branson. The campaign seeks to reduce greenhouse gas emissions (GHGs) from livestock

They have evidence to support their arguments. The United Nations For and Agriculture Organisation estimates that the livestock sector is responsible for 18% of the global greenhouse gas emissions in carbon dioxide equivalent. Besides, the livestock business also degrades land and pollutes water, according to Livestock's Long Shadow-Environmental Issues Cotions.

The emissions from the sector are set to increase in absolute numbers

Jadav Payeng, Assam

- Single-handedly plants a 1,360-acre forest
- It all started way back in 1979, when floods washed a large number of snakes ashore on the sandbar. One day, after the waters had receded, Payeng, only 16 then, found the place dotted with the dead reptiles. That was the turning point of his life.

"The snakes died in the heat, without any tree cover. I sat down and wept over their lifeless forms. It was carnage. I alerted the forest department and asked them if they could grow trees there. They said **nothing would grow there**. Instead, they asked me to try growing bamboo. It was painful, **but I did it**. There was nobody to help me. Nobody was interested," says Payeng, now 47.

Lake is back from the brink

Gurunadham Cheruvu in Miyapur was just another dumping ground until APEC and SBI chipped in to clean up and beautify the lake

f the numerous lakes that dot the city, only a few know about the existence of a small non-descript lake - 'Gurunadham Cheruvu' flowing in Miyapur. For most of the people staying in the colonies and numerous apartment complexes near Jayaprakash Nagar, where it is located, the lake is just another dumping ground.

Solid waste

It was common to spot residents and motorists passing by recklessly throw, with all their might, garbage bundled in polythene covers into the lake.

So much so that when Andhra Pradesh Environment Connect (APEC), a networking platform for enthusiastic environmentalists, undertook to clean up the lake on May 30, its 150 'green volunteers' removed 12 tonnes of solid waste from the lake bed.

"The lake was filthy due to the garbage thrown by residents of nearby apartments," says C.S. Rama Lakshmi, Additional Principal Chief Conservator of forests (Envi-

After cleaning the debris, APEC volunteers sensitised locals on the importance of preserving the lake and not throw garbage into it, she told The Hindu. Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) authorities were requested to erect mesh along the lake's fringes so as to deter locals throwing garbage into the lake.

The lake would be now adopted by the State Bank of India (SBD, according to P. Raghuveer, Chief Conservator of Forests (Environ-



HYDERABAD: The State Forest Department launched a 'Wealth Out of Waste (WOW) initiative' in collaboration with IT Bhadrachalam, to mark the World Earth Day on Wednesday.


