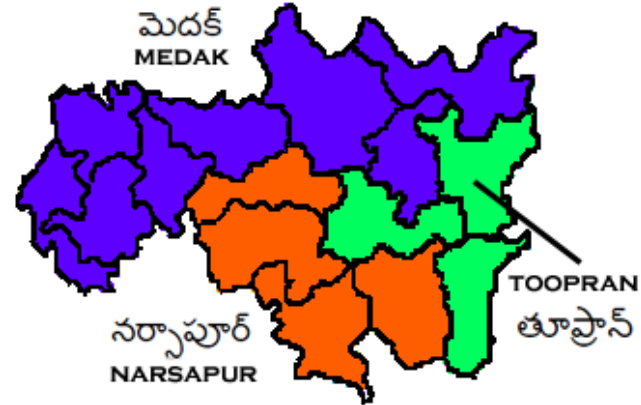

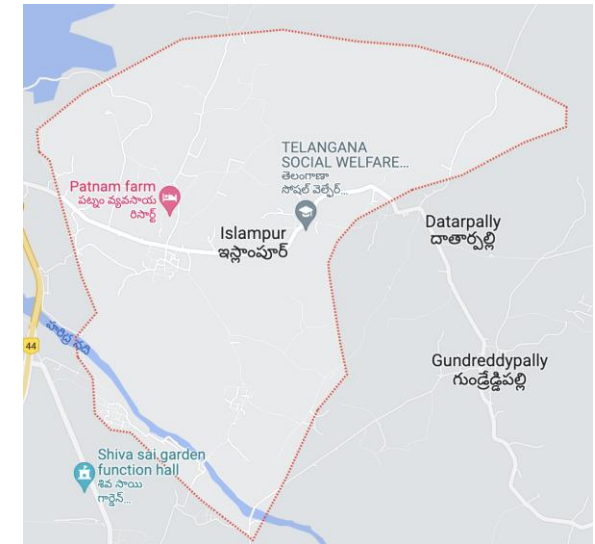

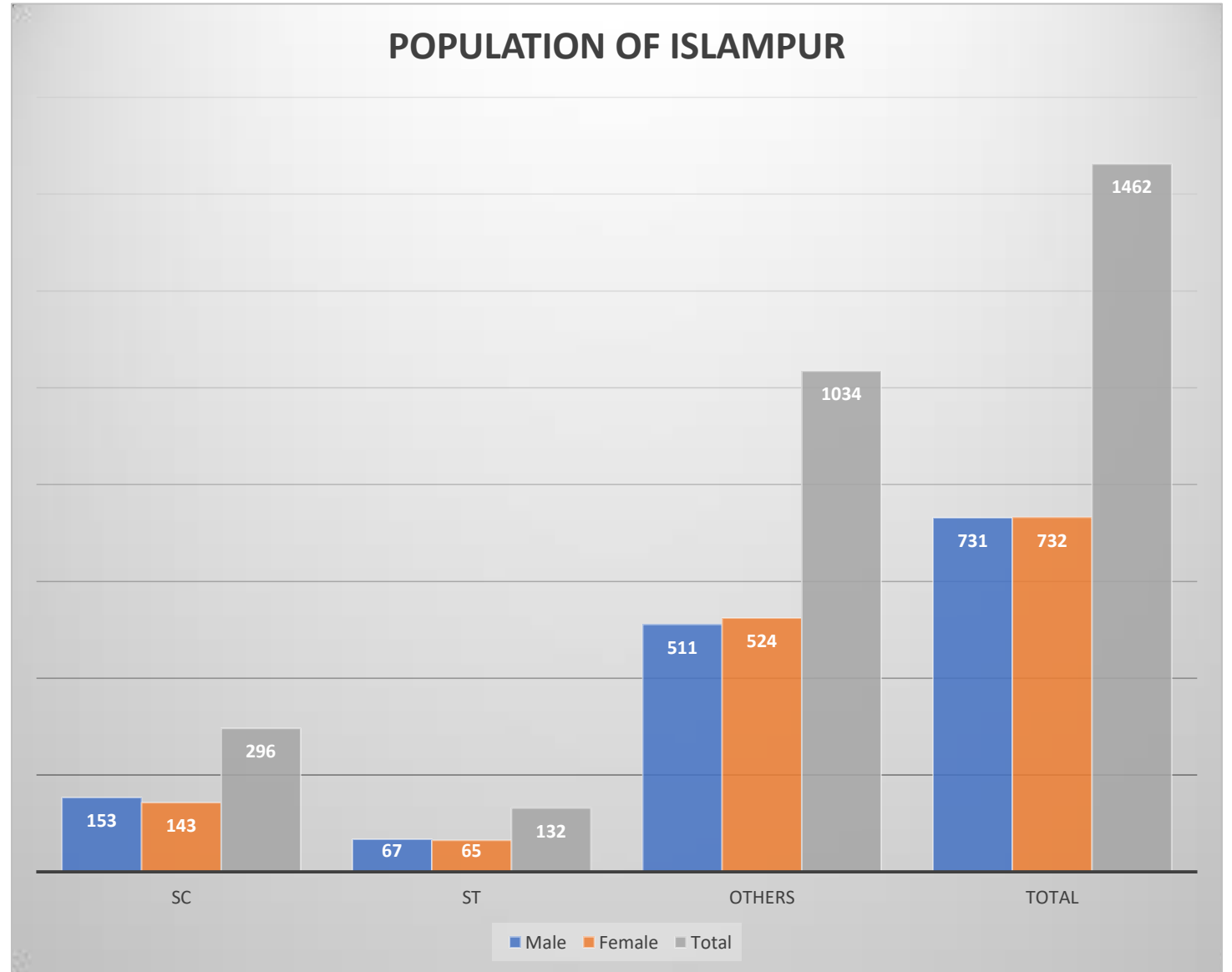

# Health Profile.

- CURRENT STATUS
- ASHA Workers: 1

- Nearest PHC: Manoharabad

- Meeting every month with PHC
- Ambulance service: 102 (pregnant women), 104(emergency cases), 108(medicine delivery); 100% institutional delivery
- Seasonal Health medical camps
- Awareness camps organised (Anaemia, institutional delivery, family planning, hygiene and nutrition)
- Arogya Shree being effectively used by the BPL families
- CM release fund used by government employees and health loans taken up using SHGs by others
- Rogi Kalyan Committee is constituted on a regular basis.(10K/Year)

# Veterinary Services



- There is 1 sub veterinary centre in Islampur village which covers 9 villages including Islampur village.
- Though animals reared in the village include cows, goats, sheep, and poultry along with buffaloes, but they are very few in numbers to take note of.
- Only 8 households follow rearing of buffaloes with one household having 10 buffaloes and the remaining households having one or two each.
- Although the government is providing necessary facilities such as deworming, vaccination, and fodder seeds (with 75% subsidy) to encourage animal rearing in the village farmers of the village are not willing to practice animal husbandry. This may be due to lack of knowledge or the facilities provided by the government is not adequate.

# PDS Shop

- In the village of Islampur, a total of 411 ration cards have been issued.
- Each person is entitled to purchase 5 kilograms of rice at a cost of Rs. 3 per kilogram.
- The PDS grains are mostly distributed in first week of every month.

# Way Forward

---

Bank should be there in the village to assist the villagers and the SHG workers.

---

One dedicated building for SHC/PHC with all the necessary equipments and facilities for pregnant ladies and out -patients.

---

Dedicated staff for Kanti Velugu programme.

---

Computer and Internet facility in schools should be provided.

---

Loan size of SHG workers should be increased to Rs 15 lakhs per group for their further growth and development

---

Farms patta should be provided to landless families.

---

There should be a bus stand in the village and should be direct transportation to district headquarter.
