### **Transect Walk:**

- ➤ In morning covered non-abadi areas such as Kreeda Sthal, Waste Segregation, Palle Prakurthi Vanam, Nursery, Forest and Paddy fields.
- Then moved towards abadi areas such as Mineral Water plant, Anganwadi Centre, School, Masjid,, PDS Shop, Bidi Karkhana, Pond, Crematorium, Registered Medical Practitioner Clinic, few beneficiaries of Rayatu Beema, few pensioners, ASHA Worker, Temple, Indira Kranthi Patham Building and came back to GP office



### Social/Resource Mapping:

- ➤ We created a Village map on the floor of IKP building with the help of Gram Secretary, Pradhan, Young girls, Old aged People, and other Villagers
- ➤ Identification of SC/ST mohalla, Muslim mohalla, Backward classes has been done through different kinds of seeds on the map.



### Venn diagram:

We questioned the villagers about the importance of various institutions and we ranked them on the basis of the size of the circles: the bigger the circle, the higher the importance. The closer the circles with the center circle, the higher their accessibility.

> We also asked the villagers about the reasons for their poverty and ranked the causes according to their preference.



### Seasonality:


Seasonality has been done to capture the seasonal changes. We asked questions from villagers regarding pattern of rainfall, fishing, and employment as per the Indian calendar months



# **Agriculture**

### **Key challenges:**

- Villagers cannot shift to any other crop due to a large no. of monkeys.
- Groundwater level is already upto 300 square feet in some areas.
- Farmers did not get claimed insurance under PM Fasal Bima Yojna in 2017-18 so they withdrew their names from insurance.
- No open space for drying paddy.
- ➤ In the Village, 25 farmers were selected for organic farming but 15 farmers discontinued organic farming due to low yield.



# **Proposed Suggestions:**

- Open space needed for drying paddy
- ➤ There is need to increase livestock in the village to promote organic farming. Livestock will help villagers as additional source of income.
- Awareness among the villagers about benefits of organic farming
- Market support from the govt side.

We visited Anganwadi center and School in the village.

### **Key challenges:**

- In school infrastructure was not as per the requirement and combined classes were running for class I, II, and III, IV and V.
- ➤ There was no functional toilet for the girls.
- ➤ There was no separate building for Anganwadi Center

### Proposed Plan:

- Separate classrooms for each class.
- There should be a separate building for Anganwadi.
- Leveling of the ground and proper plantation is needed.
- > Functional and clean Toilet for girls is required.





### **SHRAMDAAN:**

- ➤ Although there were two more toilets in the school, but they were not operational due to collection of wastage over time.
- ➤ We went there and cleaned the toilet with the help of villagers under Shramdaan mission.

### **MGNREGA:**

- We went to meet workers under MGNREGA scheme. The workers mentioned that they were not getting wages in time rather they wait for 15 days -2 months.
- Early payment to MGNREGA workers is needed.





We also visited the PDS shop and interacted with Bidi workers.

### **Key Problem:**

- > **PDS shop:** People get ration after scanning their finger prints but for old age people, finger print doesn't match.
- ➤ **Bidi Workers:** Weakening of eyesight and nausea due to continuous smell.
- No health insurance of Bidi Workers.

### Proposed suggestions:

- For old age people, at the time of disbursement, photo or iris or facial recognition system should be installed at the shop.
- Only rice is being distributed to the people. We can also promote use of millets.
- Regular health check up of bidi workers and suggest them precautionary measures.





### Interaction with youth:

- ➤ We met with the young children of the village and asked them about their future aspirations.
- ➤ We counselled them for possible opportunities and encouraged them to use internet for their betterment.

### SHG:

- ➤ A proper market is not available for selling of the items manufactured by SHG women.
- Lack of training to SHG groups.
- On the occasion of women's day, the Community Coordinator of the Self Help Groups of the village won 2nd prize in Medak district and 2<sup>nd</sup> prize in Telangana.





# Suggestions

### > Health

- ➤ There should be a Health center or sub center in the village at least for minor diseases.
- Regular checkup of villagers is to be done to get clear idea of heath issues among the villagers.

# > Transportation

Proper connectivity to facilitate college students and daily commuters.

### **Education**

- ➤ The primary school in the village should be expanded up to 12<sup>th</sup> standard or there should be good transportation system for the student going out for the higher education
- Extracurricular activities like sports, music, essay writing etc. should be promoted on dedicated day.
- ➤ Apart from academics, Intra-class competition should be promoted.

# > Self Help Groups (SHGs)

As SHGs are very active in this village, a strong connection can be established between the need of the villagers and SHG targets. This can be done through training of SHG members on need basis and according to local requirements.
