

WHO IS A TRAFFICKER?

Trafficker could be a man or a woman, could belong to any class or social strata of society.

Can be in the garb of business owners, teachers, doctors, parents, family members, civil society organizations etc.

More than 40% of sex traffickers are women.

Traffickers prey upon the emotional and personal vulnerability of prospective victims.

Chain of traffickers begin from the source- where victims are spotted and ends at the destination - where the victim is exploited.

Most traffickers are undetected. The few arrested are mostly those at the place of exploitation.

Technology is now the most potent tool used by traffickers which makes even economically advantaged persons vulnerable.

Sec 370,IPC

- Whoever, for the purpose of exploitation, (a) recruits, (b) transports, (c) harbours, (d) transfers, or (e) receives, a person or persons, by
 - using threats, or
 - using force, or any other form of coercion, or
 - by abduction, or
 - by practising fraud, or deception, or
 - by abuse of power, or

 by inducement, including the giving or receiving of payments or benefits, in order to achieve the consent of any person having control over the person recruited, transported, harboured, transferred or received, commits the offence of trafficking.

Explanations

- 1. The expression "exploitation" shall include any act of physical exploitation or any form of sexual exploitation, slavery or practices similar to slavery, servitude, or the forced removal of organs.
- 2. The consent of the victim is immaterial in determination of the offence of trafficking
